### **Notes**

The final installment of the *Missa Brevis* for SA voices, this work features opportunities for unison singing, the development of independent part singing, and the introduction of slurs and the altered 7th degree of the scale (TE). Also inherent in the text are opportunities to focus on singing pure vowels and to work on text accentuation. The form of the work makes it easy for learning and memorization: ABCA coda.

### **About the Composer**

Prior to receiving his Doctorate from Louisiana State University, Trotta served as a music educator for high school, middle school, and elementary school students and served as Director of Music for numerous churches in the Philadelphia Metro area. Trotta has served on the music faculty of Oklahoma State University, Louisiana State University, Rowan University, and as Director of Choral Studies at Virginia Wesleyan College prior to his current work a full time composer, guest conductor and clinician. He frequently works as a composer-in-residence with various ensembles throughout the country.
