### Plot Summary

One day, Mit, Sam, and Mat decide to play "Cops and Robbers." Mit is the sheriff and Sam and Mat are the bad men. Mit must catch the robbers. Mit tricks them into leaving a trail of muddy footprints and finally captures them.

Each new word throughout the program is repeated at least five times in the book in which it first appears and five more times in the next ten books.

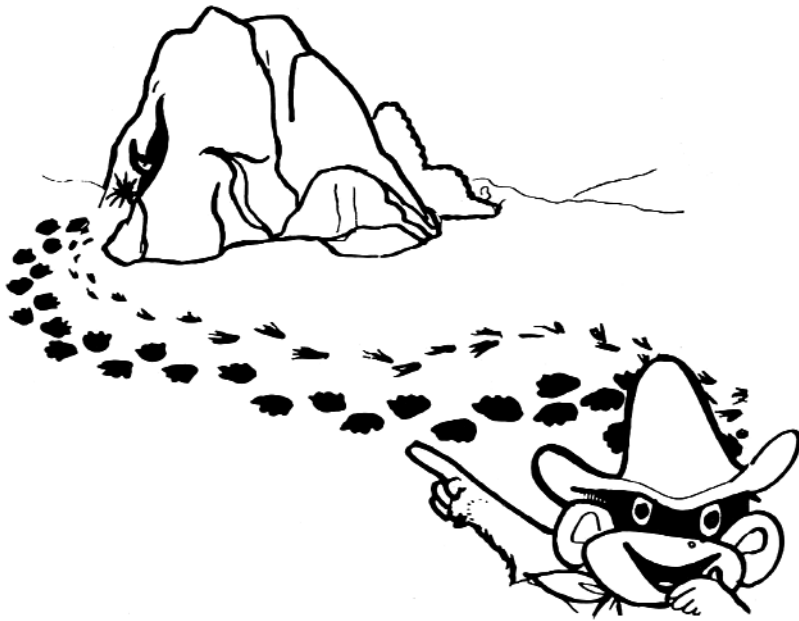

“It will be fun to run with them.”

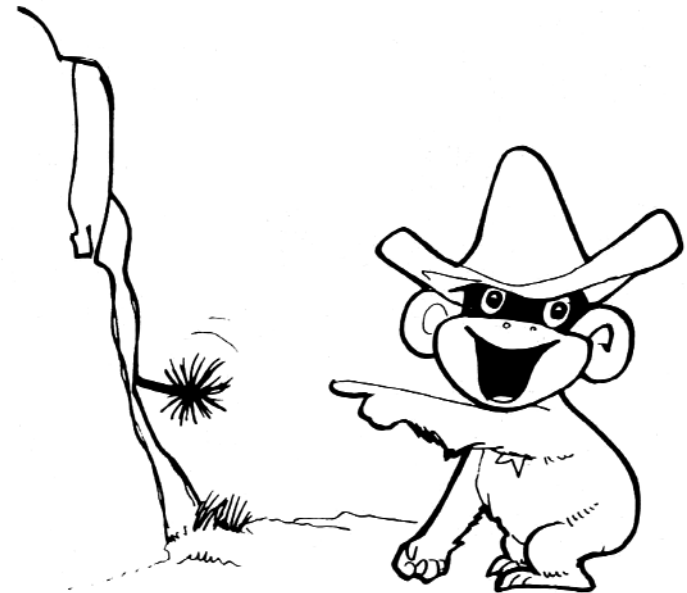


“I see a hat.
