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MYTH, NARRATIVE, AND STORYRTELLING SFAI SUMMER ARTS JUST FOR KIDS!!

From June through August the Santa Fe Art Institute offers intensive art workshops – just for kids! Each workshop will explore the incredible worlds of myth, narrative, and storytelling in a different way. The students will build confidence in their art skills, and be challenged to think critically and creatively. All workshops are very affordable - sliding fee scale, and scholarships available.

SLAM!! combining spoken word and performance taught by the Santa Fe Womens Slam Collective June 5-20, Monday and Tuesday, 10am-2pm

In this six day intensive workshop the Santa Fe Womens Slam Collective will work with students to cultivate their unique spoken and written voices, and bring these voices into a collaborative theatrical performance. Oral storytelling has been a part of life for thousands of years, and slam poetry is our generations most powerful form of this ancient art. This workshop will culminate in a public performance on June 24 at a local venue.

COMICS! storytelling, frame by frame taught by Enrique Martinez and the Baadassss Comics Collective June 5-16, Monday - Friday, 10am-2pm

This workshop will explore the many aspects of comics, from scriptwriting and storytelling, to layouts, panel placement and fluidity, to drawing and inking panels, as well as touching on the history and theory of comics, and the roles that comics play in our lives. Each student will finish the workshop with their very own comic book, as well as a deeper understanding of themselves in relation to the world around them.

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Place Explorers, a pop-up bookmaking workshop taught by Sally Blakemore June 26 - July 7, Monday-Friday, 10am - 2pm

To begin, each student will cull a story from thier own experience of voyage, travel, and home. They will then turn this story into a full color pop-up book using a variety of drawing, inking, paper folding, and bookbinding techniques. This workshop promises to be a delightful adventure into making two dimensional images come alive!

Mythological Montage, a multimedia collage and writing workshop taught by Gretchen Reynolds and Johanna Kohout July 10 - 21, Monday - Friday, 10 am-2pm

In the first week of this two week workshop, writer Gretchen Reynolds will lead the students through an exploration of mythology, from Athena to Superman. Each student will write thier own myth, focusing on character developement. The second week, taught by visual artist Johanna Kohout, will turn the students into the central characters of thier mythologies. The students will photograph one another in character, and then work into their photographs with paints and collage materials. Through this workshop each student will learn the foundations of mythology, how to use visual arts to tell a story, and how to transform everyday life into a mythological adventure!
