Performance Notes for Echo Gamma Eight

The xylophone/marimba part can be played on xylo, marimba, or both together for a bigger sound.

Percussion part is playable with one person, or can be split by two players if desired.

My goal with this piece was to write something that would be playable by beginners and lean on the *Echo* concept from the title, a bit.

Echo was in the title because this piece is a continuation of my beginning percussion ensembles which share elements of their names with the NATO Phonetic Alphabet. The first was *Alpha Bravo Niner*, followed about a decade later with *Octo Delta Charlie*.

In about another six months, I wrote this piece, *Echo Gamma Eight*. Though as I was writing this little blurb, I learned that *Gamma* is not a part of the NATO Phonetic Alphabet. It should be *Golf* instead. Hmm... Something to think about. I'm also not crazy about just using the word *Eight*.
