Program Notes

Dust of the Eons transports listeners to an ancient world where the echoes of time swirl like dust in the wind. Mysterious and evocative, this piece unfolds with rich harmonies and shifting textures, creating an atmosphere of wonder and discovery.

Built on gripping chord progressions and colorful orchestration, the music captures the weight of forgotten history and the endless passage of time. Suspended moments of tension contrast with sweeping, flowing lines, drawing musicians and audiences into a soundscape both ancient and timeless.

Designed for developing ensembles, *Dust of the Eons* balances accessibility with expressive depth. Every instrument plays a role in shaping the piece's mysterious character, encouraging young musicians to explore dynamic contrasts and phrasing. This piece invites performers and listeners alike to imagine the stories buried beneath the sands of time.

Conductor Notes

Even though this work is set for developing ensembles, it is written with the same maturity and attention to detail of my harder works. The double reed parts are cross-cued between the other instruments of the ensemble, but conductors are encouraged to bring these colors out if they are present. Many of the instruments have optional notes written for advanced players who can play them well, but it is not required. There are sections of music that call for a divisi. The flute, clarinet, and trumpet parts are mostly in unison, except for the few sections where they are split. These will build great tension in the music. If you lack the ability to play all of these divisi notes due to numbers/program strength, play the higher notes available. Encourage your percussion to play artistically and be careful not to overpower the winds.

Ben Blessing, (1984) hails from Nampa, ID. A former Marine and current member of the 25th Army Band in Boise ID, he is a long-serving member of the Idaho Army National Guard. He holds a Bachelor's Degree in Music Composition from Northwest Nazarene University and a Master's in Music Education from the American Band College.
