ABOUT A TORCH WAS BROUGHT

This setting of the 17th century Christmas Carol *Bring a Torch, Jeanette Isabella,* is one of my favorite Christmas tunes. The piece is triumphantly delicate and made iconic by its well-known "hush" moment at the end each phrase. If your Christmas concert is in need of a lyrical, reverent piece to help set the mood, *A Torch Was Brought* should provide.

Performance Notes

Tempos throughout are suggestions and care should always be taken to keep the music "moving". Fermata(s) should be used as a moment of "lingering" and not necessarily a break. Also, I find that focusing on the slight diminuendo before the "hush" moments helps to solidify that new dynamic level.
