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TO THE DIRECTOR

This Latin style chart is based on the chord changes to "My Little Suede" Shoes" by Charlie Parker. The ensemble figures are accessible to younger players, but represent good examples of authentic cha cha style. Have the group listen to recordings of standard cha cha style charts such as "Oye Como Va" by Tito Peunte or "Guachi Guaro" by Cal Tiader and then emulate that style on passages such as in measures 57-83. It is also suggested to have all players learn the rhythms and accentuations in the auxiliary percussion parts (clave, guiro, congas, etc.) as this will guide their performance throughout.

The solo section at measure 49 is a very common progression found in salsa and Latin jazz music. While standard chord and scale relationship work is always useful, it is recommended to have students work on hearing and playing appropriate rhythms on 1 or 2 notes in the key to build vocabulary. Professional recordings and material from the arrangement are a wonderful source for rhythms of this type. The solo section is open for any soloist, and solo sheets are provided in all keys which includes a sample written solo and scales that can be used to encourage young players to create their own solo.
