



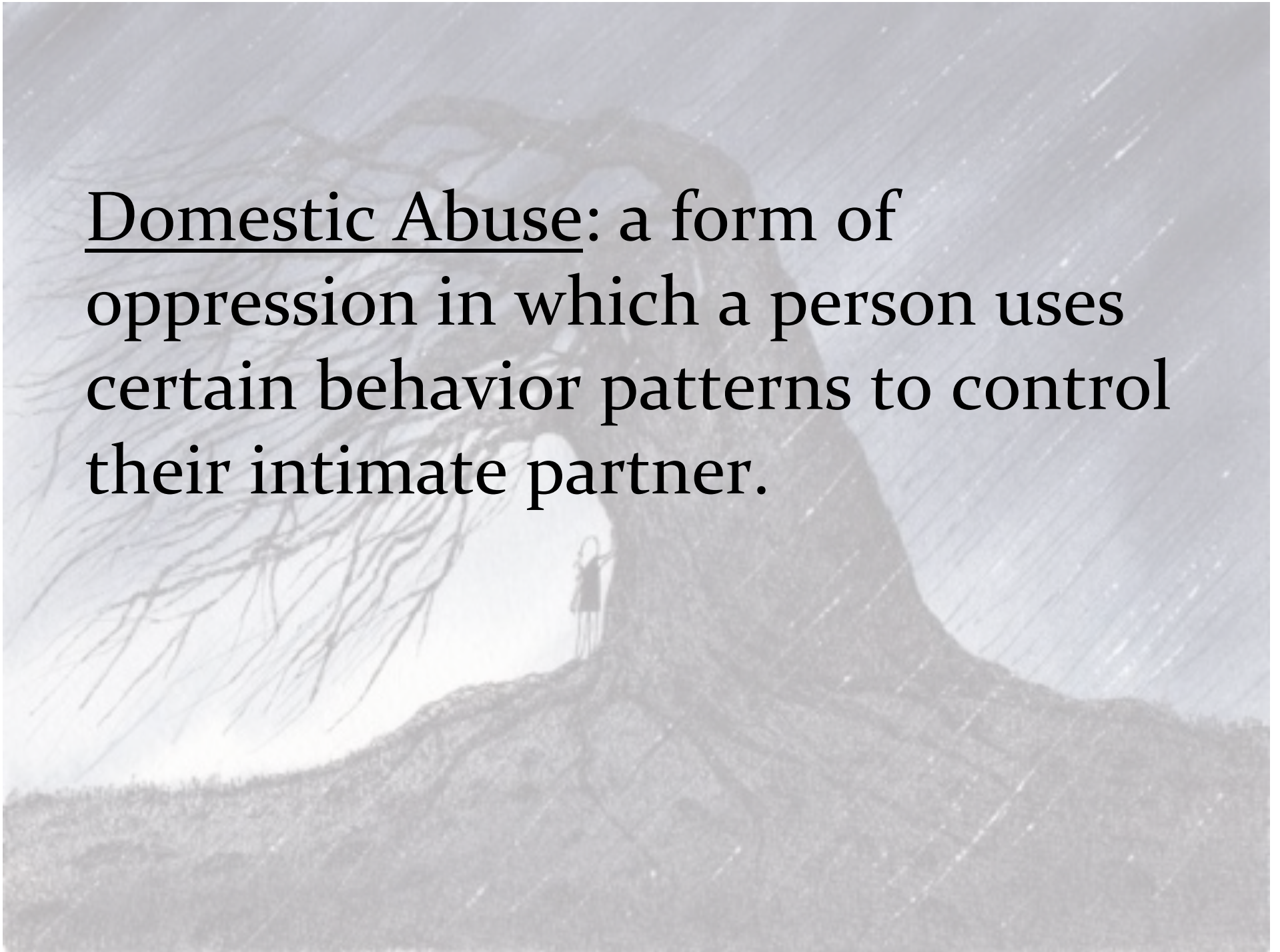


- 
- 1 in 4 women have experienced domestic abuse.
 - 90-95% of the survivors of domestic abuse are women.
 - Partner abuse is the leading cause of injury to women ages 15 to 44.
 - 50% of homeless women and children are fleeing domestic abuse.
 - 3 times more animal shelters than shelters for battered women.

Domestic Abuse: a form of oppression in which a person uses certain behavior patterns to control their intimate partner.

a form of oppression.**

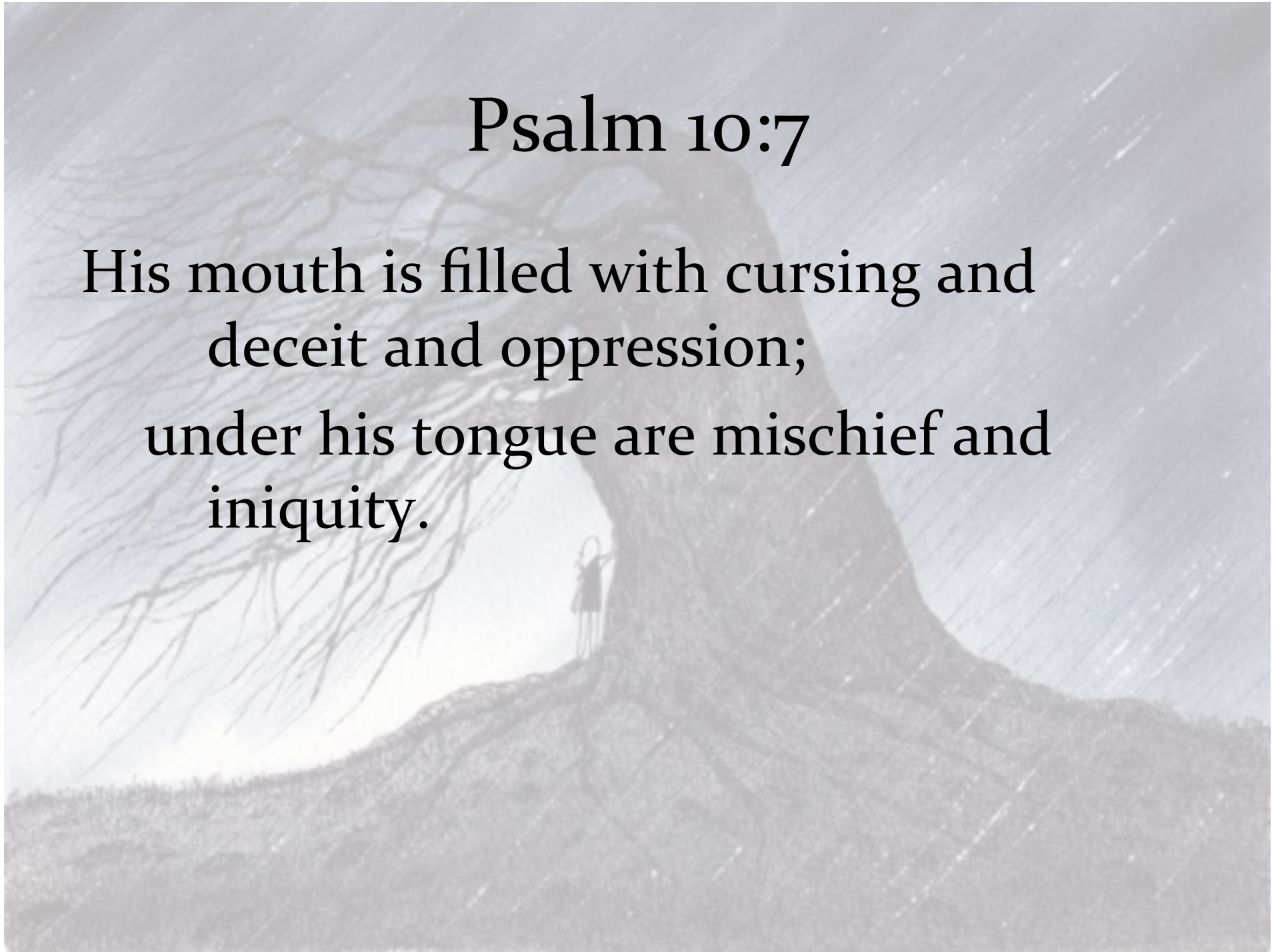


Oppress: to crush or burden someone by the abuse of power or authority.

iniquity.

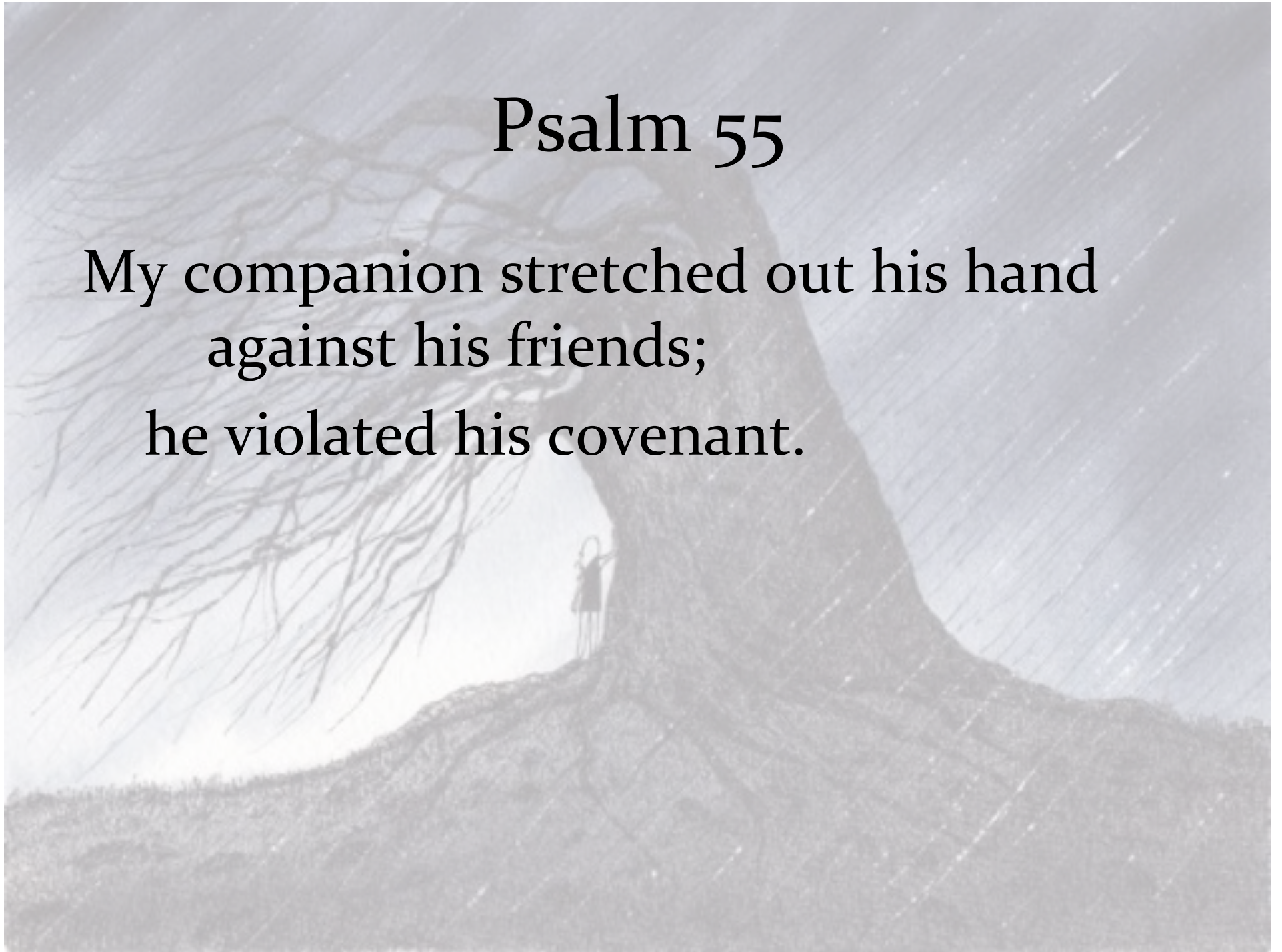


Psalm 55

then I could bear it;

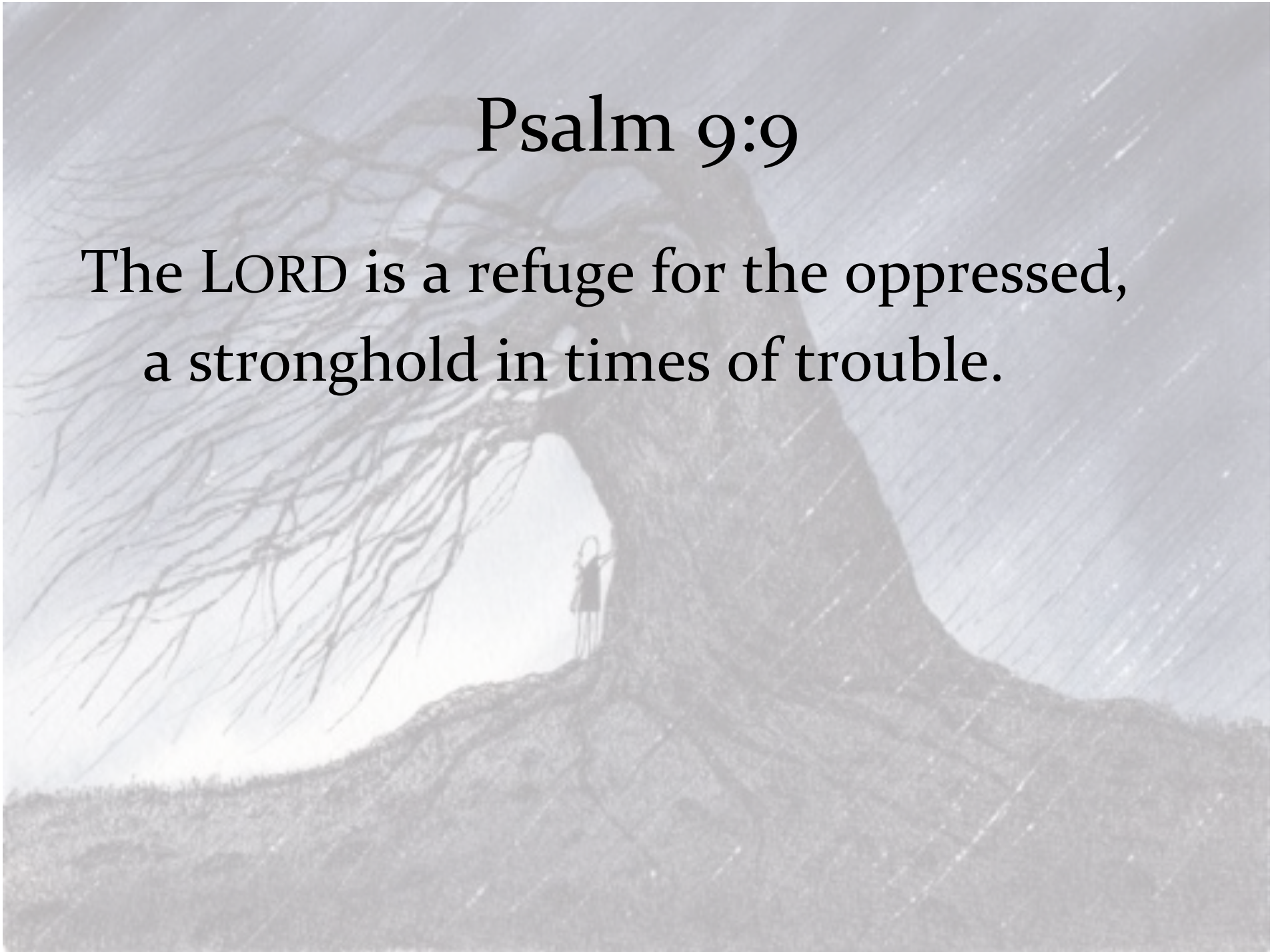
it is not an adversary who deals insolently

my companion, my familiar friend.

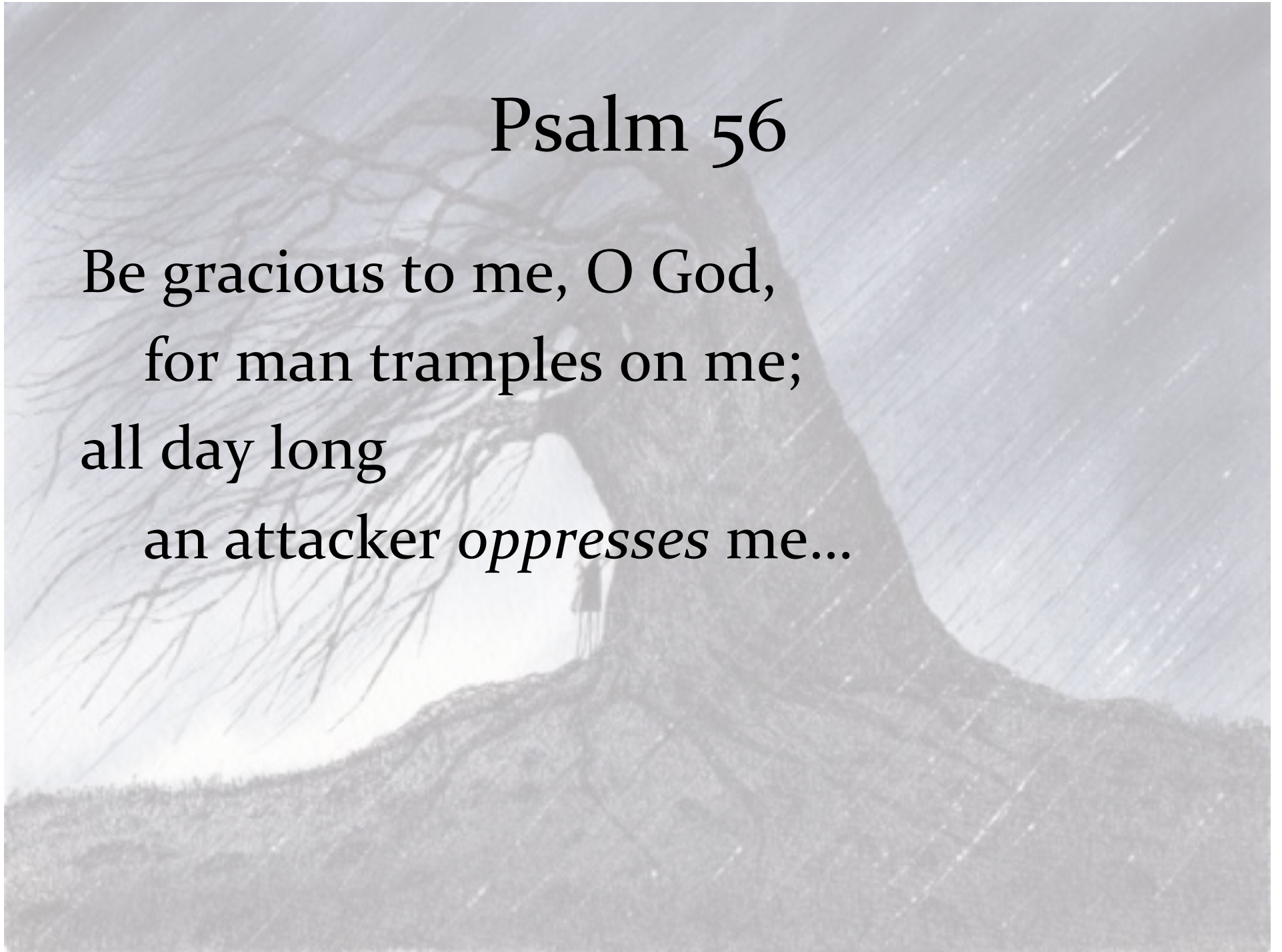
Psalm 9:9
