Performance Notes

"Haze" is a short piece for SATB choir and piano, adapting text by Henry David Thoreau. The poem uses vivid language to describe haze and smoke, possibly in the aftermath of war, with the final stanza evoking the image of a phoenix rising from the ashes. The music is a gentle lullaby, featuring simple vocal lines floating over shifting harmonies in the piano. "Haze" is the third movement of a larger work, *Songs of Renewal*, which was commissioned by Da Camera Singers (Edmonton, Canada) to celebrate their 60th anniversary in 2022.
