Rehearsal Notes

The tempo marking (J = ca. 125) and directive (*Merrily*) tip us off as to what the singer's attitude should be before they even hear the first phrase or sing the first note. The eight-measure introduction demonstrates the mood. The piece is going to be mostly light and pleasant. This setting of the familiar carol offers the choir an opportunity to sing contrasting styles. The refrain (sung four times in unison) should have a little bounce separated by more flowing, legato stanzas.

The words "merrily" (m.16) and "coming" (m. 32) present teaching moments about stressed and unstressed syllables. Since the phrases will break after m. 16 and m. 32, the singer's natural tendency may be to put too much emphasis (accent/volume) on the last syllables, somehow in anticipation of the lift. Have your singers think of volume on a scale of 1 to 5, 1 being the softest and 5 the loudest. As an exercise, have them practice speaking with a range of volume on a neutral vowel until the contrast between 1 and 5 is significant. Then have the singers speak the syllables of the word "coming" in that "5-1" pattern. Next, have the choir speak the text from m. 29 to m. 32, paying close attention to "coming." Lastly, have them sing the same line, ending the phrase with a 5-1 "coming." There are several other phrases that end with 5-1 words. A three-syllable word like "merrily" (m. 16) might be considered a 5-3-1 word.
