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PROGRAM NOTES

Rondeau Royale was composed to address the needs of both advancing and developing band students. The melody, counter-melody and accompaniment include varied articulations and many changes in dynamics and texture. It begins in the key of Eb major, providing the opportunity to teach and reinforce new notes, and then moves to the key of F major with a substantial concert band ending.

This piece is written in a “rondo” form, where, after an introduction, the main theme is stated. There are various short episodes that change the texture and musical character of the piece. These episodes return to the rondo melody with the addition of a countermelody and changes in the instrumentation of main theme. The title, *Rondeau Royale*, takes on the French spelling, essentially defining a “royal” or “regal” rondo.

ABOUT THE COMPOSER

As a composer, arranger, and music editor, Mark Barnard has created numerous publications. His compositions and arrangements have been featured and performed at the Midwest Clinic, the Interlochen Center for the Arts and many conventions and festivals worldwide. A graduate of the University of Southern California Thornton School of Music and the New England Conservatory, Mr. Barnard has directed bands and orchestras in Ohio, Oregon and California.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Students should focus on playing with good tone quality and balance. Breathe correctly, and use the diaphragm muscle to “support” the good tone. Use a lot of air, especially when playing softly.

Observe the dynamic markings. One of the hallmarks of any fine performance is good dynamic contrast. Make a clear distinction between the different dynamics which are indicated.

MUSIC THEORY
