5. page 14: Who wins the contest?

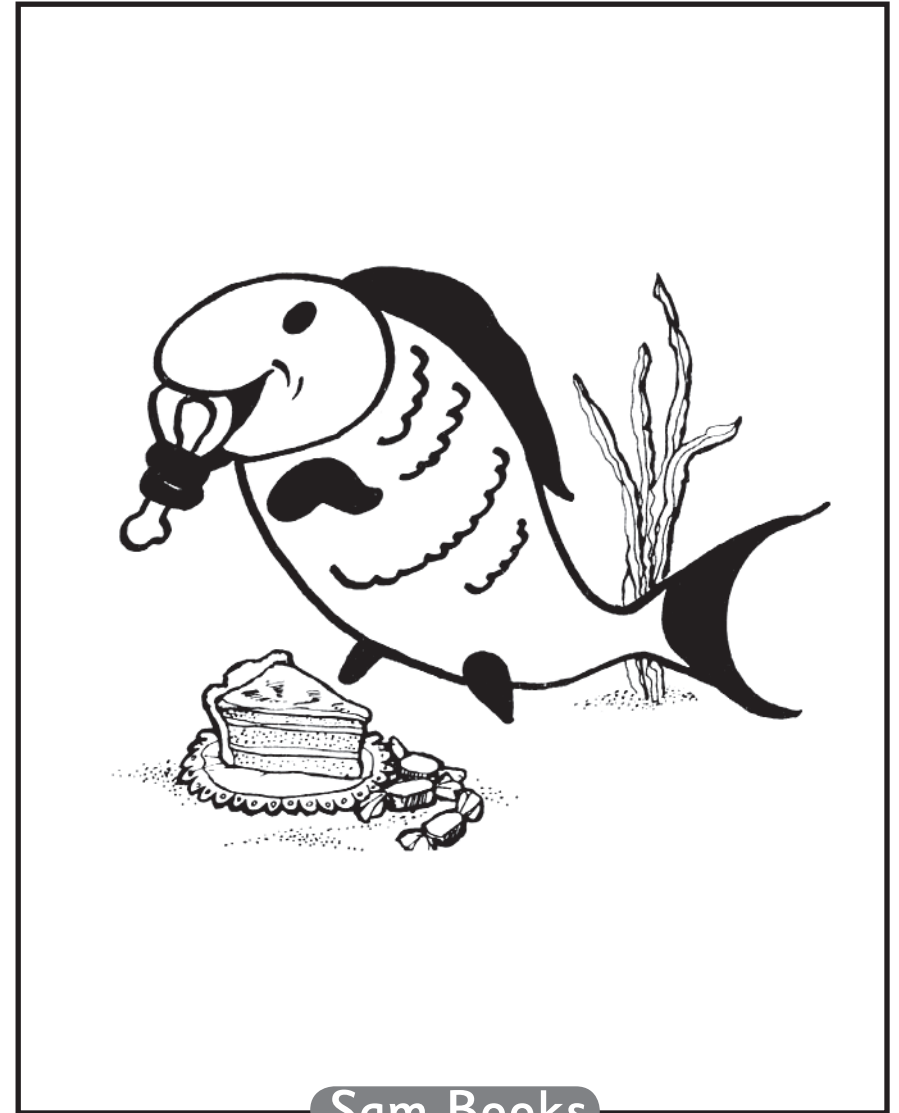
Each new word throughout the program is repeated at least five times in the book in which it first appears and five more times in the next ten books.

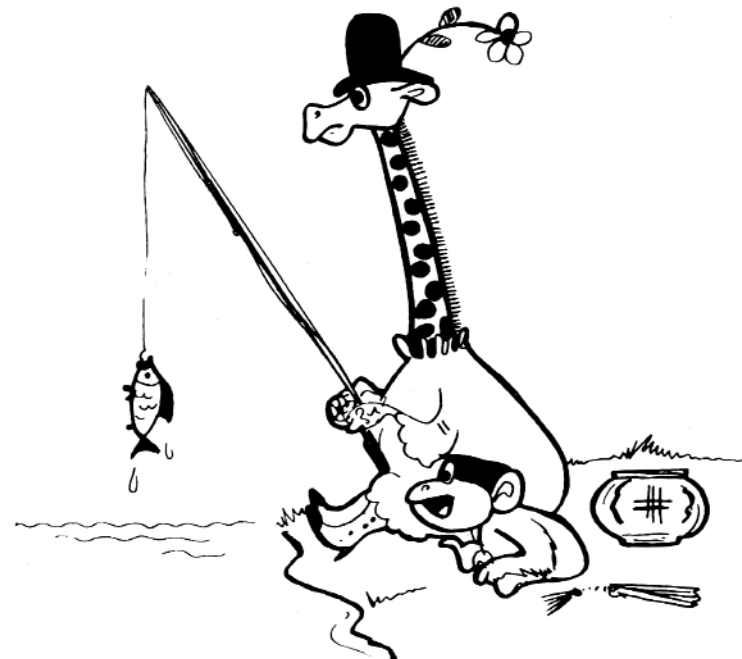

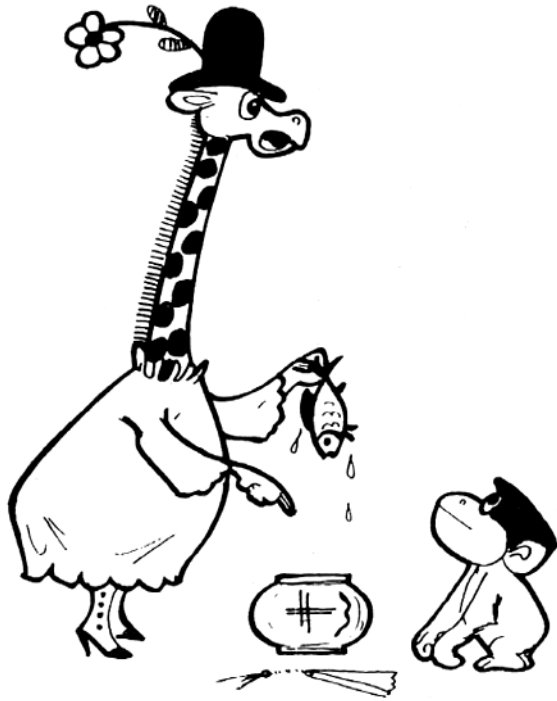

“If he is fat, we will win.”



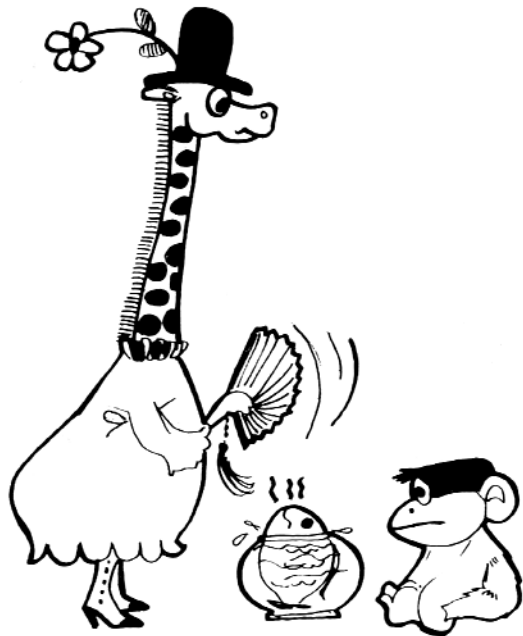
“The sad fish needs this.

it will feel well.”



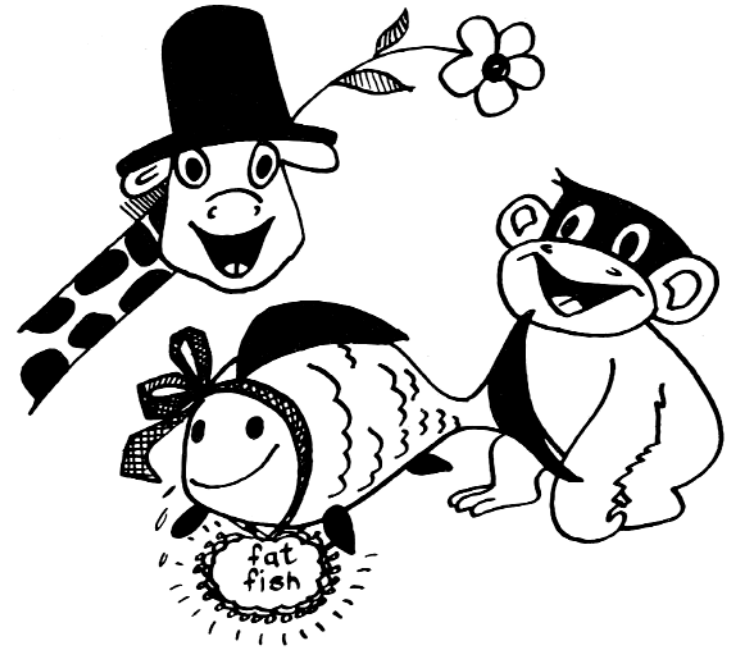
“This fish is fat and well.
