In July 2025, the New Orleans Police Department investigated a total of 1,120 uniform crimes across the city. Of these, 100 incidents were reported in the 3rd Police District, including thirteen (13) that occurred within the Lakeview Crime Prevention District.

Nonviolent property crimes continue to represent a significant portion of criminal activity within the Lakeview area. In 2024, offenses such as auto burglaries and theft comprised 63.3% of all property crimes investigated in Lakeview. As of the current year, these offenses now account for 37.5% of all reported Lakeview crimes, indicating an ongoing but slightly declining trend.

Data indicates that suspects often target vehicles due to ease of access. In many cases, vehicles were found to be unlocked at the time of the offense, making them particularly vulnerable. Moreover, several auto thefts involved perpetrators obtaining access to the vehicle using keys or key fobs left inside the vehicle or within adjacent, unsecured vehicles parked nearby.

This pattern highlights the continued need for preventive measures, including public awareness campaigns and targeted enforcement, to reduce opportunities for property-related offenses in the area.



AUTO BURGLARY INVESTIGATIONS


Property Crimes Incident Summary

The New Orleans Police Department investigated one (01) auto burglary incident in Lakeview during the report month whereby two unlocked vehicles were targeted.

On July 15, 2025, officers responded to an auto burglary complaint in the 800 block of Louque Street. A black 2021 Ford Explorer and a 2021 Mazdan were left unsecured overnight, had been burglarized. A pair of handcuffs was stolen from the Explorer. The Mazda was entered and searched, but no items were reported missing.

Residents are reminded to always secure their vehicles and remove valuables to help deter opportunistic thefts.

As of July 31, 2025, a total of **11 auto burglary incidents** have been reported in the Lakeview area. This reflects a **69% decrease** in auto burglaries compared to the same period in 2024. Most notably, five (5) cases this current year **have been cleared by arrest.**



The reduction in auto burglaries can be attributed to targeted patrols, investigative follow-ups, and increased community vigilance. Residents are encouraged to continue securing their vehicles and report suspicious activity by dialing 911.

The New Orleans Police Department investigated one hundred and thirty-seven (137) auto burglary incidents citywide during the report month. Ten (10) incidents occurred in the 3rd District; one (01) incident occurred in Lakeview. Auto Burglary accounts for 15.3% of the crimes investigated in Lakeview year to date.









AUTO THEFT INVESTIGATIONS

Property Crimes Incident Summary


The New Orleans Police Department investigated four (04) auto theft incidents in Lakeview during the report month.

On July 4, 2025, a red 2022 Chevrolet C-1500 Silverado (LA Plate Z382003) was stolen overnight from the 6400 block of Louis XIV Street. No signs of forced entry was observed on scene. On July 11, 2025, the vehicle was located at Stone Bridge Apartments (3300 Wall Blvd), where it had been towed for a handicap parking violation and relocated to 1915 Canal Street. On July 21, 2025, a 1st District Officer recovered the vehicle in good condition and notified the registered owner.

On **July 9, 2025**, a black 2016 Cadillac Escalade (LA Plate XOF246) was stolen overnight from the 5900 block of Argonne Boulevard. On July 16, 2025, 5th District Officers located the vehicle unoccupied in the 2800 block of North Dorgenois Street. The vehicle was processed for evidence and recovered.

On **July 31, 2025** – Two auto thefts were reported in the early morning hours.

At approximately 2:30 a.m., a blue 2019 Kia



Soul (LA Plate 458GLJ) was stolen from the 6100 block of Bellaire Drive.

At approximately 3:00 a.m., a white 2022 GMC Sierra (LA Plate Z258400) was stolen from the 6400 block of Louisville Street. No broken glass or signs of forced entry was observed on either scene.

Follow-up investigations are ongoing and may lead to future arrests. Residents are encouraged to remain vigilant and report suspicious activity at all times.

The New Orleans Police Department investigated two hundred and sixty-six (266) auto theft incidents citywide during the report month. Thirty (30) incidents occurred in the 3rd District; four (04) incident occurred in Lakeview. Two stolen vehicles were recovered.

Auto Theft accounts for 22.2% of the crimes investigated in Lakeview year to date.










SHOPLIFTING INVESTIGATIONS

Property Crimes Incident Summary

The New Orleans Police Department investigated a series of shopliftings incidents in Lakeview between July 14 and July 27, 2025:

- Monday, July 14, 2025 An unknown white male entered the Walgreens at 760 Harrison Avenue, concealed multiple bottles of alcohol in a backpack, and exited the store without paying for the merchandise.
- Thursday, July 17, 2025 Two unidentified males entered the Dollar Tree at 5201 Canal Boulevard, filled bags with merchandise, and exited the store without rendering payment.
- Tuesday, July 22, 2025 A lone unidentified male entered the same Dollar Tree location, loaded items into a shopping cart, rolled past all points of sale and failed to pay for the items.
- Wednesday, July 23, 2025 An unknown individual entered the Rajun Cajun Deli at 5151 Canal Boulevard, removed a cold beer from the cooler, and exited the premises without payment.
- Saturday, July 27, 2025 A group of four individuals entered the Dollar Tree at 5201 Canal Boulevard. The suspects filled laundry baskets, tote bins, and book bags with school supplies, then fled the location without paying for the supplies.



All incidents are under active investigation. Surveillance footage has been recovered and is being reviewed.

LCPD has modified **Zone I** patrols in response to the spike in shoplifting incidents. Officers will initiate more **boots-on-the-ground business checks** to enhance police visibility, deter thefts, and discourage nefarious activity.

The New Orleans Police Department investigated one hundred and seventy (170) shop-lifting incidents citywide during the report month. Eighteen (18) incidents occurred in the 3rd District; Five (05) incident occurred in Lakeview. Shoplifting accounts for 15.3% of the crimes investigated in Lakeview year to date.









THEFT INVESTIGATIONS

Property Crimes Incident Summary

The New Orleans Police Department investigated three (03) theft incidents in Lakeview during the report month.


On July 21, 2025 at approximately 6:22 a.m., two unknown individuals broke into an outdoor cash vending machine at the Soft Touch Car Wash located at 5270 Canal Boulevard, and stole between \$500 and \$1,000 in cash.

On July 22, 2025 at 9:07 p.m., four unidentified subjects entered the front yard of a residence in the 6700 block of Wuerpel Street and stole the victim's rescue dog from the front porch.

On July 30, 2025 at around 5:30 a.m., a resident of a group home in the 5600 block of Rosemary Place reported a Bible stolen from her nightstand.

All incidents are under investigation.

Year to date, the New Orleans Police Department has investigated 19 theft incidents in the Lakeview area, compared to 10 incidents during the same period in 2024, representing a 90% increase.



Of the 19 thefts reported in 2025:

- 5 involved unsecured bicycles, accounting for 26% of the total.
- **4 involved stolen packages** taken from front porches, representing **21%** of the total.
- 5 cases have been cleared by arrest.

Residents are strongly encouraged to secure all personal property, especially bicycles, when left outside. Additionally, citizens should consider coordinating with delivery services to ensure packages are placed in secure locations to prevent these types of thefts.

The New Orleans Police Department investigated two hundred and fifty-six (256) theft incidents citywide during the report month. Seventeen (17) incidents occurred in the 3rd District; three (03) incident occurred in Lakeview. Theft accounts for 26.4% of the crimes investigated in Lakeview year to date.



Lakeview 2025 Year to Date Incident Summary

Year to date, NOPD investigated a total of seventy-two (72) UCR incidents in the Lakeview area. Overall, 26 of the 72 cases were solved, resulting in a 36%.

Theft-related offenses continue to dominate criminal activity in Lakeview, with general thefts and auto-related crimes comprising a majority of reported incidents. Proactive community engagement and enforcement focused on property crime deterrence will be critical moving forward.



While the bulk of these offenses are non-violent, their impact on residents' sense of security is real. These numbers serve as a reminder for all Lakeview citizens to **stay** alert, secure personal belongings, and report suspicious behavior. Continued collaboration between police and the community remains vital in deterring criminal activity and maintaining public safety.

Lakeview 2025 Year to Date Case Clearance Summary

PROPERTY CRIME INVESTIGATIONS

The **Third District Property Crimes Unit** has successfully closed **22 of the 66 reported property crimes** in the Lakeview area year to date, achieving a **clearance rate of approximately 36%**. This figure stands **notably higher than the 2024 national average property crime clearance rate of approximately 14%** (FBI Uniform Crime Reporting Program) which is **OUTSTANDING!**.

This elevated clearance rate reflects the unit's sustained commitment to investigative follow-through, collaborative policing, and case resolution. It also highlights the importance of community engagement in helping bring offenders to justice. As property crimes remain a concern in urban neighborhoods nationwide, Lakeview's results serve as a strong example of proactive enforcement and effective case management.

PERSONS CRIME INVESTIGATIONS

The New Orleans Police Department has investigated six (6) Lakeview Crimes Against Persons year to date. Of these, four cases were successfully investigated and cleared by the Third District Persons Crimes Unit, resulting in a 100% clearance rate for the cases assigned to them. The remaining two cases—both involving rape investigations with known perpetrators—are currently under active investigation by the department's Special Victims Unit (SVU).

This performance significantly exceeds the **2024 national average clearance rate for violent crimes,** which stands at approximately **41.6%** (according to FBI UCR data). The Third District's clearance rate reflects a high level of investigative diligence and commitment to victim advocacy and justice.

Crimes Against Persons currently represent 8.3% of all criminal incidents investigated in Lakeview in 2025, underscoring the importance of continued attention and specialized response to violent offenses, even amid a majority of property-related activity.







Lakeview Priority Call Police Response Times

HOLDING TIME— Represents the time the Orleans Parish Communication District call taker / operator receives the complaint information for dispatch, to the time the actual complaint is assigned to a patrol unit in the field.

ENROUTE TIME—The time the officer is assigned the call from the dispatcher, to time of arrival.

During the reporting month, Lakeview Crime Prevention District (LCPD) Officers were the **first to arrive on scene** for **39 out of 65** priority calls for service dispatched within the Lakeview area—demonstrating proactive patrol coverage and rapid deployment.

- Average LCPD Response Time: 6 minutes, 40 seconds
- Average Enroute Time (from dispatch to arrival): 4 minutes, 25 seconds
- Average Holding Time (Orleans Parish Communication District time from call receipt to dispatch): approximately 2 minute, 15 seconds

These metrics reflect the district's ongoing commitment to swift and efficient emergency response.





Third District Officers and other support units were the first to arrive on scene in 26 of the 65 dispatched priority calls for service in the Lakeview area during the report month and provided an average response time of 14 minutes and 03 seconds.





Lakeview Crime Report Summary

In July of 2025, the New Orleans Police Department investigated 1,120 UCR incidents citywide. The 3rd Police District investigated 100 crimes. Thirteen (13) third district incidents occurred in the Lakeview Area. Lakeview **crime** is **down 27%** compared to the same period in 2024—reflecting a significant and encouraging decline in reported criminal activity.



- **Electronics** Phones, laptops, GPS units, earbuds

- Tools & Work Equipment Especially from trucks and vans
- **Packages & Shopping Bags** Seen as low-risk, high-reward items

Community Crime Prevention Strategies



Home Safety

- Lock doors and windows even when you're home.
- Use security cameras or motion-sensor lights to deter trespassers.

Neighborhood Watch & Communication

- Join or create a neighborhood watch group to foster communication.
- Get to know your neighbors so everyone looks out for one another.

Report suspicious activity immediately to law enforcement.

Personal Safety

- **Stay alert in public spaces**—avoid distractions like looking down at your phone.
- Walk in well-lit areas and keep valuables hidden.

Trust your instincts—if a situation feels unsafe, leave immediately.

Cyber & Fraud Protection

- Use strong, unique passwords for online accounts.

Be cautious with online transactions—avoid clicking suspicious links.

Community Engagement

- Advocate for improved street lighting and emergency call boxes in your neighborhood.




New Orleans Police Department Firearm Theft Data



For the year, 224 firearms were reported stolen to the New Orleans Police Department;

- 104 guns were stolen from vehicles around the city. One firearms was reported stolen from a Lakeview vehicle thus far this year.
- 46% of all firearms reported stolen year to date were taken from vehicles.

Over the past thirteen years, 10,337 guns were reported stolen to the New Orleans Police Department. During that period, approximately 5,808 of those firearms were reported stolen from vehicles. Many were used to commit other crimes.






LAKEVIEW 2024 Year End Review Commentary

The Lakeview Crime Prevention District (LCPD) was created in 1998 to help make Lakeview a safer community. For 26 years the Lakeview Community has employed off-duty New Orleans Police Officers to provide supplemental proactive patrols working in Lakeview on an overtime basis under the LCPD umbrella. These proactive patrols were put in place to enhance police visibility, improve police response time, deter crime, and improve quality of life. This continuous police presence in Lakeview neighborhoods has made Lakeview one of the safest communities in the City of New Orleans.

In 2024, Lakeview's crime rate dropped by 18% from the year before, hitting its lowest level in 26 years.

A total of 150 crimes (140 property crimes and 10 person crimes) were investigated in Lakeview in 2024, as opposed to 182 crimes in 2023. Of the offenses investigated in the given year, forty-four (44) were solved, yielding a clearance rate of 29 percent.



LAKEVIEW 2024 Year End Review Commentary -continued-

Auto thefts and auto burglaries accounted for 63% of all crimes in Lakeview in 2024. In the past, criminals have used stolen cars to scout communities for potential targets. Throughout the year, Lakeview patrols proactively carried out authorized traffic stops in order to directly address this property crime concern. In addition, the Third District led all districts in traffic stops with 5,102 stops for the year thanks to this campaign. Lakeview Officers conducted 3,079 of the 5,102 traffic stops in the Third District.



Throughout the year, LCPD officers handled more than 1,300 calls for service in addition to traffic enforcement. 3,175 field interviews were performed by Lakeview officers as part of traffic stops and suspicious person investigations. Seventy-three (73) arrests were made in Lakeview by the end of 2024 for offenses ranging from driving under the influence to auto theft.

The LCPD has the fastest response time for emergency calls for service in 2024. LCPD officers responded to dispatched priority calls for service on average of 6 minutes 07 seconds which is outstanding.

Lakeview Patrols, the NOPD 3rd District Detectives Units, and platoon officers collaboratively engaged in a robust effort to reduce crime in Lakeview by maintaining a strong police presence, invoking constitutional policing, executing professional compliance standards when interacting with the public, and by taking enforcement action when duty required such measures. These officers are committed to delivering a high degree of excellent police service daily and understand the importance of building positive partnerships with community members in the interest of public safety. The mission is to eradicate crime in Lakeview...... because any crime.......is a crime too many.
