Where Did All the Animals Go?

When the weather gets too cold, some animals hibernate. Other animals migrate. Sort the animals you drew to show which animals hibernate and which migrate.

Where Did All the Animals Go?

Hibernation is defined as a period that an animal or plant spends in a dormant state, usually in the winter. Migration is a seasonal movement of animals from one area to another. Explore hibernation and migration with the Where Did All the Animals Go? sorting activity.

- Provide your students with the downloadable Where Did All the Animals Go? worksheets along with markers and crayons. If needed, precut the first worksheet for students.
- 2 Read aloud the animals featured in the activity and display images of the animals for students to see.
- Ask students to draw pictures of the animals named in each box. Students can also find pictures online of each animal to print out, cut, and paste.
- 4 Have students cut up the boxes and sort the animals under the category they think it belongs under.
- Invite students to explain why they sorted the animals in the way they did. Call attention to similarities and differences in their reasoning. At the end of the discussion, show which animals hibernate and which animals migrate.
