Assemble the Guard

Program Notes:

As an avid enthusiast of fantasy and sci-fi narratives, I consistently find inspiration for my compositions within these imaginative worlds. In many of these stories there are attacks on castles or fortresses, where the guards need to quickly gather to protect their home; but in most of these stories these guards are faceless. They are not the main characters of the story, but without them the castle would be overrun! What unknown force are these guards preparing against? You decide! It's an open canvas for interpretation, allowing for creative exploration and story development with your students.

In my mind, these guardians are gearing up for the imminent arrival of the Alpha Dragon, a formidable presence introduced in another piece of mine titled *Dragon's Revenge* (*Gr. 2 - available through Randall Standridge Music*). The connection between these compositions adds to the narrative of the broader musical universe I'm creating through my music.

Performance Notes:

STOMP! - Starting in m. 41 this piece features several big stomps. This should be done with only one foot in order to maintain physical balance. Additionally, have students try with one foot and then the other to figure out which is most comfortable for them. For my students, a majority of them preferred using their left, but that was not unanimous. You may need to work on body coordination to perform these stomps on time, so I suggest practicing each stomp with its coordinating musical material separately.

Percussion - The percussion part included in this score is at a grade 1 level. This could be an opportunity for collaboration with a band colleague or you could have one of your students perform it. Another option is to download and play along with the percussion backing track from the Randall Standridge Music page for Assemble the Guard in rehearsal or as a home practice track (aka metronome!) for students.

Accents - This piece has lots of accented notes. The bow should make solid contact with the string before each stroke in order to create a powerful beginning to these notes.
