International Joint Commission: Public Comment on a Proposal for Lake Ontario and St.

**Lawrence River Regulation** 

The International Joint Commission (IJC) is inviting the public to comment on a proposal for managing

the water levels and flows in Lake Ontario and the St. Lawrence River that will continue to contribute to

the economic health of communities throughout the basin while improving the long-term ecological

health of Lake Ontario and the upper St. Lawrence River.

Since 1960, the IJC has managed the flow of water at the Moses-Saunders hydropower dam, located on

the St Lawrence River between Cornwall, Ontario and Massena, New York. The management of water

flows influences water levels on Lake Ontario and in the St Lawrence River as far downstream as Lake

St. Pierre. Although water levels and flows are primarily determined by precipitation, snowpack and

storms, water flow management has provided substantial benefits to the region. These include reducing

flooding and erosion on the Lake Ontario shoreline, reducing flooding downstream, and providing more

favorable conditions on the lake and river for water intakes, recreational boating, commercial navigation

and hydroelectric power production.

The IJC is proposing to manage water levels with fewer negative environmental impacts on Lake Ontario

and the upper St. Lawrence River. Extensive research shows the policies developed in the 1950s have

restricted water levels to the extent of degrading coastal wetlands on Lake Ontario and the upper St.

Lawrence River. This degradation impacts the health of native plants, birds, fish and other animals. While

continuing to reduce extreme high and low water levels, the water management proposal would allow

more natural water level patterns on Lake Ontario while retaining benefits downstream. This is expected

to improve wetland health on Lake Ontario and the upper St. Lawrence River on a scale larger than any restoration actions taken to date.
