Composer's Notes

I was drawn to arrange this beautiful folk song both for the melody and for the universal themes that lie within the text. It is a well-known song, having been covered by countless artists from all over the world, and I hope this choral arrangement allows the singers to find a path through the music that is both moving for the audience and fun to sing. The melody can be found across most of the different voices and I would encourage the performance to be led by those lines—there can be a feeling of space, but without too much wallowing. Certain moments can move forwards a little too, such as the bridge passage between the chorus and verse. The sparse upper voice harmony over the lower voice solo should be icy and glass-like; then the choir can dramatically grow together to the climax of the work before finally drifting to a contemplative conclusion, perhaps imagining the voyager disappearing into the distance.

I wrote this arrangement originally for the VOCES8 Foundation, and I'm thrilled that it has appeared on the Apollo5 album, *Haven*. I'm also delighted that an upper voice version of the piece has now been recorded by our newest member to the VOCES8 Foundation family, Lyyra. It has also featured in some of our global education programs with massed choirs of all ages and abilities singing alongside VOCES8 and the VOCES8 Scholars. I'm grateful to everyone who chooses to bring this arrangement to life.


