- 6) When will the Acacia Bloom? (Sichuan) 槐花几时开(四川): A young girl awaits her lover under the Acacia tree. When asked by her mother what she is doing, she becomes embarrassed and replies that she is waiting for the Acacia flowers to bloom. [about 1'20"]
- 7) A Single Bamboo Can Easily Bend (Hunan) 一根竹竿容易弯(湖南): The tune is composed in typical Hunan folk style. The words imply that unity is strength. [about 1'28"]
- 8) Leaving Home (Shanxi) 走西口 (山西): A wife bids farewell to her husband who is going westward to seek livelihood. [about 2'00"]
