Note from the Editor:

This grade ½ piece features approachable rhythms (4-quarter notes, 2-half notes, or 1-whole note per bar), and limited range (V1 - 1 octave, V2/VIa - D to A, Cello/Bass - D to B, plus open strings) in the context of a very expressive, lyrical piece. It can be played by strings alone, strings and piano, or with the addition of a grade 3 violin solo. Second Violins and Violas double, as do Celli and Bass.

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Beyond the Waterfall

Program Notes:

Journey beyond the cascading veil of water into a world of shimmering beauty and quiet mystery. Beyond the Waterfall evokes the wonder of discovering a hidden landscape—where light dances on the surface, droplets glisten like stars, and the air hums with possibility.

The piece opens with a gentle, flowing theme in the violins, setting a serene and dreamlike atmosphere. A twinkling piano line mirrors the sparkle of falling water, creating a sense of movement and magic. As the piece unfolds, the ensemble swells with lush harmonies, enveloping the listener in waves of sound. An optional violin solo soars above the orchestra, like a bird gliding effortlessly through misty air, adding an ethereal and expressive touch.

Through rich textures and sweeping melodies, Beyond the Waterfall invites both performers and listeners to step into a place of imagination and wonder—a world just beyond what the eye can see.

Note to the Conductor:

I wrote this piece in layers. The first layer was the grade ½ string parts, which can be performed without the additional parts. However, I then envisioned this twinkling piano part, and added that layer, which really brought the piece to life. It is preferred that you perform with the piano when possible. Lastly, I added the solo violin which soars over the waterfall - this is totally optional, but would be a great way to feature an advanced student, perhaps an alum, or a guest artist.
