## Specific Aims

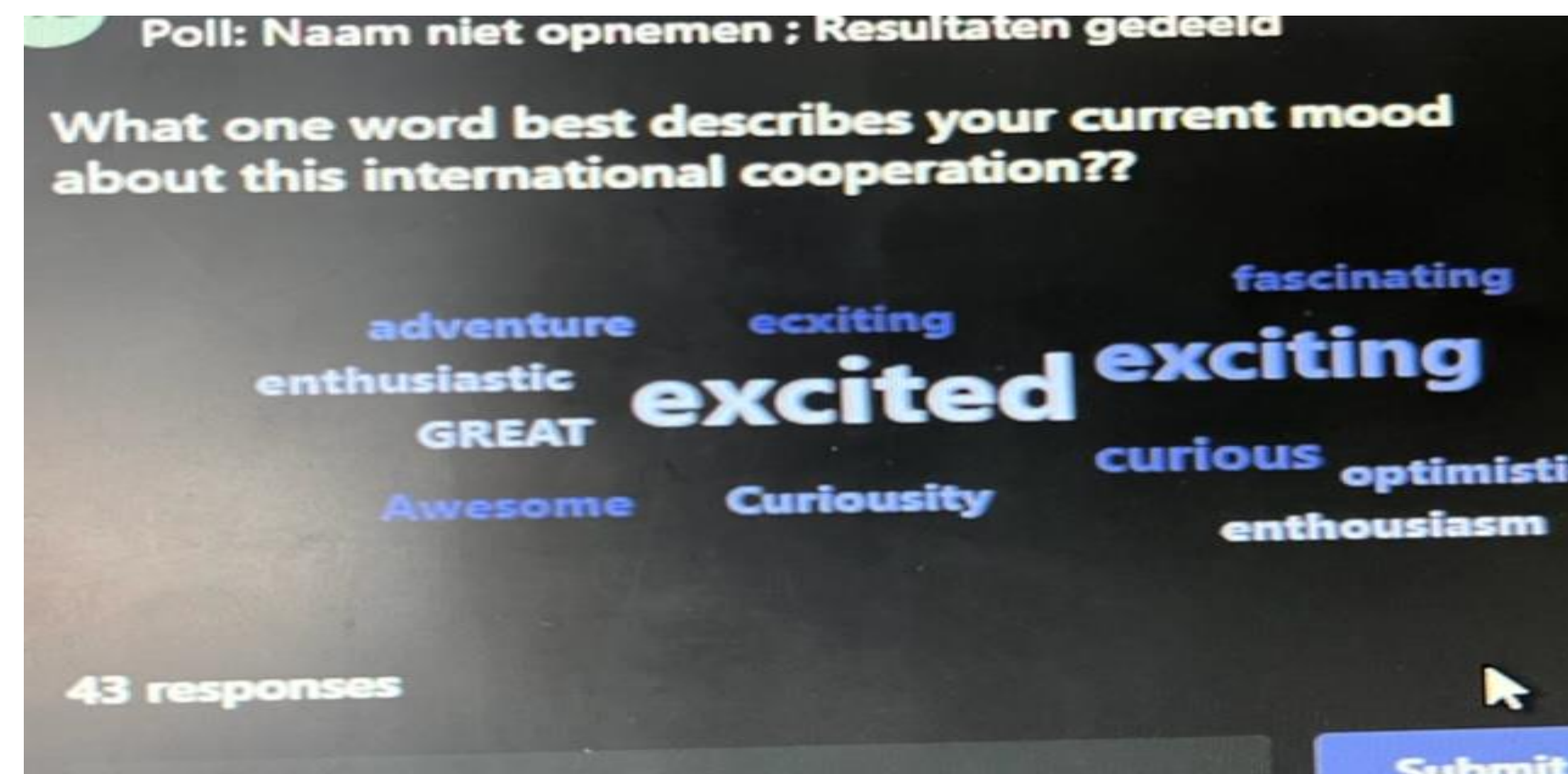

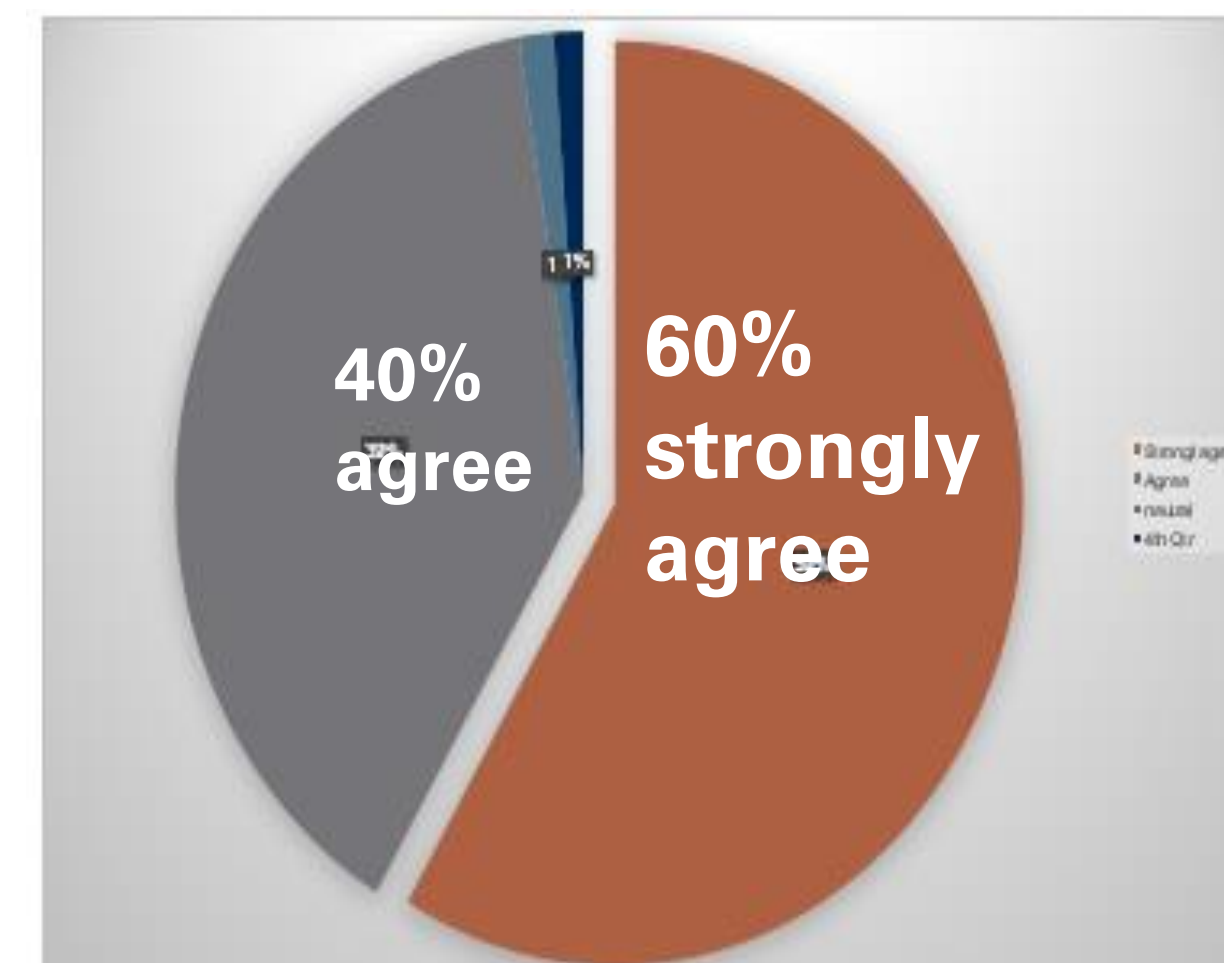
