Knights of the Round Table

Program Notes:

Hear ye! Hear ye! You are hereby summoned to the legendary round table of King Arthur. Step into the heart of Camelot and join the knights for this majestic piece, offering bold melodies, familiar rhythms, and the deep, rich tones of the G and C strings. Just as every fabled knight at the round table had an equal voice, this piece gives each player the opportunity to shine with a melody of their own. Huzzah!

Note to the Conductor:

I wrote this piece focusing on two main concepts:

- 1. The G and C string notes.
- 2. The "pepperoni pizza" rhythm reversed = "deep dish pepperoni"

Jest with your students that at King Arthur's Table they are eating "Deep-Dish-Pep-per-on-i" to help solidify the 2 quarter - 4 eighths rhythm that occurs frequently throughout the piece. Work to get a good core sound on low strings by using smaller/slower bows and more arm weight. If it was my ensemble, I might even consider a big pizza party after the concert, complete with medieval period attire!
