PROGRAM NOTE

Composer Heather Hoefle gives us this programmatic work about a day in the life of a middle school student. Our student starts out asleep while Mom or Dad knocks on the door as a wake-up alarm is sounding. After rushing to school while being chased by another student, our middle schooler makes it to class. Of course, the clock seems to slow down as we start our long school day. A couple of times the trumpets get disruptive and the rest of the band has to shush them! The school bell finally rings and our student is chased home. Arriving safely, the flutes have the last word leaving the antagonized trumpet section behind.

NOTES TO CONDUCTOR

Your students will relate to this fun piece about a day in the life of a middle school student. From waking up in the morning to sitting in class, dealing with disruptive students (played by the trumpet section) and being chased home, our middle school student experiences it all in this programmatic work! Your trumpet players will love being the villains. The rest of the band will enjoy shushing and outrunning them!

The tempo changes in this piece are critical to making the intent clear. The slow start to the accelerando into measure 23, the molto ritardando at the end of “class” at measure 62, and the hurried “chase scenes” at measures 23 and 66; play them up to make it effective!

The trumpets have the option to use straight mutes from measures 52 to 78. Doing so will be fun and help give a bit more “edge” to their sassiness.

I hope you and the band enjoy this universal middle school adventure!

Heather Archer Hoefle a native of Indianapolis, Indiana. She is a graduate of Indiana University in Bloomington, Indiana with degrees in Flute Performance and Audio Technology. She earned her educational certification from DePaul University in Chicago, Illinois and earned a Master of Music from VanderCook College of Music in Chicago, Illinois. Growing up in Indianapolis, she studied flute with Philip Sample and Rebecca Price of the Indianapolis Symphony. At Indiana University in Bloomington, she was a student of renown flute soloist Carol Wincenc. In addition to the orchestras at IU, she also performed with the Indianapolis Symphony. In 2000 she founded and became principal flutist in the Tudor Winds Wind Quintet, which performs professionally in the Chicago area.

As a public school teacher, Mrs. Hoefle has successfully taught band at grades 5-12. Finding her love of teaching beginners, she started composing and arranging for her bands. As a current teacher active clinician and commissioned composer, Ms. Hoefle has a firm grasp of the development of the beginning band student, and her compositions reflect the needs and wants of these students. She currently teaches beginning and middle school band in HSD153 in Homewood, Illinois.
