**TITLE** (80 characters maximum)

- Please use a concise, yet informative title including the procedure(s) name
- Please avoid abbreviations

**AUTHOR(S)**

- Enter in order of contribution according to authorship guidelines
- Please list affiliations where the work was performed and author's' current affiliation
- Please clearly delineate the corresponding author and current affiliation and address

**ABSTRACT** (250-word maximum)

- The abstract should focus on the technique itself
- It must include a statement about the purpose of the technique
- Enter abstract here with the following headings:
  - Procedure
  - Introduction
  - Indications/Contraindications
  - Materials and Methods
  - Results
  - Conclusion

**KEYWORDS**

- Enter up to 6 keywords according to Medical Subject Headings (MeSH)

**INTRODUCTION** (400 words maximum)

Enter introduction to technique and clearly and concisely state:

- Purpose of this technique
- Proper patient/case selection (indications)
- Contraindications (absolute and relative)
- Advantages and disadvantages over alternative techniques (please include potential references to relevant articles)
- Complications and risks
- Please define acronyms/abbreviations upon first use in the main text
- Please make sure to use complete sentences and paragraph form

**MATERIALS AND METHODS** (800-1500 words)

- Should include the following
  - Instrumentation (please include device company and model number, if available)
  - Setup
  - Preoperative workup
  - Anatomy and landmarks with figures as needed
  - Detailed steps to procedure (including references to which steps are shown in the video and those that are not included)
- Please define acronyms/abbreviations upon first use in the main text
- Please make sure to use complete sentences and paragraph form

**RESULTS** (500-word maximum)

- Please provide a concise, written description of a representative outcome following the use of this technique, so that a viewer will have a sense of a “positive” and/or “negative” result
- May include pictures as indicated

**FIGURES AND TABLES AND VIDEO****FIGURES**

- Preferred file types .png, .jpg, and .gif
- Under 5MB per file

**TABLES**

- All tables should be provided as individual .xls or .xlsx files

**VIDEO**

- All videos should be provided via a dropbox, GoogleDrive, or other fileshare location accessible to editor@csurgeries.com
- Preferred file types are .mp4 and .mpeg

Discuss how technique is novel and advantageous over existing techniques. Please clearly discuss the:

- Critical steps of the procedure
- Common modifications
- Common pitfalls
- Troubleshooting of the technique(s)
- Limitations of the technique
- Potential further applications of the technique(s)
- Please define acronyms/abbreviations upon first use in the main text
- Please make sure to use complete sentences and paragraph form
