5. page 12: Who is reading about lions now?

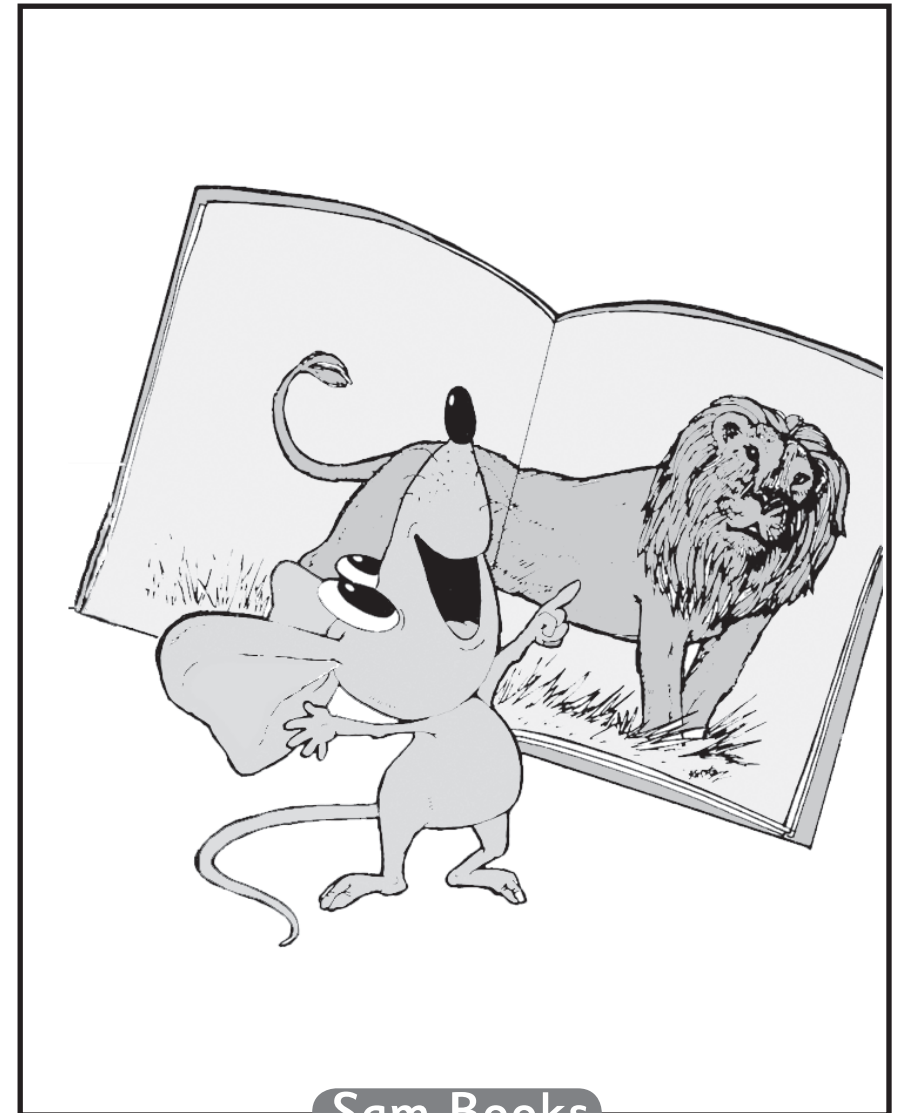
Each new word throughout the program is repeated at least five times in the book in which it first appears and five more times in the next ten books.
