Story Questions (Comprehension)


1. page 1: Why does Sam want to visit the farm?



says Sam.




“We can sing this song as we go.”

Is my hand on my chin?”




No! My hand is on my arm.”


“That is a fun song.

“ And I see a pig. Is that the farm?”




“The farm is very far.

Mat can go on Sid’s back.”




They get to the barn.

“Nell, we need a big box of farm eggs.”


“You cannot get eggs.

They did not lay eggs today.”




“I laid eggs today. My eggs are bigger.

Mat has an egg under his arm.




“We need to go.
