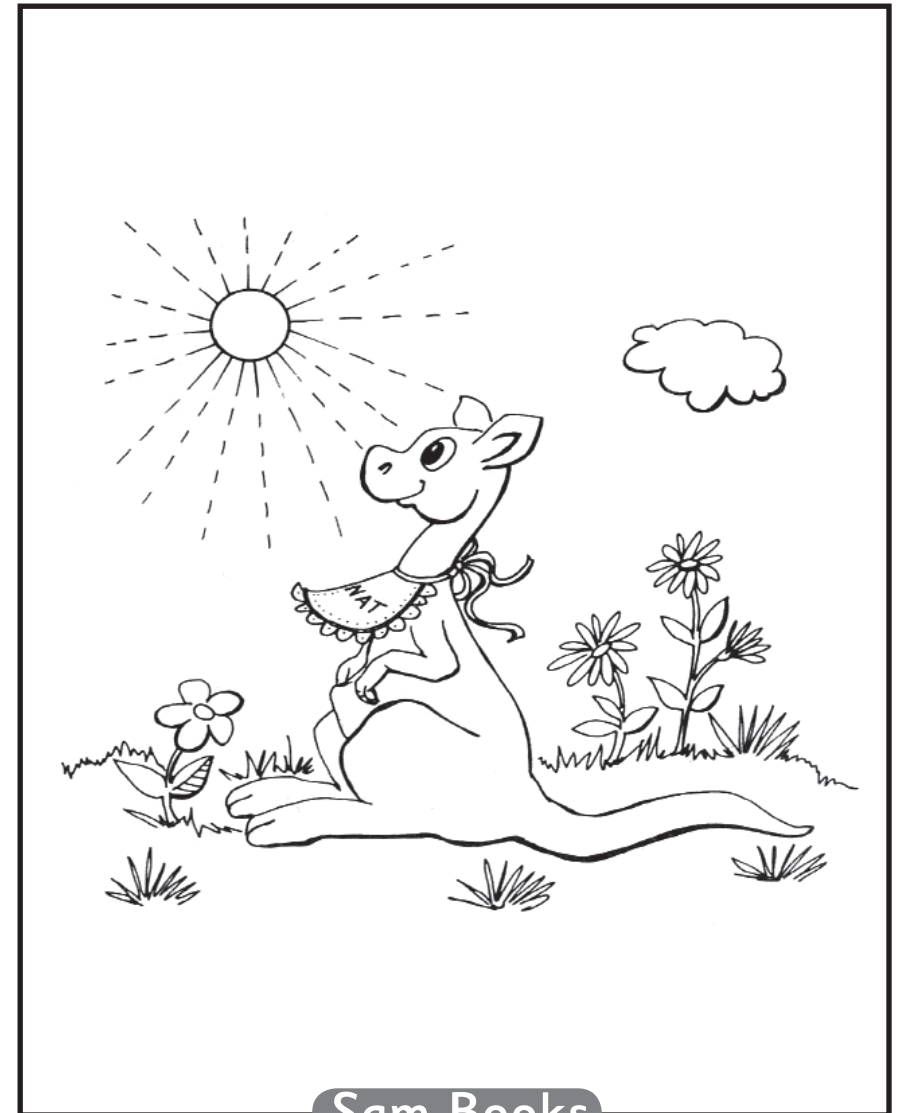
Story Questions (Comprehension)

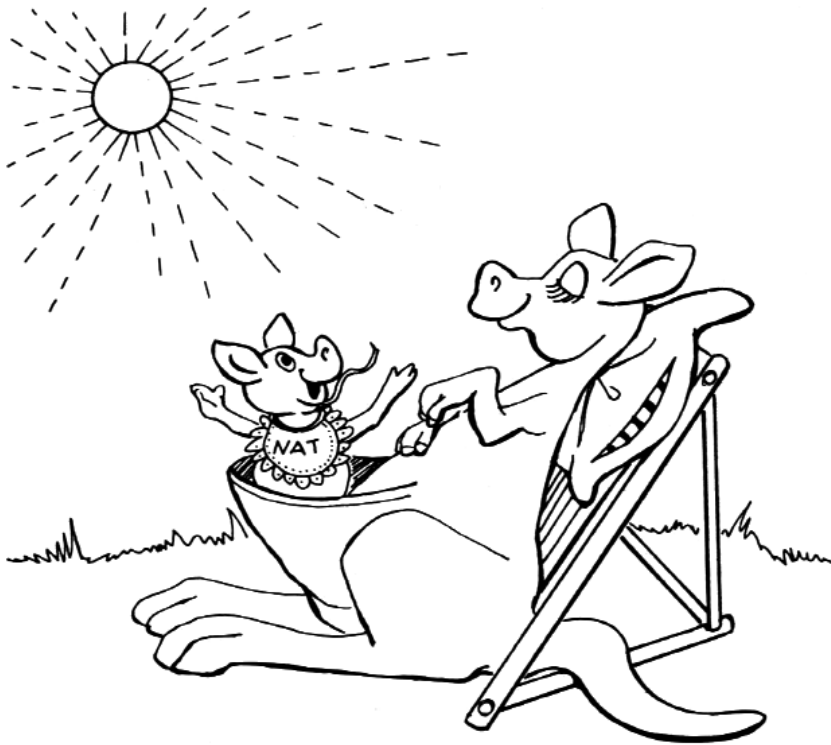
1. page 1: Who is sitting in the sun?

Each new word throughout the program is repeated at least five times in the book in which it first appears and five more times in the next ten books.

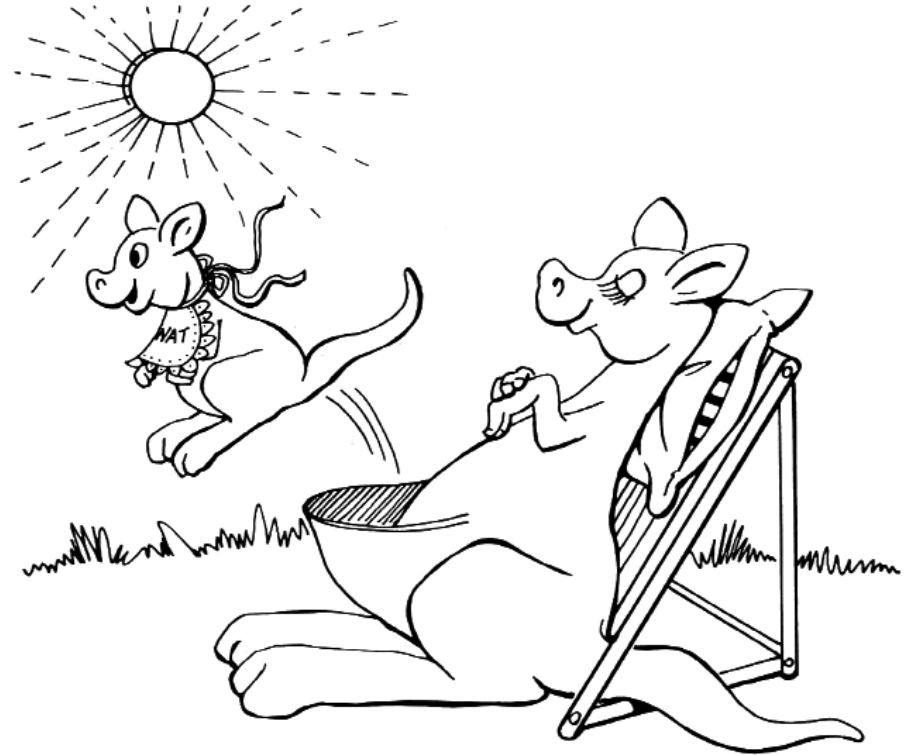

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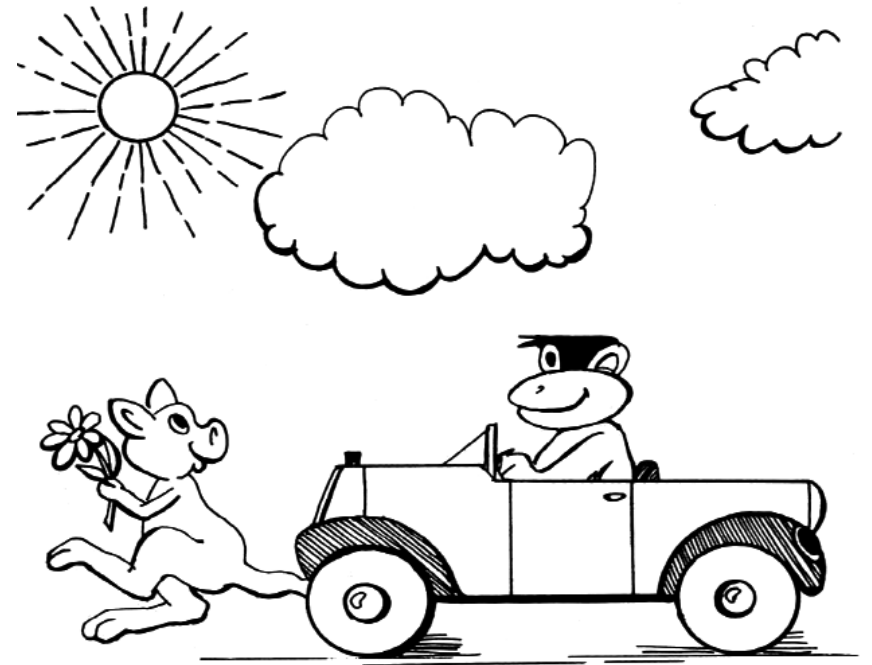

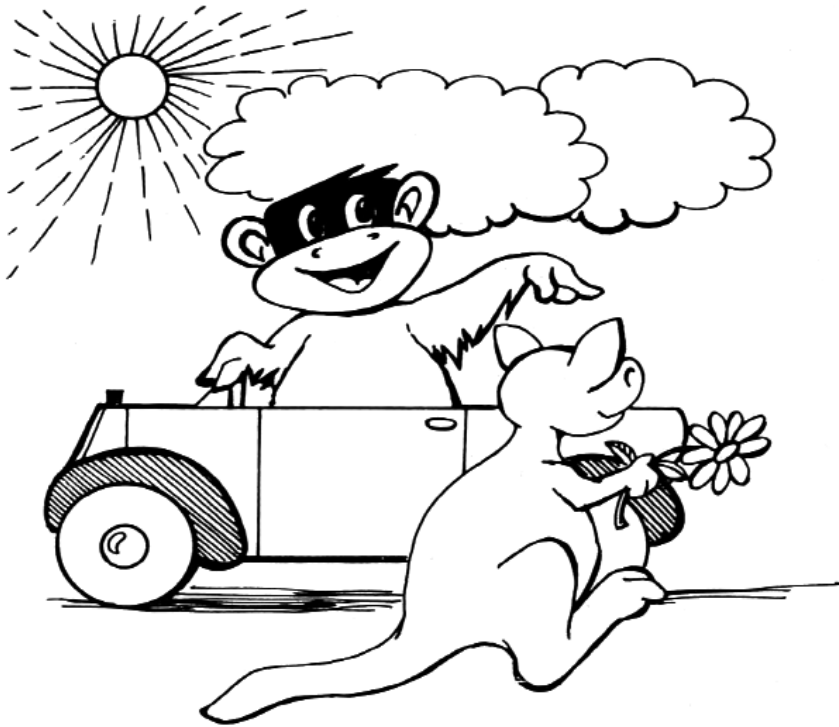

What is that?”



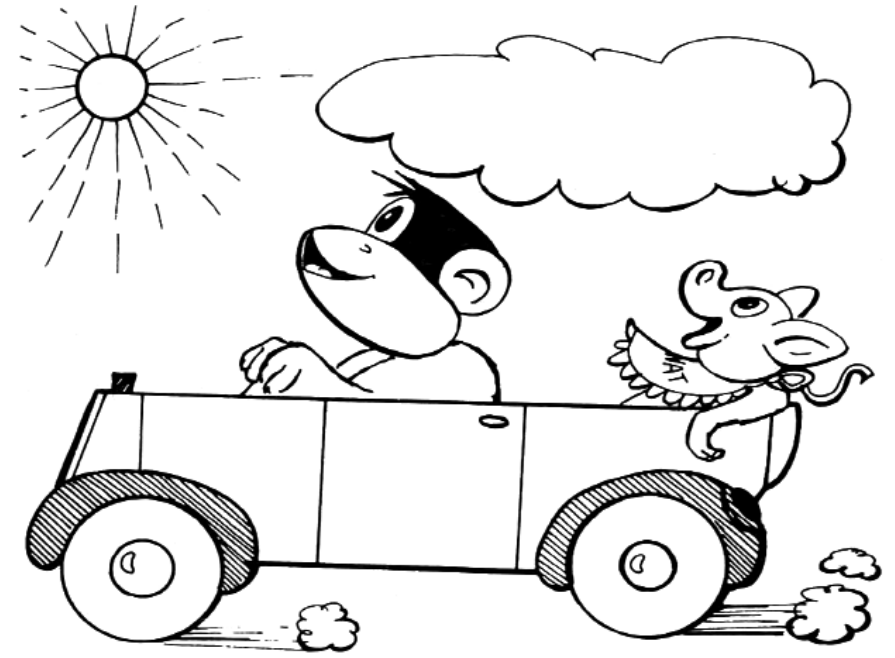
Nat meets Mit.

See them.

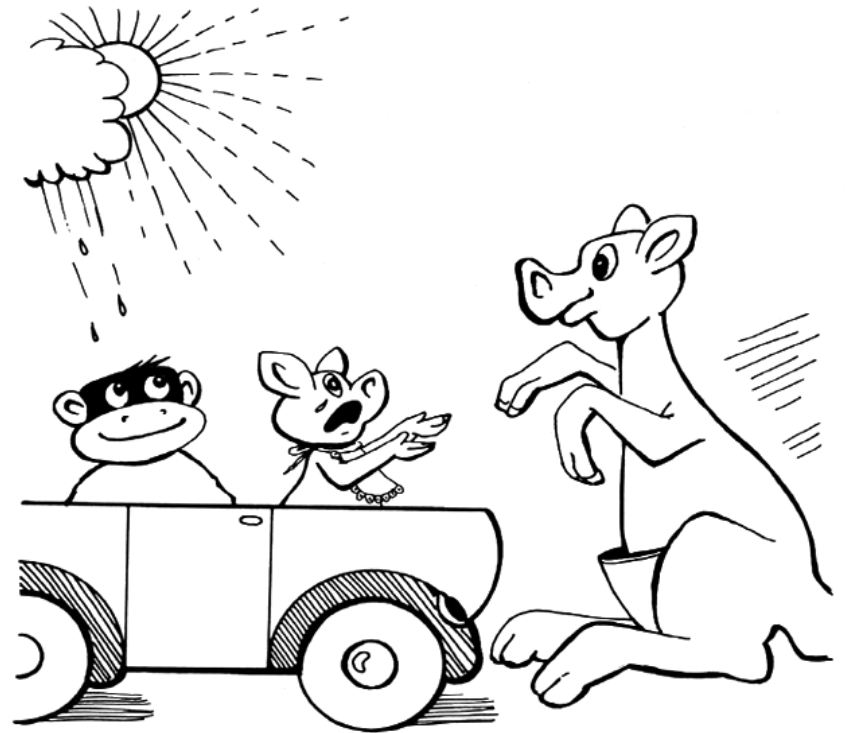
Nat and Mit see them.



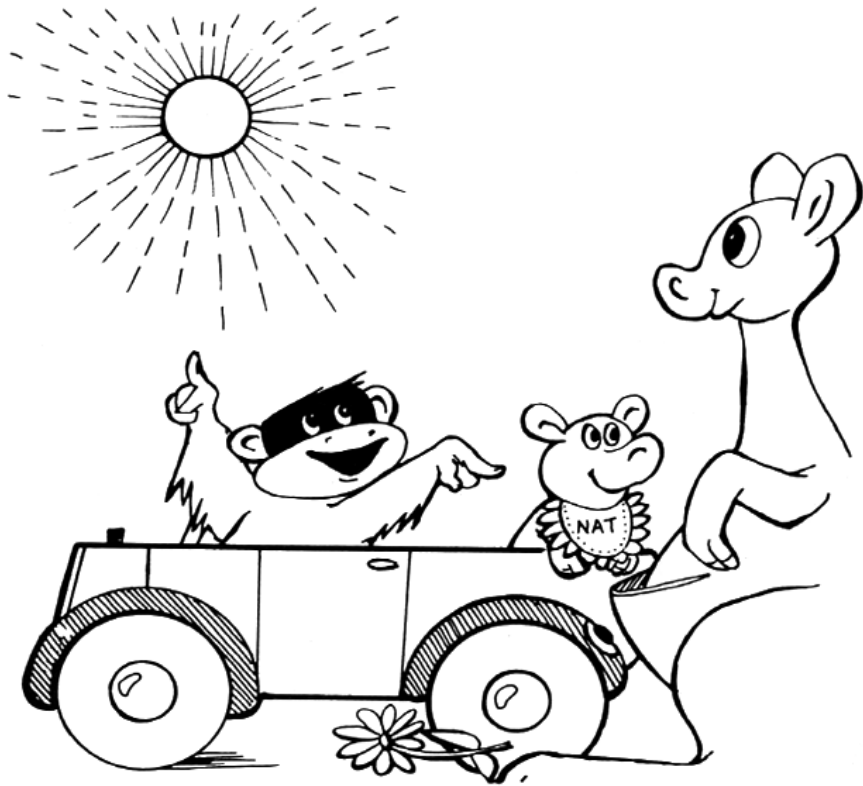
What fell on them?



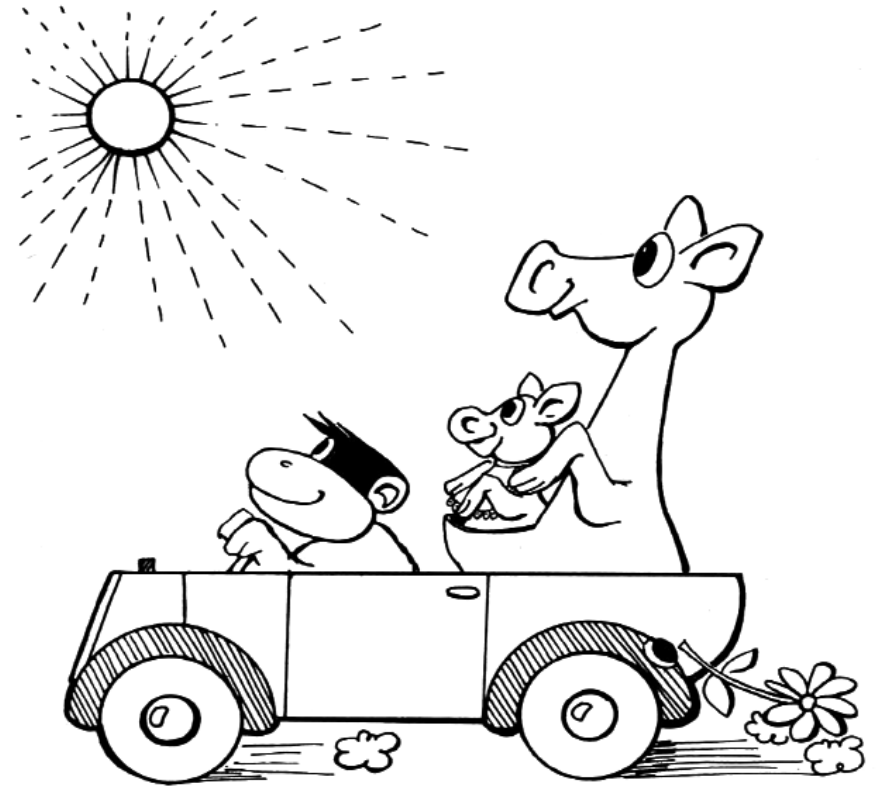
“Nat! Nat!
