PFL NOTES

- The race for the 34th Pioneer Football League championship begins Saturday with eight of the league's 11 members on the field. A matchup between two title contenders highlights opening weekend as preseason favorite San Diego travels to meet St. Thomas, picked third in the coaches' preseason poll. Both teams are coming off quality wins against Big Sky foes last week, with the Toreros winning on the road at Cal Poly while St. Thomas took care of Southern Utah at home.
- Elsewhere in Week 4 action, three-time defending champion Drake returns after its bye week and gets its first win of 2026 when it travels to Davidson, which picked off Southern Conference member VMI last week. Presbyterian continues a three-game road trip as it heads north to meet a rested Marist squad that is also coming off its bye week.
- The Hoosier Helmet Trophy game between Butler and Valparaiso caps the PFL's opening weekend. It's the 86th meeting all-time between the Bulldogs and Beacons and the 22nd time they will vie for the Hoosier Helmet Trophy, which was established in 2006 between the two in-state foes. Butler has claimed the trophy 14 times in the previous 21 meetings.
- The PFL impressed in its final full weekend of nonconference play, picking up five key FCS wins. San Diego and St. Thomas downed a pair of Big Sky Conference opponents (Cal Poly and Southern Utah, respectively), Dayton upset a United Athletic Conference foe (Eastern Kentucky), Davidson rallied to upend a Southern Conference member (VMI), and Butler picked off an FCS independent (Chicago State).
- Butler senior quarterback Reagan Andrew and Marist graduate student and offensive lineman Will Aaronson represent the Pioneer Football League as two of a record 206 semifinalists for the 2026 William V. Campbell Trophy®, presented by the National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Football Hall of Fame.
- The PFL welcomes two new head coaches in 2026: Drake's Matt Walker and Presbyterian's Matt Rahl. The league has seen 9 of its 11 head coaches join the league in the past three seasons. St. Thomas head coach Glenn Caruso is the dean of PFL head coaches as he begins his sixth PFL season and 17th at St. Thomas. Dayton head coach Trevor Andrews starts his fourth season, making him the league's second-longest-tenured head coach.
- San Diego is the PFL preseason favorite by a narrow margin in the league's preseason coaches' poll. The Toreros received five first-place votes and 90 points. Drake was picked second with five first-place votes and 88 points. St. Thomas earned the third-place nod with 87 points, as the only team to earn a spot in the Top 3 on all 10 possible ballots.
- Dayton, which was picked fourth in the league's preseason coaches' poll, had the PFL's representatives on the Walter Payton and Buck Buchanan Award Preseason Watch Lists, presented by Stats Perform. All-purpose back Gavin Lochow and defensive lineman Mirko Jaksic, both returning First Team All-Pioneer Football League selections, earned the preseason recognition.
- Lochow and Jaksic are two of just seven returning First Team All-PFL selections. The other five returning first-teamers are San Diego running back Adam Criter, St. Thomas fullback Luke Schuler, Butler offensive lineman Charles Mackley, San Diego offensive lineman Maicah Talavou, and San Diego punter Emiliano Salazar.
- Salazar, the reigning PFL Special Teams Player of the Year, was one of 14 selections to the 2026 FCS Punter of the Year Watch List and one of 15 FCS placekickers named to the 18th annual Fred Mitchell Award Watch List.

PFL PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK



Casey Bullock, Davidson

Junior, Quarterback, Medina Ohio

Bullock accounted for 392 offensive yards and three touchdowns, leading Davidson to a 27-24 overtime victory against VMI. He ran for a career-high 104 yards and a touchdown on 25 carries against the Keydets. Bullock also completed 20-of-32 passes for 288 yards (14.4 yards per completion) and two touchdowns. His one-yard touchdown run gave the Wildcats a 24-17 lead with 59 seconds remaining in regulation. Trailing 14-3 after the first quarter, he led back-to-back scoring drives in the second quarter. Bullock capped the first with a 32-yard touchdown toss to Alani Ajigbotosho and the second with a 22-yard touchdown pass to Jacary Lightsey, giving the Wildcats a 17-14 lead. He opened overtime with three consecutive runs totaling 17 yards to set up the game-winning field goal.

DEFENSIVE PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



Hayden Bender, Davidson

Senior, Safety, Kingwood, Texas

Bender recorded two takeaways, including a forced fumble in overtime, to help Davidson defeat VMI 27-24. His first takeaway came on the opening drive of the second half when he intercepted a pass to set up the Wildcats deep in VMI territory. However, on the second play of VMI's overtime possession, Bender separated the ball from the ball carrier and Davidson recovered to end the game. He also had seven tackles (three solo) in the win.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK



Emiliano Salazar, San Diego

Junior, Kicker/Punter, Orange, California

Salazar's 38-yard field goal with two seconds remaining lifted San Diego to a 38-35 victory at Cal Poly. It was his lone field goal attempt of the night, but he connected on all five PATs and accounted for eight points in the win. Salazar also averaged 38.0 yards on three punts and handled kickoff duties for the Toreros.

FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK



Nick Peipert, St. Thomas

Freshman (RS), Quarterback, Barrington, Illinois

Peipert completed 16-of-29 passes for 231 yards and a touchdown and ran for a second score, leading a 28-26 victory against Southern Utah. He opened the game's scoring with a 63-yard touchdown connection with Quentin Cobb-Butler, who finished the day with 108 receiving yards on four catches. Peipert closed the first half with a one-yard touchdown run as the clock expired, giving the Tommies a 21-17 lead they would not relinquish.

WITH A FLOURISH AT THE END

The PFL impressed in its final full weekend of nonconference play, picking up five key FCS wins. TWO PFL ATHLETES NAMED CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALISTS

Butler University senior quarterback Reagan Andrew and Marist University graduate student and offensive lineman Will Aaronson represent the Pioneer Football League as two of a record 206 semifinalists for the 2026 William V. Campbell Trophy®, presented by the National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Football Hall of Fame.

The Campbell Trophy® is college football's premier scholar-athlete award. Celebrating its 37th year, the Campbell Trophy® recognizes the nation's best football scholar-athlete for combined academic success, football performance, and exemplary leadership.

TOREROS TOUGH TEST

San Diego faced a Big Sky Conference gauntlet to begin 2026, facing a trio of teams that were at least receiving votes in both national polls. The Toreros fell to UC Davis in Week 1 and Idaho State in Week 2, but stood tall with a win at Cal Poly in Week 3. Those three teams were a combined 8-3 at the end of the run, giving USD the eighth-toughest schedule (by win percentage) against fellow FCS squads. Things don't get easier for San Diego as it starts PFL play with a 3-1 St. Thomas team this week.

BULLDOGS PASSING PROWESS

Drake enters PFL play ranked No. 3 among FCS teams in passing offense and first outside the Ivy League teams that just opened play in Week 3. The Bulldogs averaged 361 yards per game in three nonconference outings, completing 100 of 172 passes for 1,083 yards and six touchdowns. Bulldogs quarterback Riley Warzynski is fourth nationally in passing yards per game (342.7) and third in total offense (345.3).

FLYERS' BROOKS LEADS FCS PICKS STANDINGS

Junior Javawn Brooks leads the Dayton defense with three interceptions in three games, posting 1.00 picks per game and leading all FCS defenders. He notched two picks in a Week Zero season opener against Fairmont State and added his third against Thomas More in Week 2.

THE LAVELLE FLYER

Dayton junior punter Ben Lavelle has shown off his leg in two outings, posting an FCS-leading 50.5 yards per punt on 12 kicks this season. He has booted seven 50-yarders this season, including a 62-yard punt in the Flyers' season opener. Lavelle has also seen four punts downed inside the 20-yard line. Meanwhile, Dayton opponents have attempted only one return, with four fair catches and one touchback.

BULLDOGS' FLOOD, BEACONS' SAMUEL AMONG TACKLE LEADERS

Drake graduate student J.R. Flood and Valparaiso redshirt junior Max Samuel are among the FCS leaders in total tackles and tackles for loss, respectively, entering the league's final weekend of nonconference play. Flood began 2026 with a stellar 18-tackle outing for the Bulldogs and enters the weekend ranked fourth among FCS tacklers at 11.7 tackles per game. Samuel brings 5.5 TFLs into this weekend's action and is 12th in the FCS at 1.83 tackles for loss per game.

EAGLES' WATSON GARNERS PFL'S FIRST NATIONAL WEEKLY HONOR

Morehead State freshman Cross Watson was Stats Perform's FCS National Freshman Player of the Week in Week 1. He needed just four receptions to score three touchdowns and amass 132 yards in the Eagles' 75-24 win against Kentucky Christian last week.

EIGHT PFL ALUMNI ON NFL ROSTERS FOR 2026 OPENER

Five Pioneer Football League alumni are listed on the final 53-man rosters as the 2026 NFL season starts. That list includes Super Bowl LX champion Jason Myers (Seattle) and participant Eric Saubert (New England). Saubert was the Patriots' starting tight end in Super Bowl LX. In addition, three PFL alumni will begin the season on NFL practice squads.

MYERS FIRST PFL ALUMNUS TO CLAIM SUPER BOWL TITLE

Seattle's Jason Myers became the first PFL alumnus to win an NFL Super Bowl title, helping the Seattle Seahawks claim Super Bowl LX. He set a Super Bowl record with five field goals, pushing him to an NFL-record 206 points for the 2025 season, including playoffs.

NOTES FROM ACROSS THE LEAGUE

PFL FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK OFFICIALLY OFFICIAL IN 2026

Beginning this season, the PFL will officially name a Freshman of the Week for the first time. The league has had an unofficial freshman honor each of the past two seasons, with nominees for the National Freshman of the Week honor. In 2026, true freshmen and redshirt freshmen will be eligible for the award.

SAN DIEGO CLAIMS TOP SPOT IN 2026 PFL PRESEASON COACHES' POLL

For a second consecutive season, the University of San Diego is the preseason favorite in the Pioneer Football League's 2026 Preseason Coaches' Poll.

The Toreros claimed the top spot in what the league's coaches see as an extremely tight race for the league's 34th championship, with only three points separating the Top 3 teams in the poll. San Diego claimed five first-place votes while amassing 90 points. The Toreros are seeking their first PFL title since sharing the 2021 championship.

Drake, the three-time defending PFL Champion, also picked up five first-place votes and received 88 points to finish second in the poll. St. Thomas was the lone team picked to finish in the Top 3 on all 10 possible ballots and finished with 87 points, third in the poll. Dayton and Butler scored 69 and 67 points, respectively, to finish out the preseason Top 5.

RETURNING FIRST TEAM ALL-PFL SELECTIONS JAKSIC & LOCHOW HIGHLIGHT PRESEASON ALL-PFL SQUADS

University of Dayton all-purpose back Gavin Lochow and defensive lineman Mirko Jaksic, both returning First Team All-Pioneer Football League selections, highlighted the 2026 Preseason All-PFL Team, presented Tuesday.

Lochow, a senior from Proctorville, Ohio, is a Preseason All-PFL selection for the second consecutive year. He followed his 2026 preseason selection by earning First Team All-PFL after ranking third with 118.0 all-purpose yards per game. Jaksic, a senior from Norridge, Illinois, also returns after earning First Team All-PFL honors in 2025. He finished last season with 33 total tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss and two sacks.

Lochow and Jaksic are among seven returning First Team All-PFL selections from 2025. The other five returning first-teamers are San Diego running back Adam Criter, St. Thomas fullback Luke Schuler, Butler offensive lineman Charles Mackley, San Diego offensive lineman Maicah Talavou, and San Diego punter Emiliano Salazar.

PAIR OF NEW FACES LEAD PFL SQUADS

The top two teams in the 2025 PFL race will enter 2026 with new faces leading the way. Defending champion Drake turned to Matt Walker, who led Wisconsin-River Falls to the 2025 NCAA Division III National Championship. Presbyterian elevated former offensive line coach Matt Rahl to head coach during the offseason. Meanwhile, St. Thomas head coach Glenn Caruso remains the PFL's longest-serving head coach in the PFL as he begins his sixth PFL season with the Tommies (17th overall). Dayton's Steve Andrew is next at four seasons. **See PFL Coaching Records on page 7.**

DAYTON'S LOCHOW NAMED TO WALTER PAYTON AWARD PRE-SEASON WATCH LIST

Dayton senior all-purpose back Gavin Lochow was named to the 40th-anniversary Walter Payton Award Preseason Watch List, presented annually by Stats Perform to the National Offensive Player of the Year in Division I FCS college football. Lochow also picked up Stats Perform FCS Preseason Third Team All-America honors. He led the Flyers in receiving yards and kick returns while adding 362 rushing yards and two scores in 2025. He was named First Team All-PFL as a receiver and special teamer, and was named Dayton's team MVP. The Proctorville, Ohio native will once again play a major role for UD on offense and special teams this season.

FLYER'S JAKSIC A MEMBER OF BUCK BUCHANAN AWARD PRE-SEASON WATCH LIST

Dayton senior defensive lineman Mirko Jaksic was one of 30 student-athletes named to the 2026 Buck Buchanan Award Preseason Watch List. The Norridge, Illinois native posted career-highs with 11 starts, 33 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss, and two sacks in 2025.

SAN DIEGO'S SALAZAR DOUBLE DIPS ON PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

San Diego junior kicker and punter Emiliano Salazar earned double preseason recognition this summer. In early August, he was named to the 2026 Preseason Watch List for the 18th Annual Fred Mitchell Award, recognizing the nation's top placekicker outside the Division I FBS ranks. Salazar was then named one of 14 FCS punters named to the Augusta Sports Council's Preseason Watch List for the 2026 FCS Punter of the Year Award.

Salazar is the reigning PFL Special Teams Player of the Year, after finishing last season with 15-of-18 field goals and all 40 of his PATs, while averaging 44.76 yards per punt, with 13 of his 37 punts going for 50-plus yards; he also handled kickoff duties for the Toreros. Salazar finished the season second in punting average among PFL punters, thanks to his league-leading 50-yard punt count, and was one of three kickers to score 15 field goals during the season.

VALPO CAPTAIN MARK JOHNSON MAKES SELFLESS BONE MARROW DONATION

Valparaiso senior defensive back Mark Johnson made a life-saving decision during the summer, becoming a bone marrow donor to save a five-year-old child in Paris, France. Johnson, who joined the national bone marrow registry after learning about the rare bone marrow disease battle of Kerry Jean Waddle, the wife of Valparaiso head coach Andy Waddle, learned he was a potential match this summer and underwent the surgical procedure for the donation in June.
