## A. Overview of Information Collection

<u>Title of Information Collection:</u> Public Housing Agency Executive Compensation Information.

OMB Approval Number: 2577-0272.

Type of Request: Reinstatement with change of a previously approved collection.

Form Numbers: HUD-52725.

Description of the need for the information and proposed use: Pursuant to PIH

Notice 2014-01, HUD collects information on the compensation provided by public housing agencies (PHAs) to the top management official, top financial official, and highest compensated employee, similar to the information that non-profit organizations receiving federal tax exemptions are required to report to the IRS annually. Because PHAs receive significant direct federal funds HUD has been collecting compensation information to enhance regulatory oversight by HUD, as well as state and local authorities. HUD provides the information collected to the public. The compensation data collected includes base salary and bonus, and incentive and other compensation, and the extent to which these payments are made with federal funds.

Respondents: Public Housing Agencies.

Estimated Number of Respondents: Approximately 4000.

<u>Estimated Number of Responses</u>: Approximately 4000.

Frequency of Response: Annually.

Average Hours per Response: 30 minutes.

<u>Total Estimated Burdens</u>: The total burden hours is estimated to be 2000 hours annually. The total burden cost is estimated to be \$44,740.

## **Solicitation of Public Comment**

This notice is soliciting comments from members of the public and affected parties concerning the collection of information described in Section A on the following:

- (1) Whether the proposed collection of information is necessary for the proper performance of the functions of the agency, including whether the information will have practical utility;
