## Program Note

Have you ever ridden the rapids in a kayak? It is a *lot* of fun, and arguably one of the most exciting sports to participate in while on the water. Imagine this amazing journey as we embark on an exciting musical adventure down the **River Of Peril**.

## Rehearsal Notes

Before going kayaking it is important to get instructions on how to maneuver a kayak, as one doesn't just begin paddling and find immediate success. The same goes for rehearsing any new piece of music; preparation and hard work will result in a rewarding and enjoyable experience for everyone.

Make sure to control the pulse, especially at m. 5 where the clarinets have runs that are fun to play. If they go too fast, just like in kayaking the rapids, they could "capsize" and muddy up that fun melodic line.

Make certain to follow the proper articulation in the "slur two, staccato two" sections. This will give the piece contrast that everyone will enjoy.

Please remind the band, *forte* does not mean "play as loud as you can." This is especially important at m. 5 and m. 42 where players tend to hit the staccato quarter notes like a ton of bricks. Remind them to put a little space before those notes.

I sincerely hope that you and your students enjoy this piece. I am truly honored that you have chosen to perform my work.
