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#### Ryan Meeboer

This lyrical piece is to be considered a modern lullaby. It begins with a peaceful feeling, and slowly builds into a beautiful, chorale-like section, reflecting the wonderful dreams we have as we fall into our deepest sleep.

The clarinets are first to play the main melody of the piece at measure 5. In measures 8 and 12, have the alto players bring out the motion in their parts, as the melody comes to a rest. This will allow the piece to continue its motion, and avoid the feel of whole note gaps. The same will happen in measures 16 and 20 in clarinet 2, alto saxophone 2, and the f horn.

As the counter melody is introduced the flute, oboe, and alto saxophone 1, in measure 13, be sure it doesn't completely dominate, since it is meant to compliment the main melody performed by the trumpets.

The piece drops slightly at measure 21, removing most of the instruments. Be sure that performers continuing in this section remain confident and play with a clear, controlled tone. When the other parts enter at measure 25, again, be sure they come in with solid sound, and the trumpets practice hitting the fourth space E clearly and confidently.

As the opining relocy returns at measure 2), one of your flute players will have the opfortunity to shine. Since this is a material, it should be clearly heard over the main relody, so the clarinets should be per their dynarics nice and sof.

Ryan Meeboer is a music educator, who obtained his degree through the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education at the University of Toronto. As a composer, he has written and arranged many pieces for concert band, jazz band, and small ensembles. His young band piece, *Last Voyage of the Queen Anne's Revenge*, has been well received by performers, educators, and audiences, and his pieces are starting to be found on festival and contest lists. As a performer, he has had experience in several groups, including concert and stage bands, chamber choir, vocal jazz ensemble, acoustic duets, and the Hamilton based swing group, "The Main Swing Connection".

Ryan began studying music at the age of seven through private guitar lessons. During his years in elementary and secondary school, he gained experience in several families of instruments. Focusing on music education and theory (including composition and orchestration), he attended McMaster University to achieve his honours degree in music. Ryan is currently a teacher for the Halton District School Board in Ontario, where he continues to compose and arrange.
