Program Notes

Home is where the heart is. Home is where your family is. Home is where your friends are. Home is what you make it.

There are so many sentiments that come with idea of home. You can be homesick. You can have positive associations with home, or maybe tricky associations with home. Home can be complicated. Home can be ever changing and growing. Home can be so many things.

I wrote this reflecting on Pride month and all of the people (especially kids) out there where home is not always a safe place, or a place of acceptance. I thought back to my years as a young music student where the music room was home to so many. I thought back to my years as a teacher, learning how varied the concept of home was to each of my students – from safe and comforting to a source of trauma, from traditional to untraditional.

I thought about the impact of "home" throughout one's life. Home changes over time. What your sense of home is as a child will be very different when you are an adult.

The piece reflects on all meanings of the word home and asks the question "What is home to you?" Who are your people? What is your safe space? Where will you make your home? The music is lyrical, sweet and sentimental, sometimes somber, sometimes full of strength – but there is one constant – and that one constant is the melody, that one constant is YOU!
