Plot Summary

Ann is walking when it begins to rain. She puts up an umbrella and runs. Mat asks to share her umbrella. Mit and Sam join them. The umbrella falls over Ann's head when Will tries to get under it. The animals run as Ann pokes her head through the top of her torn umbrella. Then the sun comes out, and the animals play happily together in the sunshine.

Story Questions (Comprehension)

1. page 1: Who is ready for the rain?
2. pages 2-9: Which animals were not ready?
3. page 10: What happened when Will tried to get under the umbrella?
4. page 12: How does Ann feel?
5. page 14: What makes all the animals happy?

Each new word throughout the program is repeated at least five times in the book in which it first appears and five more times in the next ten books.

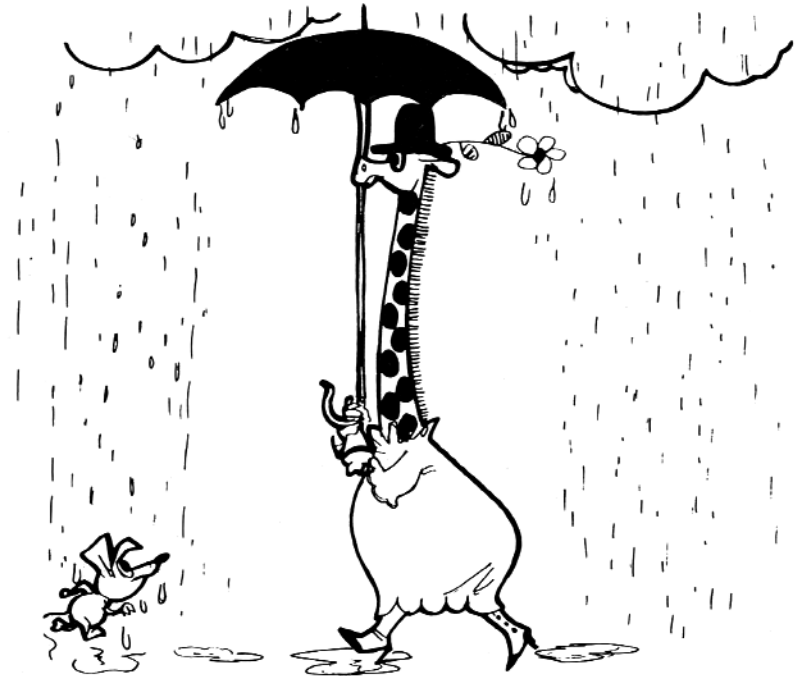

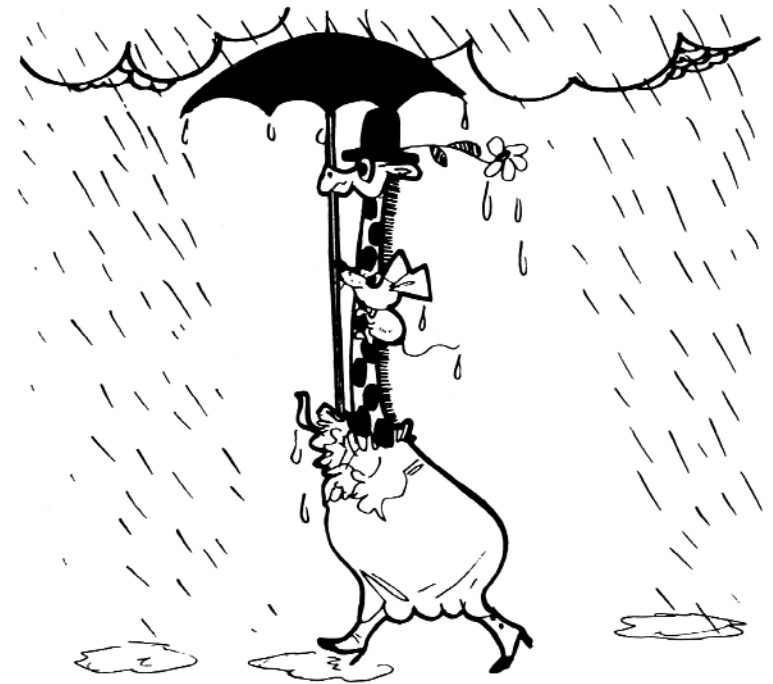


Ann ran.
Then she met Mat.

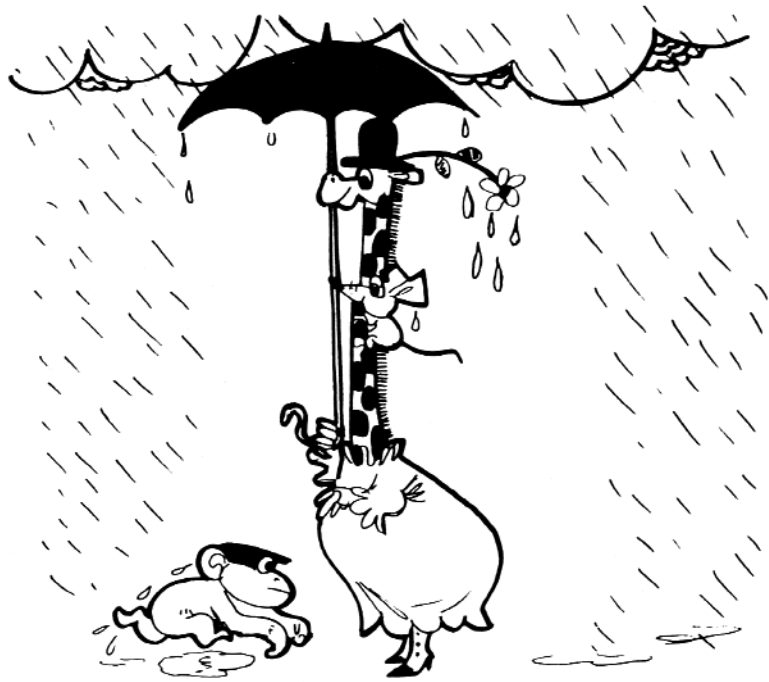

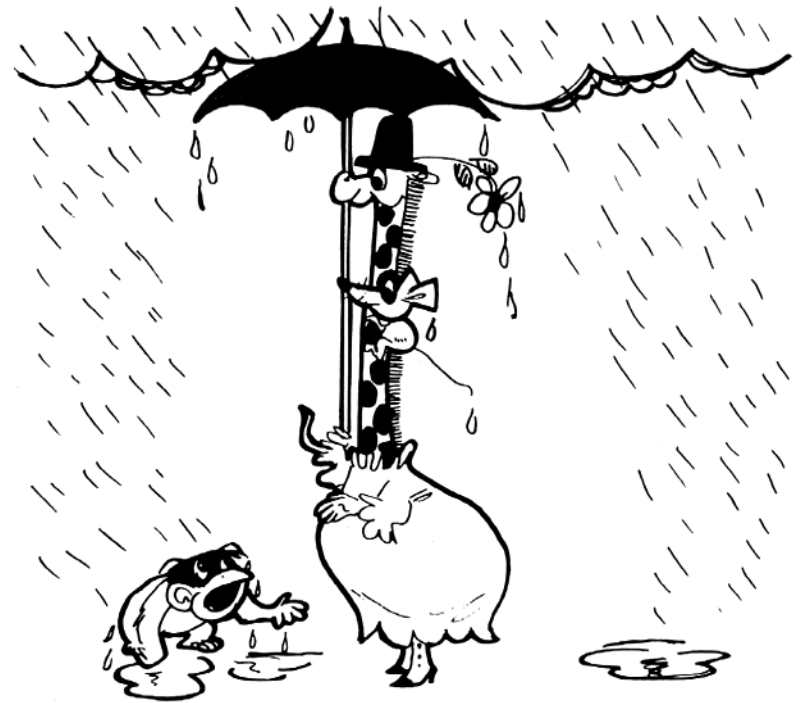
“See it hit me.

I need that.”



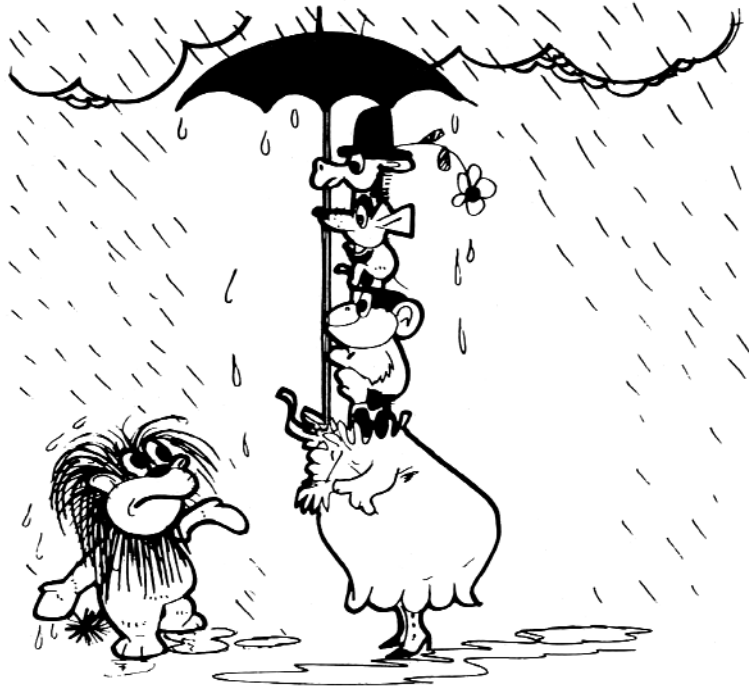
The rat was with Ann.

No, it did not.



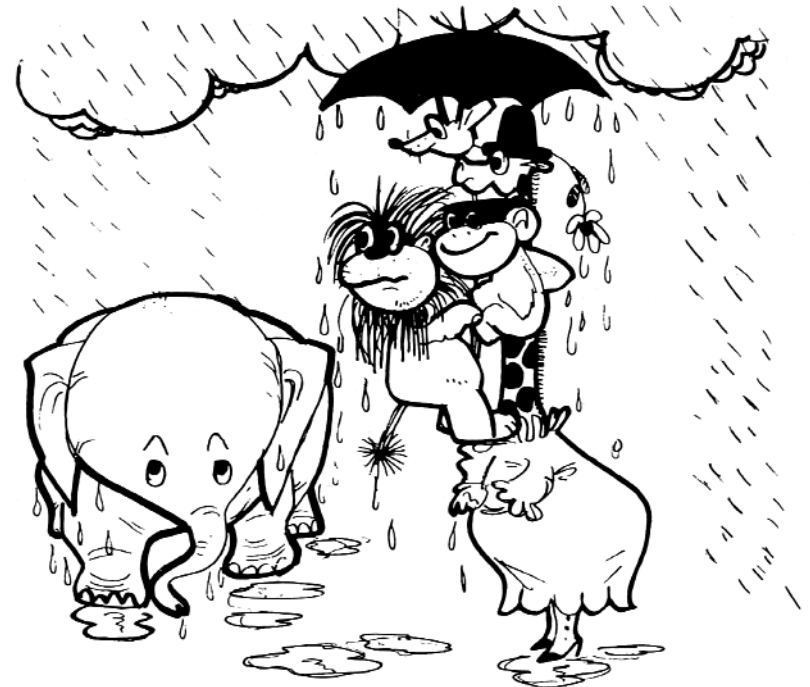
Then Mit met them.
He was wet and he ran to them.



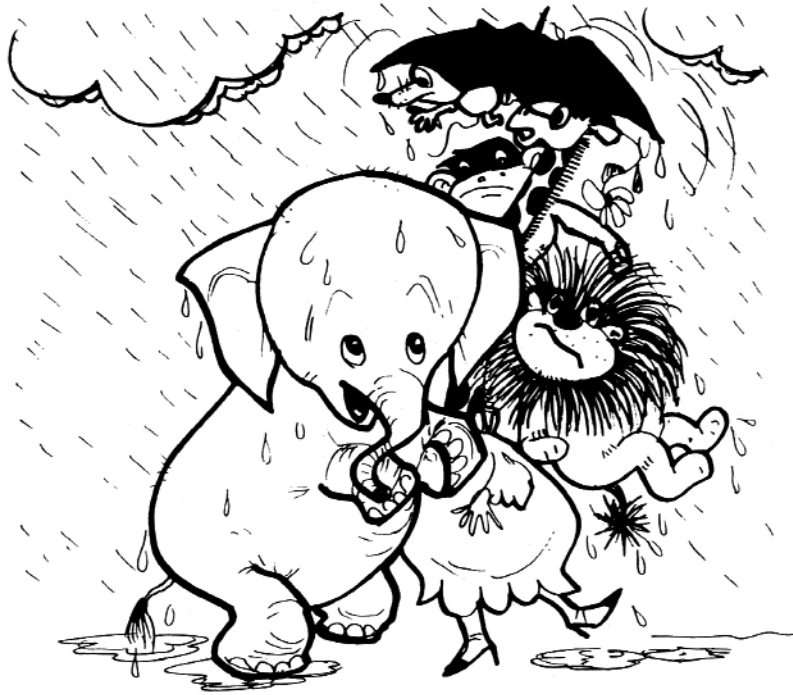
“Ann, Ann, it hit me!

He was wet and ran to them.



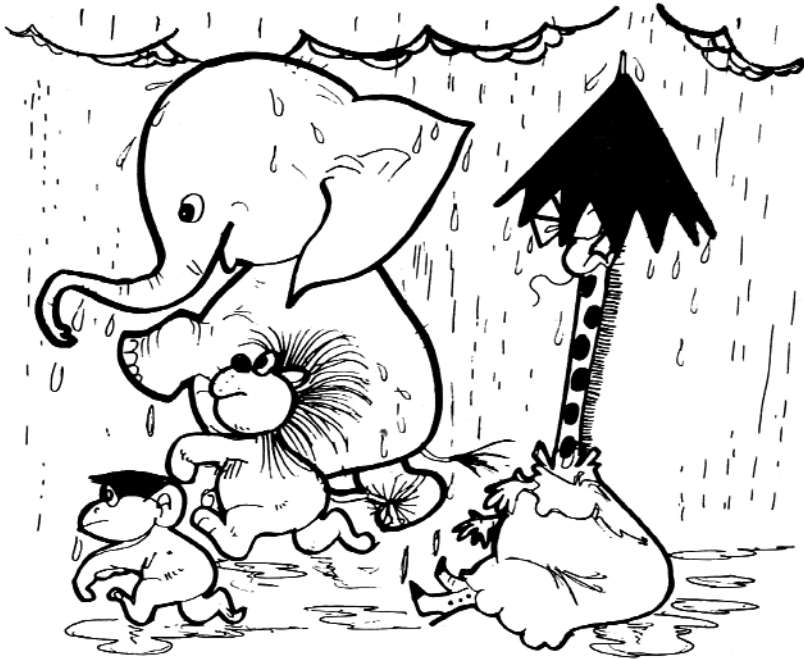
Will met them.

Will I fit with them?”



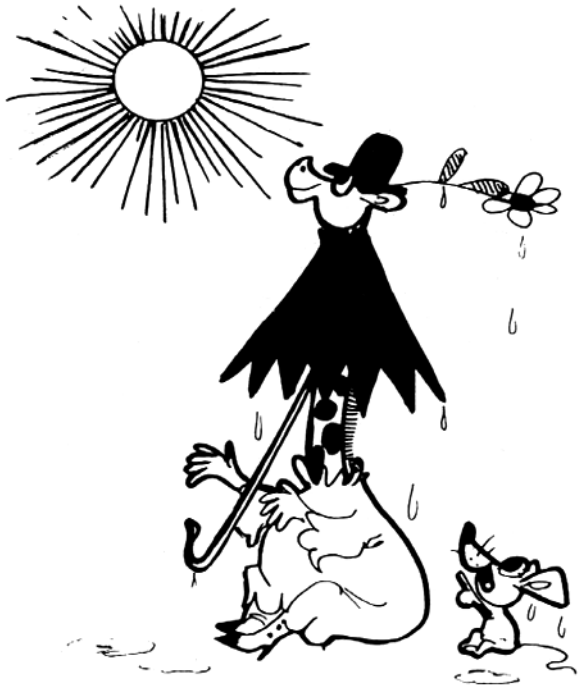
Then it fell.
