Re: Public Financial Disclosure Extension Requires

Dear Ms. Stevenson:

I write as counsel to Governor John Hickenlooper and his principal campaign committee, Hickenlooper 2020 (the "Committee").

Governor Hickenlooper became a candidate for President of the United States in the 2020 primary election on March 4, 2019. Pursuant to the Ethics in Government Act of 1978, Governor Hickenlooper owed a public financial disclosure report to the Federal Election Commission (the "Commission") by May 15, 2019. The Commission granted the Committee a 45-day extension, making the new deadline of July 1, 2019. On behalf of the committee, we respectfully request an additional 45-day extension.

This agency is authorized to grant an additional extension for good cause shown. Consistent with Office of Government Ethics guidance, good cause may include extended periods of travel and pressing duties prior to the deadline. In this instance, both the Governor and his spouse have each experienced unusually frequent and extended travel during the weeks prior to the deadline, making it exceptionally difficult to compile the necessary information. In addition, the Governor has had to devote a considerable amount of time preparing for the Presidential debates, which will be held two days before the deadline. Under these circumstances, we respectfully request one final extension to allow the Governor to prepare a comprehensive disclosure.
