

The Dominican Sisters of Sinsinawa are partnering with Gronen and other collaborators to assess several buildings at Sinsinawa Mound for potential new ownership, with the goal of repurposing them in ways that support the Sisters' ongoing mission.

Sinsinawa Mound Campus

The offering includes The Rotunda, located on the Sinsinawa Mound Campus. The entire campus encompasses 450 acres, with approximately 192 acres of tillable farmland and 44 acres of pasture retained by the Sisters. In addition to The Rotunda, additional significant buildings available include a section of Siena East and the kitchen/dining hall and gallery concourse, a total of 79,208 SF. Both buildings are connected to The Rotunda. A portion of the Convent has potential for leasing.

Potential Uses

The property is ideal for adaptive reuse such as education, wellness and retreat centers, cultural or art venues, or mixed-use community hubs. With its scale, infrastructure, and history, it offers a rare chance to create a landmark destination with lasting value.


The Rotunda

Nestled in the scenic Driftless Region of southwest Wisconsin, The Rotunda overlooks the Tri-State area of Wisconsin, Illinois, and Iowa. This mid-century, circular architectural landmark spans 96,000 SF across three levels. Constructed with locally quarried limestone, it features a chapel adorned with 37 stained glass windows and refined details of marble and mahogany.

University of Wisconsin—Milwaukee School of Architecture and Urban Planning Historic Preservation Institute


