PMAA Annual Banquet and Distinguished Alumni Induction

On April 16, 2011, PMAA held its annual banquet combined with the induction ceremony for the 2011 Distinguished Alumni honorees in our high school cafeteria. This year's theme was a salute to those alumni who dedicated their careers to the field of education. Approximately 50 alumni (a full one-third of the banquet attendees) were honored. These careers represented teachers, coaches, administrators, counselors, cafeteria personnel, school bus drivers, and maintenance workers. Don Stewart, retired Penn Manor superintendent, praised the unselfish dedication of these folks to the students they served during his keynote address.

PMAA president, Michael McDonald, sang several songs that represented the evening's theme and Penn Manor's award-winning kindergarten teacher, Liz Crum, led the group in our pledge. Long-time PM school board president, Willis Herr, offered an invocation once again saluting those in the field of education.

The highlights of the evening were the Distinguished Alumni Wall of Honor inductees' remarks as they remembered the early seeds planted during their years at Penn Manor which led to extremely impressive careers. This distinguished group was comprised of Dr. Daniel Witmer, PM '56, Dr. Joseph McSparran, PM '61 and Dr. Dean Hess, PM '68.

For the first time in the history of the award an honorary alumna won the prestigious President's Award when it was presented to Dr. Jan Mindish at this year's banquet. Jan has been a tireless PMAA volunteer since her retirement from the position of high school principal and has also established her own endowed scholarship fund for graduating PM seniors.

Memorial Courtyard

The Memorial Courtyard at Penn Manor High School continues to be a work in progress. Located outside the rear of the auditorium, this area has become home to a memorial brick walkway, a fish pond, a large metal sculpture, a class gift of benches and, most recently, a glass mosaic of "Starry Night."

The walkway contains two sizes of bricks, which can be purchased to honor alumni, staff and friends of Penn

The goldfish pond was completed in 2009 as a senior graduation project with funds raised to honor boys basketball coach, Jeff Churchill, who died in 2008. Staff and students maintain the pond area, including the planting and goldfish.


The eye catching metal sculpture is a gift from 1952 Penn Manor graduate and retired art educator, Ken Hoak. Four benches donated by the Class of 1941 provide seating for visitors to enjoy the courtyard.

The "Starry Night" glass mosaic is being created by art students over the past three years, under the direction of art teacher, Teri Hay. The colorful installation was funded by Penn Manor Education Foundation artist-in-residence Venture grants. It is scheduled to be completed during the summer of 2012.

The interior hallway between the rear of the auditorium and the courtyard is the home of the Distinguished Alumni Wall of Honor. The individual plaques honoring our distinguished alumni have recently been replaced with group plaques for each induction year beginning with 2001. Prior to 2001, alumni were recognized by the PMAA as Alumni of the Year with their names on group plaques. These plaques were also recently replaced to match the format of the Distinguished Alumni plaques. Also on this wall is a tribute to the seven Penn Manor Alumni who lost their lives in the Vietnam War. Rubbings of each name from the Vietnam War Memorial were framed and presented to the high school by Ron Atwell, Class of 1966.

Penn Manor has received gifts of artwork from several alumni which are displayed on the wall in the auditorium lobby. These works include paintings by Harry Book, Class of 1942, and Philip Dale Ziegler, Class of 1972, and a photograph by Nathan Cox, Class of 1987.

More recent gifts from graduating classes have included new podiums, banners, signboards, lighting and landscaping, and display cases. The Penn Manor Alumni Association thanks all alumni who have helped enhance our alma mater's environment!

Class of 2009 Alumna's Heroic Deed

When Lexy Adams headed off to Yale after a stellar academic and field hockey career at Penn Manor the last thing she expected was to play a key role in saving a life. As a member of Yale's field hockey team she, along with all Yale athletes, was encouraged to participate in a bone marrow match drive. This

drive was done in support of Mandi Schwartz, a Yale ice hockey player who was diagnosed with leukemia.

Although Lexy has always been terrified of needles her teammates easily talked her into taking the matching test, which only requires a swab of the cheek lining. She was told there was an extremely low percentage chance she would match Mandi. Sure enough Lexy was not a match and was placed in the national bone marrow database. A donor match was found for Mandi elsewhere.

Unexpectedly Lexy received a call six months later telling her that she appeared to be the perfect match for a 64 year-old man in desperate need of a bone marrow transplant. To be sure of the match extensive blood work would be required...tests that involved the dreaded needles! Lexy however did not hesitate and these tests confirmed the ideal compatibility.

Preparing for the transplant required injections twice a day for five days which amplified the amount of bone marrow and pushed it into her bloodstream. This caused muscle soreness and a throbbing in her bones. When her body was ready the required surgery took 15 hours.

Now, six months later, the recipient is doing well. The program requires a full year before the donor and recipient are allowed to meet, but the man's wife assures Lexy that she did in fact save her husband's life!

Lexy is currently playing a big role for Yale's field hockey team as they try to replace Princeton as the number one team in the Ivy League. Although her major is undecided at this time, Biomedical Engineering and Pre-Med top the current list of possibilities.
