Moldova State University

Historic

The Moldova State University (MSU) is the first higher education institution with university status established in the Republic of Moldova.

Founded on October 1, 1946, with the initial name of Chisinau State University, over time it has built an impeccable reputation at national and international level. Its creation constituted a basic pillar for the development and consolidation of higher education in the country.

Initially, 5 faculties were opened: History and Philology, Physics and Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry, Geology and Pedology. In the first year (1946-1947), 320 students were enrolled at the 12 departments, the educational process being guided by 35 teaching staff. In 1958, the part-time education section was inaugurated at USM, which, in some faculties, continues to this day. An opportunity for the training of young specialists was, for several years in a row (1958-1981), the evening section.

In a short time, MSU becomes a recognized leader of the national higher education system in the country, responding to society's demands by diversifying the programs offered and establishing new subdivisions, departments and faculties, including: Faculty of Economics (1953, 2002), Faculty of Law (1959), Faculty of Engineering and Technology (1959), Faculty of Foreign Languages (1964), Faculty of Training for Foreign Students (1967), School of Journalism (1980), Faculty of Philosophy and Psychology (1994), Faculty of Political Sciences (1995), Computing Center (1973). Between 1946-1988, USM was a component part of the Soviet university system, its management being directed by Moscow, the capital of the ex-USSR. With the breakup of the Soviet Union, essential changes were introduced in the national education system. The period 1988-1996, for the university, is characterized by the improvement of traditional forms of teaching-learning and the application of new technologies. On January 19, 1990, the institution received its current name - the The Moldova State University.

During more than 70 years, MSU has become an elite university center, both nationally and internationally. About 120 thousand graduates of this university work in various fields, such as: economy, education, culture, justice, politics, etc. A large part of the intellectual elite of the Republic of Moldova was trained at USM.

The Moldova State University is the first nationally accredited higher education institution (2001). The educational process is carried out by a prestigious academic community, which ensures its development at the level of the labor market requirements, rallying to modern training paradigms by joining, in May 2005, the Bologna Process.

In 2011, 65 years after its foundation, as a sign of high appreciation of the special merits in the development of national university education and in the promotion of reforms in the field, for the substantial contribution to the training of highly qualified specialists and young scientists, the State University of Moldova she was decorated with the highest state award - "Order of the Republic".

Starting from 2013, according to the results of the World Ranking Web of Universities, developed by the Superior Council of Scientific Investigations within the Ministry of Science and Innovation of Spain, the Moldova State University ranks first in the list of the most prestigious universities in the country, in fact which proves that USM is a competitive higher education institution and its graduates enjoy a wide spectrum of employment opportunities.

The Moldova State University represents the space where academic freedom is promoted. Here, the pluralism of opinions, creativity, as well as the tendency to ensure the quality of the training of highly qualified specialists were permanently supported, turning into a laboratory of democracy with ideas generated on the basis of a constructive dialogue between students and the teaching staff.

MSU benefits from a modern technical-material base, which corresponds to international standards, ensuring the activity of academic staff and students by creating a favorable environment for the educational and research process. The university offers students 6 educational blocks, 10 dormitories, a university library equipped with reading rooms, a Palace of Sports, a House of Culture, canteens, practice and leisure facilities.

Currently, the Moldova State University is one of the most important higher education institutions in the country. USM has a contingent of approximately 15,000 students, who study over a hundred bachelor's and master's degree programs in 11 faculties and 1 institute and 4 doctoral schools.

The Moldova State University is recognized in the area of international university education and is integrated into a strong network of international cooperation.

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

All the degree programs at Moldova State University are offered in Romanian, the majority of them in Russian and some of the programs could be offered in English as well. The applicant should have at least the level of knowledge B1/B2 according to CEFR.

If the applicant does not speak one of these languages, then he/she is advised to take Romanian or Russian language 8-months-long courses (preparatory year).

ADMISSION PROCESS

PREPARATORY YEAR

The admission of foreign citizens at language preparation courses for studying Romanian or Russian is carried out in two intakes:

- 1. May 1st – September 30th – Preparation courses start on November 1st**
- 2. October 1st – January 30th – Preparation courses start on February 1st**

All candidates must send their candidate file in scanned color copies to the International Student Office at the following email address: tatiana.racu@usm.md.

The candidate's file must contain the **following documents** (and legally certified translations into Romanian or into an international language of circulation):

- a) **Registration form.**
- b) **Copy of passport**, valid for at least one year from the date of application. In case of dual citizenship, copies of both passports.
- c) **Copy and legally certified translation of the marriage certificate**, if not drawn up in an international language.
- d) **Copy and legally certified translation of the high school diploma or baccalaureate diploma and the diploma supplement or equivalents**, apostilled/superlegalized in accordance with the provisions of the legislation of the issuing state and of the Republic of Moldova, and translated into Romanian or into an international language of circulation (for member countries of the Hague Convention – apostille, for other countries – endorsement by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the respective country, subsequently superlegalization at the Consular Directorate General of the Republic of Moldova). The documents mentioned in subpoints b), c), d) of this point will be translated into Romanian or English, notarized and legalized in the manner established by the state authorities of the respective country.
- e) **Declaration on one's own responsibility regarding the veracity of the documents presented;**
- f) **Foreign student survey;**
- g) Receipt of payment of admission fee/registration fee

The accepted candidate, upon arrival in Moldova, in addition to the aforementioned documents, must also present the following documents:

PhD, Cycle III

Only graduates with a master's degree or its equivalent, recognized by the competent authorities, from both domestic and foreign institutions, according to the law and the regulations of the doctoral schools, have the right to participate in the doctoral studies admission competition.

Foreign citizens can participate in doctoral studies either on a fee-paying basis or within the budgetary places offered by the Ministry of Education, Culture, and Research based on intergovernmental agreements, in accordance with the provisions of the Regulation on the Studies of Foreigners in Educational Institutions of the Republic of Moldova, approved by Government Decision no. 504 of July 4, 2017, and the institutional Regulation regarding the recognition

and equivalence of foreign study documents and study periods completed abroad and/or in other doctoral schools in the Republic of Moldova, adopted at the USM Senate meeting on March 29, 2022.

The application files, scanned in color, must be sent to the Doctoral and Postgraduate Studies Office at the following email address: lilia.spinu@usm.md, during the period from September to October.

The candidate's file must contain the following documents (and legally certified translations into Romanian or into an international language of circulation):

1. **Application for enrollment** – A document in which the candidate formally expresses their intention to pursue doctoral studies at the respective institution.
2. **Bachelor's and master's diplomas (or their equivalents)** – These documents must be recognized by the competent authorities to demonstrate the completion of previous studies required for access to the doctoral program.
3. **Diploma supplement** – The academic record or transcript accompanying the diploma, detailing the courses taken and the grades obtained.
4. **Birth certificate** – Scanned color copy of the birth certificate.
5. **Identity document – Scanned color copy of the passport** (for dual citizenship – both passports) valid for at least one year.
6. **CV (Curriculum Vitae)** – A summary of the candidate's academic and professional experience.
7. **Letter of intent** – A document in which the candidate explains the reasons for wanting to pursue doctoral studies, their interest in the respective field, and long-term professional objectives.
8. **Research plan/project** – A description of the research topic that the candidate intends to address during the doctoral studies.
9. **Recommendations** – Letters of recommendation from professors or professionals in the field who can attest to the candidate's ability to pursue an advanced study program.
10. **Proof of language proficiency** – Certificate attesting to proficiency in the language of the study program, if applicable.

11. **Legally certified translations** – In case the original documents are not in Romanian or in an international language of circulation, they must be accompanied by legally certified translations.
12. **Any other documents specified by the institution** – These may include specific application forms, portfolio of works (for creative fields), etc.

Note: The study documents will be apostilled/superlegalized in accordance with the provisions of the legislation of the issuing state and of the Republic of Moldova, and translated into Romanian or into an international language of circulation; It is important that all documents be prepared according to the instructions and sent in the requested format (in this case, scanned color copies by email) during the mentioned period. Careful verification of the specific requirements of the program and institution is essential to ensure a complete and correct application.

FACULTY OF BIOLOGY AND GEOSCIENCES

Description: The Faculty of Biology and Geosciences was founded in 1946, simultaneously with the Moldova State University.

Description

The Faculty of Mathematics and Informatics started its activity in 1946, when the Moldova State University was founded. Thanks to such collaborations, the graduates of the Faculty of Mathematics and Informatics currently have one of the highest employment rates both in prestigious domestic institutions and abroad. The faculty coordinates the activity of the “Support center for visually impaired students”.
