Plot Summary

Story Questions (Comprehension)

1. page 1: What are the animals doing together?
2. page 2-9: What do all of the animals do, except Ann?
3. page 9: How does Ann feel, alone in the boat?
4. page 13: What does the alligator want Ann to do?

Each new word throughout the program is repeated at least five times in the book in which it first appears and five more times in the next ten books.

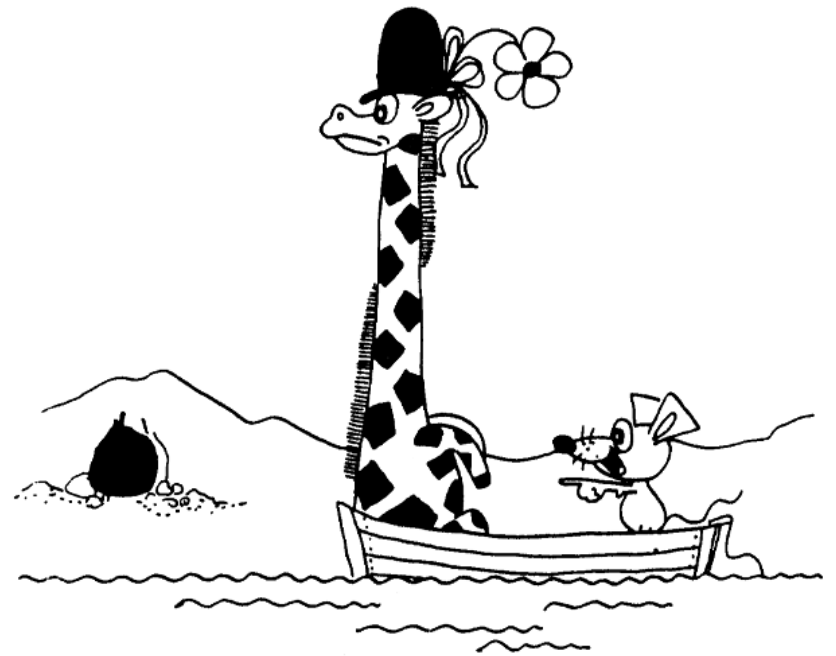

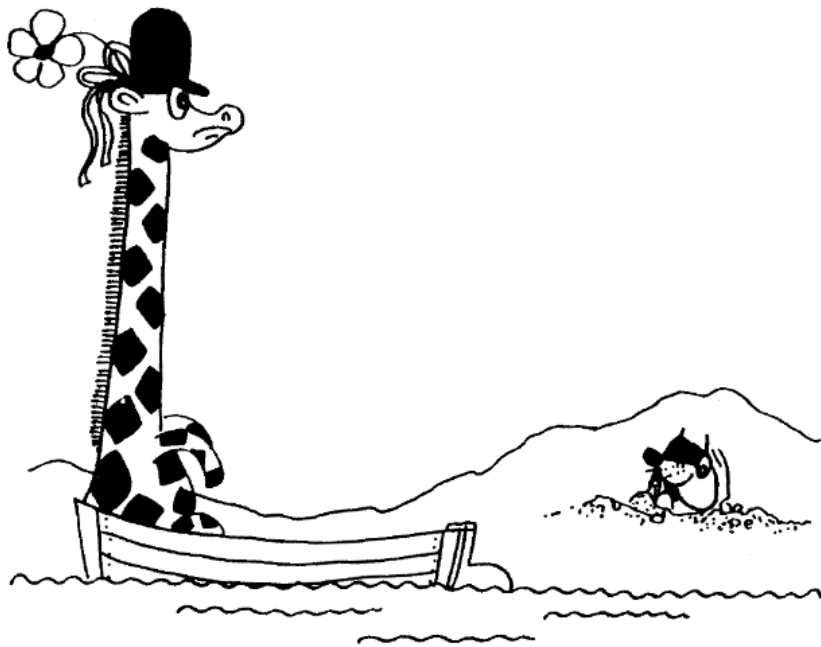

Mit will sit on that.”



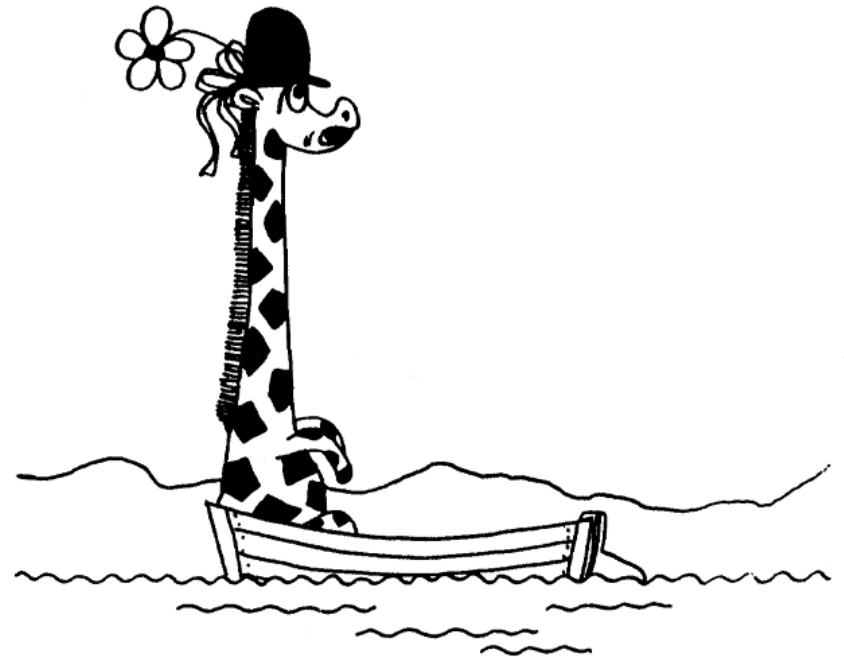
“Sit with me, Mat.”
