About the Music

The word *turbulence* can be used to refer to atmospheric instability, such as sudden, unpredictable air movements resulting from a storm. However, in a broader sense, turbulence is used to describe any situation characterized by unrest and disorder. Beginning with a soft and stately chorale, the mood quickly changes to sounds of turbulence in a contemporary musical setting for the developing band. Bitting dissonance and powerful rhythmic percussion sustain the turbulent atmosphere as it develops throughout the band in a minor mode. The percussion and winds exchange powerful musical statements leading to the final triumphant resolution.

Notes to the Conductor

The opening chorale should be as expressive as possible. Please use this as an opportunity to reinforce the concepts of balance and sonority. In addition, you may wish to consider using the opening statement as a warm-up chorale as part of your daily instruction.


The timpani and keyboard percussion should begin softly, yet crescendo dramatically as the turbulence is introduced. The winds should be equally dramatic in their crescendo at m. 11.

The staccato eighth notes at m. 19 should be very light with careful attention given to the balance between sections. The saxophones should be rehearsed with the flutes to insure balance and momentum as well as unified articulation. The keyboard percussion should be balanced in the same fashion.

I have used dissonance to develop the concept of turbulence. For example, in beat 1 of m. 39, the winds are playing a G concert in unison/octaves. On beat 2, the upper woodwinds, saxophones, trumpets and horns respond with a dissonant chord that should be equally intense. Please carefully balance the chord with a focus on the dissonant interval of the major second. This dissonance should be balanced accordingly throughout. The trombone glissando in section 39 should be present but not overshadow the harmonic dissonance.

Please ensure balance between the percussion and woodwind families at m. 69 to maximize the effect their interaction. The resolution to the major chord at m. 77 should provide a lift to the performance and offer a valuable teaching opportunity in terms of keys/modes.

I hope you and the band find **In Times Of Turbulence** to be a valuable musical experience. Best wishes for a wonderful performance!

Robert W. Smith (b. 1958) is one of the most popular and prolific composers in America today. He has over 600 publications in print with the majority composed and arranged through his long association with Warner Bros. Publications and the Belwin catalog.

Mr. Smith's credits include many compositions and productions in all areas of the music field. His original works for winds and percussion have been programmed by countless military, university, high school, and middle school bands throughout the United States, Canada, Europe, Australia, South America and Asia. His Symphony #1 (*The Divine Comedy*), Symphony #2 (*The Odyssey*), Symphony #3 (*Don Quixote*), *Inchon and Africa: Ceremony, Song and Ritual* have received worldwide critical acclaim. His educational compositions such as *The Tempest*, *Encanto*, and *The Great Locomotive Chase* have become standards for developing bands throughout the world.

Mr. Smith's music has received extensive airplay on major network television as well as inclusion in multiple motion pictures. From professional ensembles such as the United States Navy Band, United States Air Force Band, Boston Pops and the Atlanta Symphony to school bands and orchestras throughout the world, his music speaks to audiences in any concert setting. As a conductor, clinician and keynote speaker, Mr. Smith has performed throughout North America, Asia, South America, Europe and Australia. His music has been recorded by various ensembles and is available on CD and download through Walking Frog Records, iTunes, Amazon, and other recorded music outlets.

Mr. Smith is the President/CEO of RWS Music Company, exclusively distributed through C. L. Barnhouse. In addition, he is currently teaching in the Music Industry program at Troy University in Troy, Alabama. His teaching responsibilities are focused in music composition, production, publishing and business.
