### Program Notes

The U.S. Armed Forces have numerous aspects of ceremony and pageantry, including precise drill movements, parades, pass-in-reviews, and military. We may be familiar with some of their characteristics, but one ingredient that is instantly recognizable for all is the dress uniform. The Dress Blue uniform has been the staple for all ceremonial units of the U. S Army in the Washington D. C. area for many years. The guardians of the Tomb of the Unknown wear this uniform as do the U.S. Army "Pershing's Own" and Field Bands. One knows a U. S. Marine the moment they are spotted for their celebrated Dress Blue uniform. It instantly sets the soldier or marine apart, and we are reminded of such qualities of character as selfless service and sacrifice. These are the qualities that General Douglas MacArthur indicated in his famous words, "Duty, Honor, Country."

### Rehearsal Notes

The opening statement makes use of staccato eighth notes in the melody and the supporting lower winds. Those lower, "bigger" instruments may need emphasis on those notes as the separation may not be as easily achieved as in the upper winds. The opening melodic statement at m. 11 is only in the upper woodwinds at a lower volume. There is a countermelody in the alto saxes and horns that must be balanced under that melody. M. 19 brings the full ensemble back in, repeating the melody at a full volume. M. 27 features the middle and low brass and woodwinds in on the melodic idea, while having bugle call-like phrases played in the trumpets and clarinets. Those phrases are meant to be under the melody in volume. M. 36 restates the opening melody with the ensemble playing at full volume while maintaining a quality sound. Crescendos may be used to great effect in the sustained notes of the low winds in the final measures.

Thank you for choosing **Dress Blues**. It is my hope that you and your students enjoy this work.



### About the Composer



**Mike Hammonds** has been a member of the band staff at Tallassee (Alabama) High School for the past decade, where he serves as director of the jazz bands at both the middle and high schools, and arranges and composes music for the marching and jazz bands.

Hammonds studied Music Education at Troy University in the early 1990's under famed band director Dr. John M. Long. During his time at Troy, he studied music theory and trumpet with composer and arranger Ralph Ford. After college, he enlisted in the United States Army. After a brief time in short range air defense, he transferred into the Army bands as a trumpet player, which allowed him the opportunity to perform in five different countries in Western Europe while stationed with the 76th Army band in Germany. His stations at Ft. Jackson, SC and Ft. Rucker, AL allowed him to perform for former First Lady Laura Bush, General Tommy Franks, former commander for Central Command, and the Secretary of the Army. While stationed at Ft. Rucker, his duties expanded into leading the 98th Army Silver Wings Jazz Band, and serving as rehearsal conductor for the concert band and arranger for the ceremonial, concert and jazz bands. He was also selected to compose part of the soundtrack for the US Army Warrant Officer School's recruiting video. Post-Army, he performed as a trumpeter before accepting his current position with the Tallassee City School's band program.
