**RE: Appointment as Division Director for the Navajo Nation Division of Public Safety**


Dear Mr. Delmar,

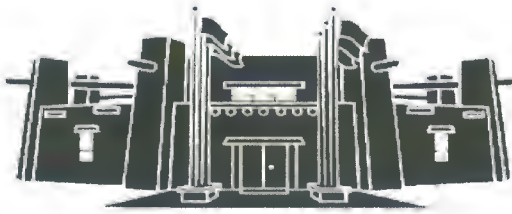
