Introduction:

Author: John, the son of Zebedee, disciple of Jesus.

Title: Revelation reveals God's view of earthly history in light of its final outcome. It is the end of the story.

Prophecy: Message from God through a prophet.

Purpose: A circular letter sent to seven churches in the province of Asia to concerning the past, present and the future (1:19)

Primary Message: God must deal ultimately and finally with _____ unbelief.

1. The _____ to the Churches (ch. 1b-3)

The letters deal with sin like apathy, affluence, fornication, idolatry, immorality. Also deals with faithful churches, suffering persecution.

Revelation 1:11 Saying, I am Alpha and Omega, the first and the last: and, What thou seest, write in a book, and send it unto the seven churches which are in Asia; unto Ephesus, and unto Smyrna, and unto Pergamos, and unto Thyatira, and unto Sardis, and unto Philadelphia, and unto Laodicea.

Revelation 2:21 And I gave her space to repent of her fornication; and she repented not.

Revelation 3:19 As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten: be zealous therefore, and repent.

2. The Throne of _____ (ch. 4-5)

THRONE ROOM OF GOD — similar to the Old Testament descriptions of Heavenly visions. (See Isaiah 6:1-4; Revelation 4)

THE SCROLL of God's unfolding kingdom plan, but no one is worthy to open the scroll—except the Messiah! (*See Revelation 5:1-5*)

3. The Divine _____ (Ch. 6-16)

THREE SETS OF SEVEN JUDGMENTS— God's execution of justice and judgment at the end of time.

SEVEN _____ JUDGEMENTS (6-8A)

SEVEN _____ JUDGEMENTS (8B-11)

VISIONS OF COSMIC TRIBULATION BATTLE (12-14)

SEVEN _____ JUDGEMENTS (15-16)

NOTE: The Seal Judgements happen in the first half of the tribulation. The Trumpet Judgments begin and happen in the second half called the Great Tribulation. The Bowl Judgments are the grand finale.

4. Fall of _____ (ch. 17-19a)

QUOTE: Two Babylons are to be distinguished in the Revelation: ecclesiastical Babylon (17:1), which is apostate Christendom, headed up under the Papacy; and political Babylon (17:15-18), which is the Beast's confederate empire, the last form of a gentile world domination. —*C. I. Scofield*

5. The Final _____ (ch. 19b-20)

Revelation 19:15-16 And out of his mouth goeth a sharp sword, that with it he should smite the nations: and he shall rule them with a rod of iron: and he treadeth the winepress of the fierceness and wrath of Almighty God. 16 And he hath on his vesture and on his thigh a name written, KING OF KINGS, AND LORD OF LORDS.

NOTE: The Battle of Armageddon will be so severe that all birds of heaven were called in to eat the casualties. (19:17-18)

NOTE: In the announcement (14:20) concerning this battle, the blood from the slaughter will flow 180 miles, to the depth of about

4.5 feet. The blood of the horses added to that of the large armies of human soldiers could easily cause such an enormous river of blood. —*Ryre Study Bible, pp 1939*

Revelation 20:10 And the devil that deceived them was cast into the lake of fire and brimstone, where the beast and the false prophet are, and shall be tormented day and night for ever and ever.

6. The New _____ (ch. 21-22)

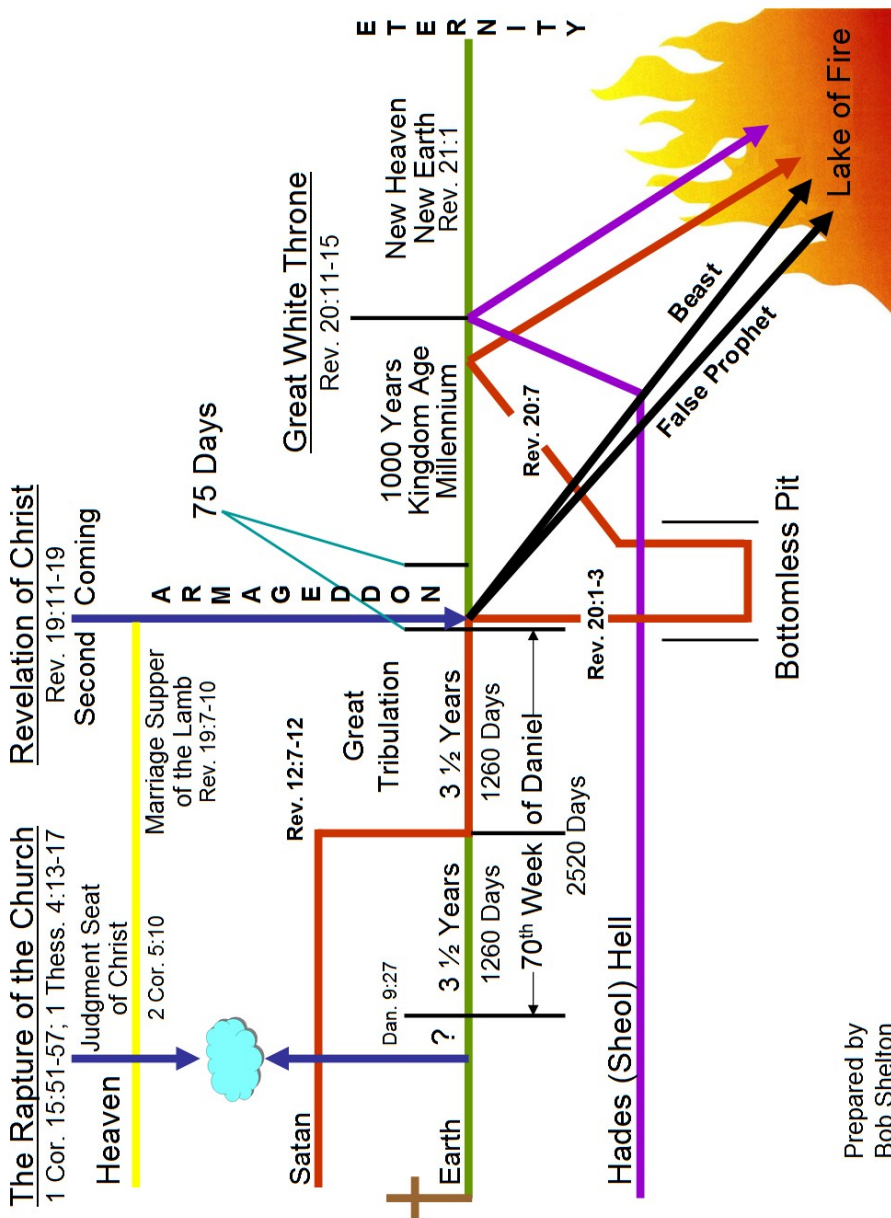
Revelation 21:1–2 And I saw a new heaven and a new earth: for the first heaven and the first earth were passed away; and there was no more sea. 2 And I John saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down from God out of heaven, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband.

Conclusion:

Acts 1:6-11 When they therefore were come together, they asked of him, saying, Lord, wilt thou at this time restore again the kingdom to Israel? 7 And he said unto them, It is not for you to know the times or the seasons, which the Father hath put in his own power. 8 But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth. 9 And when he had spoken these things, while they beheld, he was taken up; and a cloud received him out of their sight. 10 And while they looked stedfastly toward heaven as he went up, behold, two men stood by them in white apparel; 11 Which also said, Ye men of Galilee, why stand ye gazing up into heaven? this same Jesus, which is taken up from you into heaven, shall so come in like manner as ye have seen him go into heaven.
