

Scholarships for the 16th World Congress on Pain

The Pain, Mind and Movement (PMM) SIG is offering one more scholarships of US\$ 1000 to one SIG member to enable attendance at the 16th World Congress on Pain.

Application Deadline: Friday 29 July 2016, 17h00 Central European Time.

Awards available:

One scholarship to the value of US\$ 1000.

The awards must be used towards congress travel, registration, and accommodation expenses.

Eligibility Requirements:

1. Applicants must have submitted a poster abstract to the World Congress before applying for a PMM scholarship.
2. Applicants may not have received a scholarship from the PMM SIG in the last 3 years (2014-2016).
3. Applicants may apply for only one scholarship category (see below).

Successful applicants will be required to:

1. Present a poster at the World Congress;
2. Apply to present at the SIG business meeting at the World Congress;
3. Contribute to the SIG newsletter after the conference.

Scholarship category #1– for clinicians

- The applicant should be a member of the PMM SIG.
- The candidate must spend most of his/her work time as a clinician and be clinically active within the area of pain, the mind, and movement.

Scholarship category #2– for academic trainees (PhD students, postdoctoral researchers)

- The applicant should be a member of the PMM SIG, and less than 35 years old.
- The candidate should spend most of his/her work time in research and be a PhD student or postdoctoral researcher (must provide evidence), and the research topic should relate to pain, the mind, and movement. A postdoctoral researcher is someone who is within 5 full-time equivalent years since completion of PhD.

Applications should include the following: (All applications must be submitted in English)

1. A completed application form (see below).
2. A motivation (max 600 words) stating why the applicant should receive the scholarship. The applicant must state clearly how he/she plans to contribute to spreading the knowledge on pain, mind and movement gained through attending the congress in his/her community in the 6 months following the 16th World Congress on Pain. The motivation should be compatible with the PMM SIG mission statement.
3. The candidate's curriculum vitae (a maximum of 2 pages).
4. Evidence of poster abstract submission, and a copy of the full abstract submitted.
5. For category 1: A list of activities in which the applicant has been involved to spread knowledge of pain, the mind, and movement within his/her community.
6. For category 2: A list of published research papers in the field of pain, mind and movement.
