Program Note

Designed in march style, this work for young musicians shines the spotlight on many sections of the band. As young musicians are negotiating an entirely new language of music when learning a new instrument, **Bandability** provides them with the opportunity to sound like a seasoned ensemble while employing the safety of block scoring and minimal part independence.

Rehearsal Suggestions

As with nearly every piece of music, care should be taken to always bring out the melodic lines no matter where they occur. The composer is dedicated to spreading these opportunities throughout the ensemble, and it may be necessary to further adjust dynamic levels at measure 15 so the melody in the low brass and low woodwinds is always at the forefront. Additionally, the composition relies on a solid, steady tempo that isn't too fast. Full tone production on longer notes should be emphasized, as well as the concept of note lengths across the ensemble. The dynamic contrast at m. 23 should be an obvious change from the forte sections at m. 3 and 31, and the graduated dynamics in measures 22 and 30 may need extra attention with your young players. The half notes in the accompaniment parts of m. 23 - 30 should be rehearsed to release together on the downbeat of count three.

I hope you enjoy rehearsing and performing Bandability!

Mrs. Galvin also enjoys writing solo, ensemble and large group works for a number of middle school, high school, collegiate and community band programs, and she has served as a guest conductor and clinician for many bands across the state of Ohio. In 2009, Mrs. Galvin was asked to join the band staff of the newly-opened Hilliard Bradley High School in Hilliard, Ohio, where she was privileged to have two original compositions chosen as the school's Alma Mater and Fight Song "We Are Bradley." She has been commissioned for numerous compositions, and her works have been premiered at the International Women's Brass Conference and the Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic.

She has a number of band and string orchestra compositions published with the C. L. Barnhouse Company, and is in demand as a guest conductor, clinician and adjudicator. Lisa always enjoys hearing her music in performance, and would appreciate hearing from you when you program her music! Mrs. Galvin has served as an adjunct lecturer in Music Technology at Capital University and The Ohio State University, where she periodically taught graduate and undergraduate courses in Finale© and SmartMusic© software. Additionally, she has served the Ohio Music Education Association in a number of capacities. In 2013 she and her husband served as the co-chairs of the OMEA State Professional Development Conference in Columbus, Ohio.

Lisa holds membership in the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP), the National Association for Music Education, the North American Brass Band Association, the International Women's Brass Conference and the Ohio Music Education Association.
