### Program Notes

**The Black Pearl** was commissioned by the Decorah (Iowa) Middle School fifth grade band. Director Elizabeth Fritz thought it would be fun if I wrote a piece without a title, and let the students create a title after rehearsing it for a few weeks. The minor mode and mysterious opening evoked imagery of a pirate ship in the distance, and the students settled on **The Black Pearl** (much better than any title I would have imagined!)

### Rehearsal Suggestions

Performing with appropriate legato tongue articulation can be challenging for beginning band students, and all of the woodwind and brass players have the opportunity to develop this skill in m. 25-40. Encourage students to tongue as lightly as possible and, most importantly, not stop the air stream in-between notes. Utilize the rhythm in m. 25 for a full group warm-up to reinforce smooth tonguing with a continuous air stream. On accented notes, encourage students to generate the accent with more air, not by tonguing too hard.

The snare drum and bass drum players should be extra careful to honor the dynamics, and not cover the brass at m. 33. This piece works with limited percussion, and you may omit suspended cymbal, crash cymbals, wind chimes, and bells, if needed. If at all possible, try to cover the triangle part at m. 25, as it sounds great with the woodwinds!

Ensure students are holding all dotted half notes (m. 12, 16, etc.) for three full counts and releasing on count four. Finally, consider using this piece to teach students about minor versus major tonalities. Explain that, within collections of pitches (scales), different notes can serve as "home base" (tonic), and certain home base notes give the music particular feelings or moods. In this case, concert G is the home base note, and that is the reason the piece sounds dark and mysterious.

### About the Composer



**Steve Shanley** is a music professor at Coe College (Cedar Rapids, IA), where he coordinates the music education and jazz studies programs. He is also the conductor of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Band, a professional concert band that gives over 20 performances each year. Prior to his arrival at Coe, Shanley spent 11 years teaching middle and high school music in the Cedar Rapids Community School District. He has an active schedule as a guest conductor, clinician, adjudicator, and pianist, and he is also in demand as a composer and arranger. Over 2,000 of his works have been performed by instrumental and choral ensembles throughout North America, Asia, South America, and Europe. Shanley is Vice President of the Jazz Educators of Iowa (JEI) and Co-Chair of the Iowa Jazz Championships. In addition, he has served as reader for the College Board Advanced Placement Music Theory examination, item writer for the ETS Praxis Music examination, contributing author for Teaching Music Through Performance in Jazz, rhythm section editor for Hal Leonard's Latin Jazz Guide, and founding president of JEI. Shanley is a member of the JEI Hall of Fame, was inducted into Sigma Alpha Iota as a National Arts Associate, and was honored with the Iowa Bandmasters Association Karl King Distinguished Service Award. He holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Northern Iowa, master's degrees from the University of Minnesota and University of Iowa, and a PhD from the University of Iowa.
