Vision

Mission

Dreams vs. Nightmares

- By teaching, leading and living the CHS Vision, Mission and Core Values we will create an experience for our student-athletes that they will dream about for many years.

Academic Eligibility

- Semester:
 - Must be enrolled in and pass a minimum of five classes per semester
- Weekly:
 - Enrolled in 7, must pass 6
 - Enrolled in 6, must pass 5
 - Enrolled in 5, must pass 5

Social Probation

- Treated as academic eligibility
- The following criteria will earn you social probation for one week:
 - 2 or more tardies in 5 school days
 - Do not be late on Wednesdays – automatic social probation
 - 1 or more period or unexcused absence
 - 2 or more discipline referrals
 - 1 or more suspensions

NCAA Eligibility

- Grade 9
 - Start planning now! Take the right courses and earn the best grades you can.
- Grade 10
 - Continue to take the right courses and earn the best grades you can.
- Grade 11
 - Register with the NCAA at eligibilitycenter.org
 - Ask Mr. Woods to upload your unofficial transcript to the Clearinghouse
 - Make sure you are on track to graduate
 - Take the ACT and send scores to the NCAA
- Grade 12
 - Take the ACT again, if necessary
 - Have counselor to mail your final transcript to the NCAA

NCAA Eligibility

- Division I
 - Complete 16 NCAA core courses
 - Suggestion
 - 4 years of English, math, science and social studies
 - Complete 10 core courses, including seven in English, math or science before the start of your 7th semester
 - Earn at least a 2.3/4.0 GPA in your core courses
 - Earn an ACT sum score that matches your core-course GPA on the NCAA sliding scale

NCAA Eligibility

- Division II
 - Entering college before August 2018
 - Complete 16 high school core courses
 - Earn at least a 2.0 GPA in your core courses
 - Earn an ACT sum score of 68
 - Entering college after August 2018
 - Complete 16 high school core courses
 - Earn at least a 2.2 GPA in your core courses
 - Earn an ACT score that matches your core-course GPA on the DII sliding scale
