PFL NOTES

- The PFL's "November Pressure Cooker" ramped up in Week 11 as league-leading Drake and second-place Presbyterian both fell. That, combined with wins by St. Thomas and San Diego, has put five teams in the hunt for the PFL title with two weeks remaining in the regular season.
- Drake remains the league leader by one game and travels to a well-rested Dayton for its next big test, but the road has been kind to the Bulldogs during their three-plus seasons run in league play (see below). Presbyterian looks to bounce back, but will have to do it during a trip to Minnesota, where St. Thomas awaits with a five-game win streak. San Diego returns to the West Coast with a three-game win streak in hand and hosts a Butler squad looking to battle back after back-to-back losses. Davidson, the Stats Perform Team of the Week after upsetting Presbyterian, also makes a trip north to meet Marist, which has been tough to beat at Tenney Stadium. Stetson is also headed north to meet Valparaiso in a game that sees both teams looking to end losing streaks.
- If it's possible to fly under the radar after posting a 15-1 record the past two seasons, Drake had done awfully well in avoiding the spotlight in 2025 before claiming sole possession of the top spot in Week 9. However, Drake has won 23 of its last 25 PFL games, and the Bulldogs are 13-0 on the road and 11-2 at home over their previous 23 PFL games.
- Dayton running back Levi Moell was named the 2025 winner of the 2025 Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Merit Award presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). Created in June 2012 the Armed Forces Merit Award honors "an individual and/or a group with a military background and/or involvement that has an impact within the realm of college football."
- Morehead State wide receiver Ryan Upp, the reigning PFL Offensive Player of the Week, became the first FCS player with 1,000 receiving yards this season, ending Week 10 with an FCS-leading 1,017 receiving yards. He also ranks fourth in receptions per game (6.45) and receiving yards per game (92.5).
- Valparaiso's Ryan Ricketti, the reigning PFL Special Teams Player of the Week, became the first FCS kick returner with multiple 100-yard kickoff returns for a touchdown this season, with another 100-yard return against San Diego. He is fourth in the FCS with 30.4 yards per kick return.
- Marist's Chase Hatton, the reigning PFL Defensive Player of the Week, had two interceptions to become the fifth PFL player with multiple interceptions in the same game, a group that includes his teammate Nate Robinson Jr.
- Hatton was one of 22 student-athletes named to the initial Jerry Rice Award Watch List in October. The Jerry Rice Award, presented by Stats Perform, honors the Football Championship Subdivision's Freshman Player of the Year.
- Following a vote by the NCAA Division I Board of Directors in June, St. Thomas has officially completed the reclassification process, making it an active member of NCAA Division I and eligible to compete in NCAA championships. The Tommies will compete for the PFL automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs for the first time this season.
- There are currently 10 PFL alumni on NFL rosters, with seven on active 53-man rosters and three listed on reserve, injured, or practice rosters. Additionally, PFL alumni were featured on the rosters of the Canadian Football League and the United Football League during their respective 2025 seasons.

PFL PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK



Ryan Upp, Morehead State

Graduate, Wide Receiver, Leesburg, Virginia

Upp's seven-yard touchdown reception with 52 seconds remaining lifted Morehead State to a 31-30 victory against Butler. He caught nine passes for 154 yards and two touchdowns on the day, pushing past 1,000 receiving yards this season. In the first half, Upp had a 57-yard receiving touchdown that put Morehead State up 21-17 with 5:38 remaining in the half as Morehead State built a 24-17 halftime lead. All nine of his receptions resulted in a first down or touchdown and he averaged 17.1 yards per reception.

DEFENSIVE PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



Chase Hatton, Marist

Freshman, Safety, West Chester, Pennsylvania

Hatton picked off two passes, both in a decisive second quarter, as Marist posted a 41-13 victory against Stetson. He also had a game-best 12 tackles (three solo), a pass breakup, and a half tackle for loss in just three quarters of action. Hatton kicked off Marist's 28-point second quarter with an interception on the first play of the half and a six-yard return to set up a scoring drive. Six minutes later, he had his second interception of the first play of a drive, this time in Stetson territory, which turned into the quarter's third touchdown on the next play. He followed that up in the third quarter with a pass breakup and a tackle for loss on Stetson's first drive.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK



Ryan Ricketti, Valparaiso

Freshman (RS), Return Specialist, Rocky River, Ohio

Ricketti amassed an FCS season best 198 yards on four kickoff returns, including his second 100-yard kick return for a touchdown, in Valparaiso's 43-27 loss to San Diego. His 100-yard kick return gave Valparaiso a 21-20 lead with 10:44 remaining in the third quarter. Averaging 49.5 yards per return, he also had kick returns of 39, 19, and 40 yards, and finished with 256 all-purpose yards with six receptions for 58 yards added to his tally. He is the only FCS kick returner with two 100-yard returns this season (13 100-yard returns in 2025) and the first FCS special player with multiple 100-yarders in a season since 2022.

OTHER NOTABLE PERFORMANCES

OFFENSIVE

- Butler wide receiver Ethan Loss finished with 174 all-purpose yards, including seven receptions for 72 yards, in a loss at Morehead State.
- Davidson running back Mason Sheron ran for 89 yards on 20 carries and had a touchdown reception in a 14-13 victory against Presbyterian.
- Marist quarterback Sonny Mannino passed for two touchdowns and ran for two more in the second quarter and had 244 yards total offense (187 passing, 57 rushing) in his three quarters of action in a 41-13 victory against Stetson.
- Morehead State wide receiver Ryan Upp caught the game-winning touchdown with 52 seconds left, capping a nine-reception, 154-yard, two TD outing in a 31-30 victory against Butler.
- San Diego running back Matt Colombo became the second PFL running back with a three-touchdown performance and ran for 121 yards on 15 carries in a 43-27 victory at Valparaiso.

DEFENSIVE

- Davidson safety Dominic Njoku intercepted a pass with 2:15 remaining and had five tackles to help Davidson secure a 14-13 victory against Presbyterian.
- Morehead State defensive back Drayson Crane had a career-high 10 tackles, a sack, an interception, and a pass breakup in a 31-30 victory against Butler.
- Presbyterian linebacker Boyce Bankhead recorded 11 tackles (seven solo), including a tackle for loss, and forced a fumble in a loss at Davidson.
- San Diego safety Rueben Lopez had five tackles (four solo) and an interception in a 43-27 victory at Valparaiso.
- St. Thomas Nick Hand posted a career-best 12 tackles (seven solo) and a pass breakup in a 20-13 victory against Drake.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Butler kicker/punter Ryan Short hit three 40-yard field goals (43, 44, & 45 yards) and converted three PATs to account for 12 points in a loss at Morehead State.
- Marist kicker Samer Layous made two field goals, including a 46-yarder, and five PATs to finish with 11 points in a 41-13 victory against Stetson.
- St. Thomas wide receiver Stefano Giovannelli scored the game's first touchdown on a fake field goal from six yards out and was the holder on all kicks in a 20-13 victory at Drake.

NOTES FROM ACROSS THE LEAGUE

BULLDOGS IMPRESSIVE PFL RUN

If it's possible to fly under the radar after posting a 15-1 record the past two seasons, Drake had done awfully well in avoiding the spotlight in 2025 before claiming sole possession of the top spot in Week 9. However, Drake has won 23 of its last 25 PFL games, and the Bulldogs are 13-0 on the road and 11-2 at home over their previous 23 PFL games.

The Bulldogs win streak started with wins in their final three PFL games of the 2022 season. They then went 8-0 in PFL play in 2023 and 7-1 in 2024, winning the PFL championship each of those seasons.

NOVEMBER PRESSURE COOKER

The PFL's "November Pressure Cooker" ramped up in Week 11 as league-leading Drake and second-place Presbyterian both fell. That, combined with wins by St. Thomas and San Diego, has put five teams in the hunt for the PFL title with two weeks remaining in the regular season.

That followed November's opening weekend that saw both Butler and Dayton, who entered the month with one loss, suffering losses to begin the month and dropping into what was then a group of four teams with two losses in PFL play.

Week 12 has league-leading Drake, with one PFL loss, at two-loss Dayton, Presbyterian at St. Thomas in a battle of two-loss teams, and San Diego at home seeking to stay at two losses against Butler.

DAYTON'S MOELL RECEIVES ARMED FORCES MERIT AWARD

Dayton running back Levi Moell was named the 2025 winner of the 2025 Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Merit Award presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). Created in June 2012 the Armed Forces Merit Award honors "an individual and/or a group with a military background and/or involvement that has an impact within the realm of college football."

A redshirt junior from West Liberty, Ohio, Moell served four years in the Marines after a standout high school football career, choosing military service over college as an 18-year-old. He joined the Flyer football program in 2022. This season he has battled through an ankle injury to return to the travel squad and has seen action in three games. He has eight carries for 41 yards (5.1 yards per carry).

UPP WITH THE FIRST 1,000-YARD RECEIVER IN THE FCS

Morehead State wide receiver Ryan Upp, the reigning PFL Offensive Player of the Week, became the first FCS player with 1,000 receiving yards this season, ending Week 10 with an FCS-leading 1,017 receiving yards. He also ranks fourth in receptions per game (6.45) and receiving yards per game (92.5).

RICKETTI DASHES FOR 100 YARDS, AGAIN

Valparaiso's Ryan Ricketti, the reigning PFL Special Teams Player of the Week, became the first FCS kick returner with multiple 100-yard kickoff returns for a touchdown this season, with another 100-yard return against San Diego. He is fourth in the FCS with 30.4 yards per kick return and one of only four FCS kick returners with two or more (at Western Illinois and vs. San Diego).

Butler's Ethan Loss is second in the PFL with 29.4 yards per kick return and is also one of the four FCS kick returners with two returns for a touchdown this season (at Hanover and at Morehead State).

DAVIDSON NAMED FCS TEAM OF WEEK 11

Following its upset victory against nationally-ranked Presbyterian, Davidson was named the Stats Perform National FCS Team of the Week. The Wildcats' victory gave head coach Saj Thakker his first PFL victory and they retained the 1919 Cup.

CARDIAC EAGLES STRIKE AGAIN IN WEEK 11

Morehead State is manifesting its mascot and striking when you least expect it, especially late. For the third time during its current four-game win streak, the Eagles scored in the final two minutes to secure the win. Butler was Morehead State's latest victim, with Ryan Upp catching a pass with 52 seconds left to snatch the victory.

It is MSU's seventh game this season decided by seven points or less and they improved to 5-2 in those games after last Saturday's win against the Bulldogs.

PRESBYTERIAN'S RANKED RUN ENDS IN WEEK 11

Presbyterian enters Week 12 unranked in both FCS polls for the first time since late September. The Blue Hose put together a PFL record run of six consecutive weeks ranked in both national polls, reaching No. 16 in the AFCA Coaches Poll and No. 19 in the Stats Perform Media Poll.

DAYTON'S FIRENZE NABS NATIONAL RECOGNITION IN WEEK 9

Dayton safety Vincent Firenze became the fourth different PFL athlete to earn Stats Perform FCS National Player of the Week honors this season, claiming the Week 9 FCS Defensive Player of the Week award. His 20-yard pick-six in the third quarter capped Dayton's 28-point outburst in a 35-19 PFL victory against nationally-ranked Presbyterian and he added a career-high 14 tackles.

NOTES FROM ACROSS THE LEAGUE

MARIST'S HATTON NAMED TO RICE AWARD WATCH LIST

Marist freshman safety Chase Hatton was one of 22 student-athletes named to the initial Jerry Rice Award Watch List on Wednesday. The Jerry Rice Award, presented by Stats Perform, honors the Football Championship Subdivision's Freshman Player of the Year.

Through Week 8, Hatton has 52 tackles (22 solo), including 3.0 for loss, with two interceptions, and a fumble recovered. His 7.4 tackles per game ranks fifth in the PFL this season.

MOREHEAD STATE'S HOME NOW PHIL SIMMS STADIUM

Before its Week 8 game against Marist, Morehead State recognized alumnus, NFL veteran, and longtime NFL broadcaster Phil Simms by rededicating its football stadium in his honor.

Simms, a Springfield, Kentucky native, came to Morehead State from Louisville Southern High School in 1974. In 1977, he was named the Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Year and finished his career at Morehead State with 5,545 passing yards and 32 passing touchdowns. In addition to being named OVC Player of the Year, he was an All-OVC First-Team selection.

The New York Giants drafted him seventh overall in the 1979 NFL Draft. Simms played 14 seasons with the NFL's New York Giants, earning Super Bowl MVP in 1987. He was also a two-time Pro Bowl quarterback. Morehead State inducted Simms into its Athletic Hall of Fame in 1995.

HATTERS TIP INTO PFL WIN COLUMN IN BACK-TO-BACK WEEKS

Stetson followed its first PFL win since 2023 with a 21-14 home victory against Morehead State last week, giving it back-to-back PFL wins for the first time since 2019. The Hatters take those back-to-back wins on the road to nationally-ranked Presbyterian in search of a winning streak.

DRAKE'S BALKE IS WEEK 7 NATIONAL SPECIAL TEAMER OF THE WEEK

Drake kicker Harry Balke became the second PFL special teams player to earn the Stats Perform FCS National Players of the Week, claiming the Week 7 National Special Teams honor. A San Diego native, his 55-yard field goal as time expired allowed Drake to defeat San Diego on the game's final play for a second consecutive season. It was the longest walk-off field goal in the FCS since 2022. Balke also kicked a 43-yard field goal to open the fourth quarter, finishing with seven points.

THE MARIST-SAN DIEGO PUNTAPALOOZA

Marist punter Ethan Yuska and San Diego punter Emiliano Salazar had incredible outings in their Week 6 matchup in Poughkeepsie. Salazar was impressive with 11 punts for 515 yards, for 46.8 yards per punt, with five punts of 50-plus yards. Yuska punted 12 times for 473 yards – both FCS highs in 2025 – averaging 39.4 yards per punt.

TOREROS' SALAZAR IS WEEK 5 NATIONAL SPECIAL TEAMER OF THE WEEK

San Diego kicker/punter Emiliano Salazar became the third PFL athlete to earn Stats Perform FCS National Player of the Week honors this season. He is the Week 5 Special Teams Player of the Week after hitting a 25-yard field goal as time expired to lift the Toreros to a 30-27 PFL victory against St. Thomas. he was responsible for 12 points in the win after going 3-for-3 on field goals and PATs.

NFF ANNOUNCES CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALISTS, INCLUDING THREE PFL ATHLETES

Dayton's Ryan Iiams, Marist's Chris Leonardo, and Valparaiso's De'Andre Wilborn are among a group of 177 semifinalists – 44 from the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision – for the 2025 William V. Campbell Trophy®, college football's premier scholar-athlete award presented by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame.

PFL OWNS EIGHT WINS AGAINST THE FCS IN 2025

The PFL picked up another pair of wins against its FCS brethren in Week 4 as San Diego upended Princeton and Dayton rallied past Robert Morris for road wins. The eight nonconference FCS wins are the league's most since 2009. The league record for most wins against FCS teams in a season since 2000 is 10, set during the 2001 season.

Marist, Presbyterian, and San Diego each have two nonconference FCS wins this season, while Dayton and St. Thomas have claimed one win each.

ALL FIVE FIRST-YEAR HEAD COACHES HAVE WINS

With Davidson's win in Week 4, all of the league's five new head coaches have recorded a win in their new home this season. First, it was Drake's Joe Woodley and Valparaiso's Andy Waddle who picked up wins in their Week 1 debuts. Week 2 action saw Butler's Kevin Lynch and Stetson's Mike Jasper pick up their first victories. Davidson's Saj Thakkar joined the club in Week 4 with a home shutout win.

MARIST'S ROBINSON JR. IS WEEK 3 NATIONAL DEFENDER OF THE WEEK

Marist sophomore safety Nate Robinson Jr. used an impressive outing against Wagner to earn the Stats Perform FCS National Defensive Player of the Week award for Week 3. He recorded a pair of interceptions in the Red Foxes' road victory and also had 10 tackles (four solo) and a half tackle for loss. He led a Marist defense that recorded five interceptions against the Seahawks, with the win giving the Red Foxes two wins against nonconference FCS teams for the first time in program history.

SPEAKING OF WEEK 3's THREE KOR TOUCHDOWNS

Robinson Jr.'s kickoff return for a touchdown was the first of three by PFL return specialists in Week 3 – all on the road. Butler's Ethan Loss had the second kick return for a TD on the day, scampering 90 yards for a touchdown against Hanover. Valparaiso's Ryan Ricketti capped the day with a 100-yard return at Western Illinois, tying the NCAA record as the current maximum kick return possible.

The PFL's three kick return touchdowns in Week 3 are alone tied for the most in the FCS this season, matching the Southern Conference's three on the year. Adding in the return by Morehead State's Sidney Moss earlier in the season, the PFL leads all FCS conferences with four return TDs this season.

STETSON'S ALEXANDER WEEK 2 NATIONAL FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Stetson freshman quarterback Kael Alexander picked up the PFL's first national honor of 2025, claiming the Stats Perform FCS National Freshman of the Week award after Week 2's action. Alexander picked up his first win as a starter, completing 11-of-15 passes for 336 yards and three touchdowns in a 59-13 victory against Warner on Sept. 6. Six of his 11 completions went for 40 yards or more, including a 65-yard touchdown pass. Alexander's performance gave Stetson first-year head coach Mike Jasper his first victory.

SAN DIEGO NOTCHES PFL'S SECOND WIN VS. NATIONALLY-RANKED FOE

San Diego stunned No. 24 Southern Utah in overtime on September 6 in San Diego, California, giving the PFL its second win against a ranked FCS opponent in 2025. It is the first time since 2000 the league has two wins against Top 25 FCS teams. It was San Diego's third win against a ranked team, joining wins against Cal Poly in 2016 and Northern Arizona in 2017 – both victories in the FCS Playoffs.

PRESBYTERIAN KNOCKS OFF NATIONALLY-RANKED FCS OPPONENT

Presbyterian stunned No. 11 Mercer on August 30 at Five Star Stadium in Macon, Georgia. It was the PFL's fourth victory against a ranked FCS opponent since 2010 and first since Butler defeated Youngstown State to open the 2018 season. It snapped the PFL's 27-game losing streak to ranked FCS opposition.

SAN DIEGO RETURNS TO PFL PRESEASON #1 FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2019

For the first time since 2019, the league's head coaches tapped San Diego as the preseason favorite in the PFL 2025 Preseason Coaches Poll.

San Diego picked up five first-place votes and was not ranked lower than third by any of the league's head coaches to earn the poll's top spot with 94 points.

Drake, the 2024 PFL Champion, was first on three ballots and was selected in the top three on six ballots, earning second place in the poll with 78 points. St. Thomas, with 72 points, including a first-place vote, was third with 72 points.

RETURNING TWO-TIME ALL-PFL SELECTION DOMINIC KIBBY HIGHLIGHTS 2025 PRESEASON ALL-PFL TEAM

Presbyterian College junior wide receiver Dominic Kibby is one of seven returning First Team All-PFL selections to be highlighted on the 2025 Pioneer Football League Preseason Team, announced in July.

Kibby, who is a two-time First Team All-PFL honoree, returns with 95 receptions and 1,479 receiving yards to his credit in his first two seasons with the Blue Hose. He was joined on the preseason team by a pair of teammates: graduate student wide receiver Cincere Gill and sophomore quarterback Collin Hurst. Presbyterian also has returning First Team All-PFL selections in defensive lineman Carter Szydiowski, defensive back Caleb Francis, and return specialist Zach Switzer.

There are three other returning 2024 First Team All-PFL selections on the preseason squad. Davidson running back Mari Adams and fullback Mason Sheron, as well as Marist offensive lineman Dominic Perricone. In addition, both of the PFL's 2024 Freshmen of the Year return in Hurst and Marist linebacker James Kratochvil.

NOTES FROM ACROSS THE LEAGUE

ST. THOMAS GAINS FULL-FLEDGED DIVISION I STATUS

Following a vote by the NCAA Division I Board of Directors in June, the University of St. Thomas has officially completed the reclassification process, making it an active member of NCAA Division I and eligible to compete in NCAA championships.

The Tommies, who became the first institution to reclassify from Division III directly to Division I, won the 2022 Pioneer Football League title and finished among the league's top three teams in each of their first four seasons. Under head coach Glenn Caruso, St. Thomas has compiled a 31-14 (.689) record in four seasons as a Division I program, including a 26-6 (.812) record in PFL play. The Tommies have also seen their student-athletes earn 29 All-PFL honors.

QUINTET OF NEW COACHES

The PFL's coaching ranks continued to experience turnover during the 2024-25 offseason, with five head coaches hired. Butler, Davidson, Drake, Stetson, and Valparaiso all brought aboard new leaders for their programs. The turnover makes St. Thomas head coach Glenn Caruso the longest-serving head coach in the PFL as he begins his fifth PFL season with the Tommies (16th overall). Presbyterian's Steve Englehart is next at four seasons. **See PFL Coaching Records on page 7.**

DAVIDSON'S ADAMS NAMED TO 2025 WALTER PAYTON AWARD PRE-SEASON WATCH LIST

Davidson College senior running back Mari Adams was one of 30 student-athletes named to the 30-player preseason watch list for the 2025 Walter Payton Award, presented annually by Stats Perform to the national offensive player of the year in Division I FCS college football. Adams, from Shelby, North Carolina, was a Stats Perform Preseason Third-Team selection earlier this month after a First Team All-PFL campaign in 2024 that saw him rank among the FCS leaders in rushing yards (1,231 yards, 13th), rushing yards per game (111.9 ypg, 5th), and rushing touchdowns (15 TDs, 11th). He enters 2025 having rushed for 2,368 yards and 31 touchdowns during his career.

DRAKE LINEBACKER ALLISON AMONG NATIONAL STANDOUTS AS MEMBER OF 2025 BUCK BUCHANAN AWARD PRESEASON WATCH LIST

Drake senior linebacker Sean Allison has received national recognition as one of 30 student-athletes named to the 2025 Buck Buchanan Award Preseason Watch List. Allison, a Hinsdale, Illinois native, returns as a 2024 Second Team All-PFL selection, tallying 105 total tackles last season —the second-most among the Bulldogs' roster —with 5.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks, plus an interception and two quarterback hurries.

TWO PFL ATHLETES NAMED TO 2025 STATS PERFORM FCS PRE-SEASON ALL-AMERICA TEAM

Drake long snapper Brett Welsing and Davidson College running back Mari Adams were named to the 2025 Stats Perform FCS Preseason All-America Team, with Adams later being named to the Walter Payton Award Preseason Watch List (see above). Welsing, a senior from De Pere, Wisconsin, was a preseason second-team selection after earning First Team All-PFL honors at long snapper last season. He has played in all 23 games during the past two seasons for the Bulldogs, also earning Second Team All-PFL recognition in 2023.

80 PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED TO 2025 NFF HAMPSHIRE HONOR SOCIETY

In April, the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF) announced the 2025 NFF Hampshire Honor Society members, with 80 Pioneer Football League student-athletes among the record-breaking 2,536 who qualified for membership. Marist led all PFL institutions with 19 student-athletes recognized. Dayton (14), Davidson (5), Drake (11), Morehead State (5), St. Thomas (11), and Valparaiso (15) also saw student-athletes named to the Hampshire Honor Society. Members of the NFF Hampshire Society are seniors or graduate college football players from all divisions of the NCAA, NAIA, and Spring Football who maintained a cumulative 3.2 GPA or better during their college careers.

TOREROS ALUMNUS JOSH JOHNSON'S WELL-TRAVELED NFL CAREER

San Diego alumnus Josh Johnson, who was drafted in the fifth round of the 2008 NFL Draft, was signed by the Washington Commanders during the offseason and is vying for a roster spot in the 2025 season. In the 17 seasons since that draft, he has played for an NFL-record 14 different teams (according to The New York Times/The Athletic). Johnson has played as a starter for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Washington Redskins (now Commanders), and the Baltimore Ravens. He has also been on the roster with the San Francisco 49ers, Cleveland Browns, Cincinnati Bengals, New York Jets, Indianapolis Colts, Buffalo Bills, New York Giants, Houston Texans, Oakland Raiders, Detroit Lions, and Denver Broncos. Entering 2025, he has completed 208-of-358 passes for 2,297 yards and 13 touchdowns.

PFL AUTOMATIC QUALIFIER TIEBREAKER PROCEDURE

The Pioneer Football League uses the following tiebreaker system to determine its automatic qualifier (AQ) for the Division I Football Championship. In no instance is this tiebreaker used to break a tie for the league championship, all teams tied for first place at the end of the regular season will share the title and be designated co-champions.

WHEN TWO TEAMS ARE TIED

1. If there is a two-team tie in conference play and the two tied teams played each other, the winner of the head-to-head competition shall be declared the automatic qualifier (AQ).
2. If the tied teams did not play each other, then each team's record against all common opponents in the league shall be used to break the tie and declare the AQ.
3. If the teams are still tied, then each team's record against the next highest common opponent in the league standings shall be used to break the tie and declare the AQ.
4. If common teams played are tied in the standings, they will be regarded as a unit when determining records against. [Example: If A/B/C are tied for first and next highest common opponents, D & E are tied, combined records against D & E will be used.]
5. If the teams are still tied, then the PFL "Strength of Victory" (combined record of PFL teams defeated) shall be used to break the tie;
6. If the teams are still tied, then the PFL "Strength of Schedule" (combined record of PFL teams played) shall be used to break the tie;
7. If the teams are still tied, a coin toss shall be used as the final tiebreaker.

WHEN THREE OR MORE TEAMS ARE TIED:

NOTE: If at any point a tie is broken using the multiple-team tiebreaker procedures and only two teams remain tied, the remaining teams shall revert to the two-team tiebreaker procedures.

1. If the tied teams all played one another, the team with the best cumulative record involving games with the tied teams shall be declared the AQ. For example, if a team is 2-0 against two other tied teams, that team shall be declared champion.
2. If the tied teams did not play each other, but one team played and defeated all the other teams involved in the tie, that team is the AQ.
3. If the tied teams all played one another and have identical records against the other tied teams, then each team's record against all common opponents in the league shall be used to determine the AQ. If teams are still tied, then each team's record against the next highest common opponent in the league standings shall be used to determine the AQ.
4. If the tied teams did not play each other, then each team's record against all common league opponents shall be used to determine the champion. If teams are still tied and did not play each other, then each team's record against the next highest common opponent in the league standings shall be used to determine the AQ.
5. If the teams are still tied, then the PFL "Strength of Victory" (combined record of PFL teams defeated) shall be used to break the tie;
6. If the teams are still tied, then the PFL "Strength of Schedule" (combined record of PFL teams played) shall be used to break the tie;
7. If the teams are still tied, the AQ shall be drawn by lot as the final tiebreaker.
