### ABOUT LOW BRASS ON THE HOUSETOP

Make sure the instruments that have *fp* in M. 2 and 3 make their parts sound like bell chimes. The should not crescendo until M. 4. At M. 8, make sure the dynamics are adhered to. The sections with the melody have a forte while the sections with harmony and countermelody have mezzo forte. The melody switches between the low brass and the rest of the ensemble. At M. 39 the whole ensemble plays through *Up On The Housetop* together without any interjections. Make sure the last note of the piece breathes and isn't too short.
