RULES OF THE ROAD:

- **Entry Fee - \$100 per man**
- **We play "desert golf" which means that anything in the desert or "transition" areas is playable; however, if the ball is lost or if the player prefers, he may take a drop on the closest grass area opposite where his ball lies, no closer to the hole, with a one shot penalty.**
- **We play the 56 club rule...no borrowing clubs outside your foursome!!**
- **DO NOT drive carts into the ecologically-sensitive desert areas. Remember, Cholla and critters without shoulders live there!!!**
- **Putts inside the leather are good, but long putters and wild-ass imaginations are excluded.**
- **Tee times and din din reservations are hard numbers...be there! Shop another day.**
- **Be mindful of the format of each round. If you are out of the hole, pick it up. Continuing play will embarrass our hosts and, more importantly, will slice into good sippin' time...don't do it!**

Subject: PROPOSED NEW GOLF RULES - BEING CONSIDERED FOR FUTURE PLAY

Rule 1.a.5 A ball sliced or hooked into the rough shall be lifted and placed on the fairway at a point equal to the distance it carried or rolled into the rough with no penalty. The player should not be penalized for tall grass which grounds keepers failed to mow.

Rule 2.d.6 (b) A ball hitting a tree shall be deemed not to have hit the tree. This is simply bad luck and luck has no place in a scientific game. The player must estimate the distance the ball would have traveled if it had not hit the tree and play the ball from there.

Rule 3.b.3 (g) There shall be no such thing as a lost ball. The missing ball is on or near the course and will eventually be found and pocketed by someone else, making it a stolen ball. The player is not to compound the felony by charging himself or herself with a penalty.

Rule 4.c.7 (h) If a putt passes over a hole without dropping, it is deemed to have dropped. The law of gravity supersedes the Rules of Golf.

Rule 5.d.3 (c) Putts that stop close enough to the cup that they could be blown in, may be blown in. This does not apply to balls more than three inches from the hole. No one wants to make a travesty of the game.

Rule 6.a.9 (k) There is no penalty for so-called "out of bounds." If golf course owners bought sufficient land, this would not occur.

Rule 7.g.15 (z) There is no penalty for a ball in a water hazard, as golf balls should float. Golfers should not be penalized for manufacturers' shortcomings.

Rule 8.k.9 (s) Advertisements claim that golf scores can be improved by purchasing new golf equipment. Since this is financially impractical for many golfers (or stubborn / traditional ones like GJA), one-half stroke per hole may be subtracted for using old equipment.

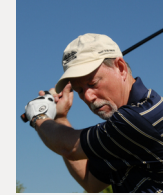
STEPHEN DERNICK

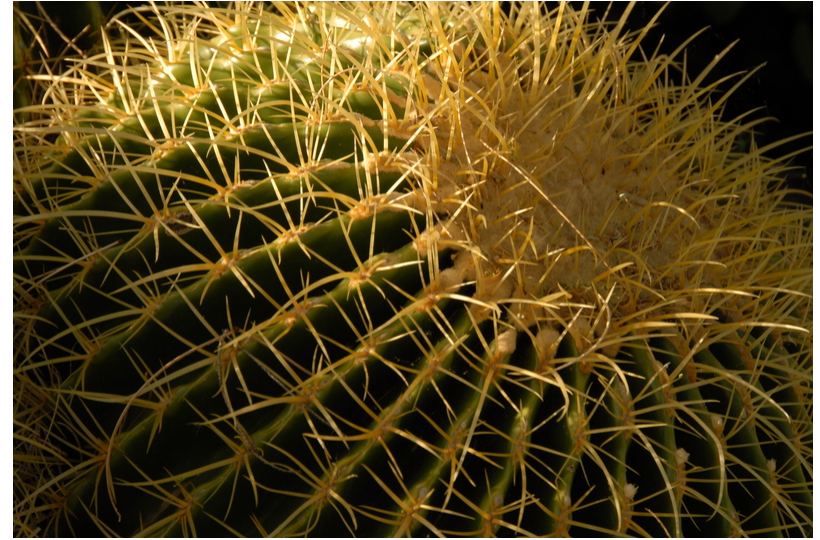

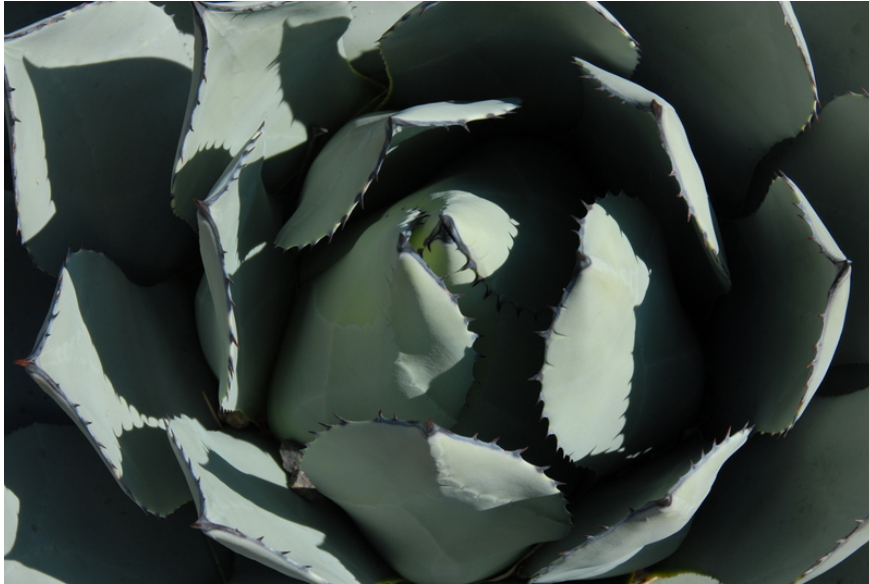

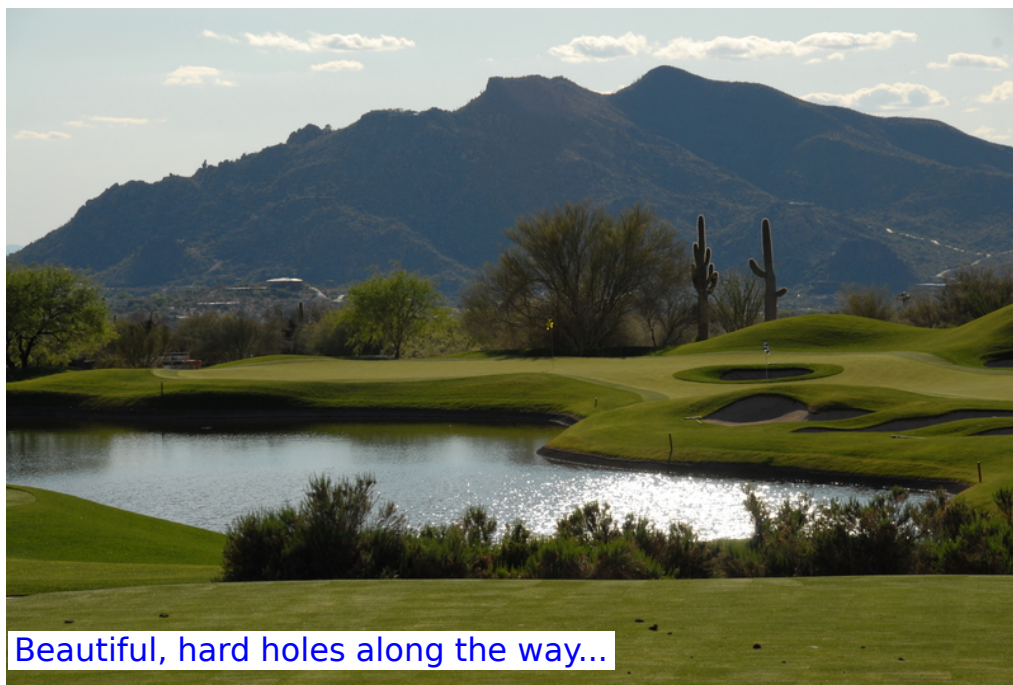
