WHAT IS IT?

The show, simply put, is a celebration of the golden age of the hi-fi and beyond!

The music itself goes by a lot of names: Lounge, Space Age Bachelor Pad Music, Rat Pack, easy listening, orchestrated pop, cocktail music, exotica, and many others. It's basically popular American music from the middle part of the 20th century.

The show covers roughly the years from 1955 to 1965; after the end of the Big Band Era and before the dominance of Rock and Roll.

Each hour-long show will be a mix of vocal and instrumental music and is focused around a theme.

The hi-fi era was a time when changes in recording technology and commercially available home systems made for more dynamic music production and listening. It created a culture where the record-buying public prided themselves on their hi-fi systems and searched out the records that would best show them off.

Record producers, for their part, took advantage of the better fidelity to create a genre

that sounded cleaner, crisper, fresher, and more playful than in the past. This lead to a burst of creativity that still makes for exciting listening today.

But it doesn't stop there. Starting in the 1990s, there was something called The Lounge Revival, where a new generation of musicians rediscovered this classic hi-fi music. They started to record their own versions of the standards as well as create their own vintage-influenced music, which continues through today.

WHY SHOULD YOU AIR IT?

- The Atomic Age Cocktail Party has already proved itself a hit on WILL-FM, being one the most-streamed shows on their website.
- The show is an easy fit with other jazz programming. The core of the show's music is from the Great American Songbook, Broadway musicals, classic movies, and other familiar standards.
