What Is Pfizer RxPathways?

For more than 25 years, Pfizer has empowered patients in need with assistance and information, so they can get access to the Pfizer medicines prescribed by their doctor. Pfizer RxPathways helps eligible patients find a path to assistance by connecting them to the Pfizer programs or resources that best fit their unique needs.

How Can Pfizer RxPathways Help?

Our Medicine Access Counselors are specially trained to work with each patient to understand their unique situation and guide them to the programs or resources that can best meet their needs. These include:



Pfizer Savings Program¹

Helps uninsured patients access their Pfizer medicines at a savings through participating pharmacies, regardless of income.



Pfizer Insurance Support

Helps patients understand their insurance coverage and reimbursement options for certain medicines, including cost-sharing requirements and prior authorization information.



Pfizer Patient Assistance Program²

Provides free Pfizer medicines to eligible patients through their doctor's office, at home, or – in some cases – via a co-pay card that will cover the entire cost of their co-pay at the pharmacy.³



Free Medicine Through Health Centers and Hospitals⁴

Eligible uninsured patients may be able to receive free medicine through select health centers and hospitals across the country that partner with Pfizer.



Treatment-Specific Patient Medicine Support Hubs

Provides comprehensive support services for specific oncology and specialty medicines.



Brand Co-Pay Card

Assists eligible patients with their co-pay costs.⁵

Medicine Access Counselors can also connect patients to resources available through other non-profit programs and foundations, such as the Partnership for Prescription Assistance.

In the last 5 years (2011-2015), Pfizer helped more than 2 million patients receive over 25 million Pfizer prescriptions for free or at a savings.⁶



Pfizer provides more than 60 Pfizer medicines for free through the Pfizer Patient Assistance program.



In 2015 alone, 2.7 million co-pay cards were redeemed to help patients lower or eliminate their out-of-pocket costs for their Pfizer prescriptions.



As a part of its commitment to access, Pfizer also provides charitable donations to independent non-profit charitable organizations. These organizations support eligible patients who require help paying their out-of-pocket expenses, including co-pays or co-insurance.

In 2015, Pfizer donated approximately \$20 million to co-pay foundations for a range of disease states.
